

# **JAMES ALBERT FOURNIER**

## **1916-1990**

James A. Fournier, age 74 of Caseville, passed away Friday, July 13, at his home, following an apparent heart attack.

He was born April 18, 1916 in Detroit son of the late John and Rose (Hall) Fournier and had lived in the Detroit area most of his life. He was united in marriage to Marlon Renny on June 17, 1939 in Detroit.

Mr. Fournier was the owner of the Gulf Service Station at Warren and Marlborough in Detroit for 25 years. He sold the station in 1970 and began working for Raynal Bros. Dodge in Detroit retiring in 1975. That same year the couple moved to Lake Township.

He was a member of the Caseville United Methodist Church and the Caseville Retirement Club.

Mr. Fournier is survived by his wife, Marlon; one son, James Allan Fournier of St. Louis, MO.; a granddaughter, Kathleen Kennedy of Mt. Clemen; three brothers, Flavian (Esther) Fournier of Harper Woods, Harold (Margaret) Fournier of Rochester and Bernard Fournier of Holly and his sister, Marian (Jack) Kaminski of St. Clair Shores.

He was preceded in death by his daughter, Marjory R. and her husband, Thomas Kennedy, two sisters and five brothers.

Funeral services were conducted 1 p.m. Monday, July 16, at the Caseville United Methodist Church. Rev. Gregg Mayberry pastor officiated with burial in Riverside Cemetery, Elkton.
