LUMBERJACK RC&D FORESTRY AWARDS

Nomination and Selection Process:

Anyone may nominate individuals for awards. Recipients must meet at least one criterion in their category. Nominations must be received by the Lumberjack RC&D office by October 1st of each year. The Forestry Committee will choose award recipients at the October Lumberjack Council meeting and present the awards at the January Council Meeting.



Friends of Forestry Award:

This award is presented to an individual or group in the forest industry for long-term support of forest stewardship.

Criteria:

- Leadership in the promotion of forestry and forest management among woodland owners.
- > An advocate for forest management and the use of forest products among the public.
- Provided innovative and adaptive management examples so that others may learn from them and advance the practice of forestry.
- Leadership in the management of privately owned forests.
- Leadership within the forest products industry in the education/counseling of peers.

Forest Steward of the Year Award

This award is presented to a private woodland owner (non-industry) for long-term support of forest stewardship.

Criteria:

- Leadership in the management of their own forest.
- Leadership among woodland owners in the promotion of forestry and forest management and education/counseling of peers.
- Practicing sustainable forest management, including good forest product utilization and be implementing best management practices.
- > Advocate for forest management and the use of forest products among the public.
- Demonstrate a commitment to a land stewardship ethic that focuses on timber management, fish and wildlife habitat, water quality, soil productivity, aesthetics, and recreation – as a valuable legacy for future generations.

Chairman's Special Achievement Award

This award is presented to an individual or group for outstanding contributions to promoting good forest stewardship through education and/or example.

Criteria:

- Advocate for forest management and the use of forest products among the public.
- Provided innovative and adaptive management examples so that others may learn from them and advance the practice of forestry.
- Used science and experience-based knowledge to implement timely management practices that have resulted in healthy productive forests.
- Leadership in the promotion of forestry and forest management and education/counseling of students, woodland owners, forest industry professionals or the public.
