Introduction to the Liturgy of the Word

- *Genesis 14:18–20* Over bread and wine the mysterious Melchizedek blessed the Lord.
- *Psalms 110* “You are a priest for ever, in the line of Melchizedek.”
- *1 Corinthians 11:23–26* Every time we eat the Lord’s body and drink his blood, we proclaim his life-giving death.
- *Luke 9:11b–17* The feeding of the multitudes

In the first reading and the responsorial psalm, we are reminded of Melchizedek, the first priest mentioned in the Bible. He brought Abraham bread and wine, the same food and drink that Jesus transformed into his body and blood. The Gospel story of the feeding of the multitudes through the multiplication of five loaves and two fish reminds us that God’s generosity is overflowing, able to satisfy us all. Let us listen to God’s word, so we can go out and become the body of Christ for a world hungering for God’s goodness.

Fr. Larry's Reflection...

This weekend we celebrate the Solemnity of the Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ, more commonly called the Feast of Corpus Christi. It was first celebrated in 1246 in France but quickly became a universal feast within a couple of decades. Today, Catholics throughout the world celebrate this day with Mass but also processions with the Blessed Sacrament in their communities, often decorating the roadways with elaborate designs made from flower petals. As a solemnity, it provides us with an opportunity to reflect on the importance of the Eucharist for each of us individually and for the entire Church.

This importance lies in our belief that Jesus shares with us his very life in holy communion, as we believe that he is really present (body, soul, and divinity) in what appears to us as ordinary bread and wine. May this weekend strengthen our faith so that we remain unshaken in our belief that when we receive communion, we not only receive the Body of Christ, but we become the Body of Christ for our world today. We have the privilege of receiving Jesus at Mass; as we leave the doors of our church we take that communion with us and, through the witness of our lives, share that same Jesus with all we meet.

Spiritual Life Committee

ST. IRENAEUS

Can you imagine sitting at the feast of the Apostles? St. Irenaeus was born in Asia Minor -- now Turkey -- and was tutored in Christianity by St. Polycarp, himself a disciple of St. John the Evangelist. Irenaeus caught the missionary zeal and became a priest sent to Gaul (modern day France). Following a persecution by the pagan Roman emperor Marcus Aurelius, Irenaeus replaced the martyred bishop in the region. His trials were not over, however. The heretical sect of Gnosticism spread to Gaul. Gnostics proclaimed a secret, spiritual knowledge available only to a few. Irenaeus researched the Gnostic texts and exposed the falsehoods they taught, such as denying the divinity of Christ. His book *Against Heresies* is still being published today, over 1800 years after his death. May St. Irenaeus intercede for our own quests for greater understanding!


