Let us pray.

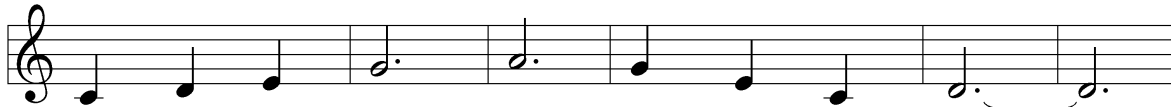

Amen.

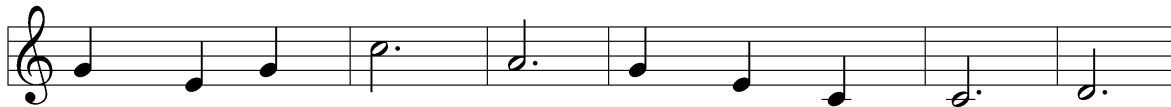

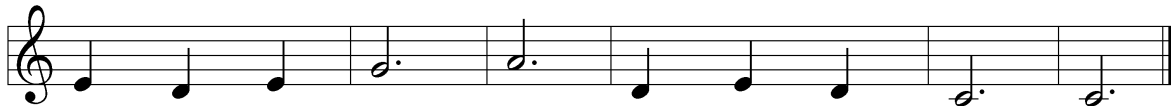
