Here are a few examples: Christianity—"Do to others as you would have them do to you." (Luke 6:31) Confucianism— "Do not to others what you would not like yourself. Then there will be no resentment against you, either in the family or in the state." (Analect 12:2) Buddhism—"Hurt not others in way that your yourself would find hurtful." (Udana-Varga 5,1) **Hinduism**—"This the sum of duty; do naught onto other what you not have them do unto you." (Mahabbharata 5,1517) Islam—"No one of you is a beliver until he desires for his brother that which he desires for himself." (Sunnah) Judaism—"What is hateful to you, do not do to your fellowman. The is the entire Law, all the

rest is commentary." (Talmud, Shabbat 3id) **Taoism**—"Regard your neighbors gain as your gain, and your neighbor's loss as your own loss." (Tai Shang Kan Yin P'ien) **Zoroastrianism**—"That nature alone is good which refrains from another whatsoever is not good for itself" (Dadisten-Idiik, 94,5).

Finally Louisiana isn't at the bottom of a national survey. In a report released this week, the True Colors Fund, a nonprofit whose mission statement is "to end homelessness among lesbian, gay, bisexual, and transgender youth" rates Louisiana No. 8 in the nation in its efforts to prevent and end general

youth homelessness. According to the report, Louisiana is one of only 11 states to enact a Runaway Homeless Youth Act, a compilation of laws that allow for significant funding for runaway youth issues. The report also salutes Louisiana for not criminally punishing young runaways, as well

as providing protections based on sexual orientation and gender identity in its juvenile justice system. The True Colors Fund, which was co-founded by singer Cyndi Lauper, estimates 4.2 million people under age 24 experience homelessness each year in the United States.

Many people are homeless because they cannot afford rent. Fact 6: There are fewer places for poor people to rent than before. Fact 7: In the last few years millions have lost their homes. Word on The Street — What is Chronic Homelessness



According to the National Alliance to End Homelessness, 23 percent of homeless people are reported as chronically homeless. According to HUD's definition, a person who is "chronically homeless" is an unaccompanied homeless individual with a disabling condition (e.g., substance abuse, serious mental illness, develop-

disability, or chronic physical illness) who has either been continuously homeless for a year or more, or has had at least four episodes of homelessness in the past three years. In order to be considered chronically homeless, a person must have been sleeping in a place not meant for human habitation and/or in an

emergency homeless shelter.

STATISTICS ON HUMAN TRAFFICKING


According to the U.S. State Department, 600,000 to 800,000 people are trafficked across international borders every year, of which 80% are female and half are children.

Human trafficking is the third largest international crime industry (behind illegal drugs and arms trafficking). It reportedly generates a profit of \$32 billion every year. Of that number,

\$15.5 billion is made in industrialized countries. The International Labour Organization estimates that women and girls represent the largest share of forced labor victims with 11.4 million trafficked victims (55%) compared to 9.5 million (45%) men

This silent epidemic has come after our teens with a vengeance and it is definitely praying on those youth who are runaways and who find themselves into a life homelessness. Being vigilant is key and it takes all to truly get involved to save our children.


