Pastor's Study Desk Notes



Dear St Anthony & St Pius Families,

Corpus Christi Sunday

Year C Luke 9:11b-17

"You are not you when you are hungry....have a Snickers." Have you seen the series of Snickers candy bar commercials when people are not acting like themselves, & maybe don't even look like same person, until someone hands them a bite of a Snickers bar? Then they instantly transform back into their real selves/real form again. Is something like this, what is motivating the apostles to tell Jesus to send the crowds away back to their villages, to 'get them gone' quickly? Luke does indicate that the crowd had been with Jesus ***all day long***, when he says, "day was drawing to a close" (Lk 9:12). So, did the apostles fear a potentially unruly, or ***'hangry crowd'***? That detail is what opens today's miracle story of Jesus multiplying the loaves and fishes to feed over 5,000 people. They obviously were concerned about the behavior of the crowd on some level, because Jesus does have them eventually to be seated on the ground "in groups of fifty" (Lk 9:14). St Paul reminds us that our God, "is not a God of disorder, but of peace" (1 Cor 14:33), so we do see Jesus interested in keeping the crowd calm and secure. But that is also a sign of His Good Shepherding, that He desires His flock to keep together and orderly, looking out for one another (*Luke 15:4-7, shepherd leaves 99 to seek the 1 lost, trusting the 99 to stay together!*)

What a blessing that we have such a ***'full service' shepherd***. Do we remember what ***'full service'*** meant? In the old days of real gas stations, as you pulled up, you were met by an attendant asking, "Would you like full service?" which meant he would even check the oil and water level under the hood and wash your windshield, while you waited for the tank to be filled up! When he/she finished, you even paid without ever leaving your car seat (*Remember the coin change-maker on his waist belt—that was long before the days now, which almost requires a bank loan to fill up!*) That was 'Full-Service'! Well, today we see our 'full-service' Shepherd. Jesus teaches, comforts, heals and even feeds the crowd of followers? A True Shepherd who leads, feeds, heals and protects the sheep who flock to Him in the fields (Ps 23 & John 10).

Certainly, Jesus felt deep responsibility for the great crowds that came out to be with Him. He is known to tell His own disciples, "You are salt of the earth and light of the world" (Matt 5:13-16). So Jesus knew His followers and their conduct would reflect well or not on how He conducts Himself. He did not want tired and irritable disciples to trouble the neighboring villages. He did not want hungry roaming bands of disciples to burden the nearby farmers with their begging food from them. So, even with such a large gathering, Jesus ensures that the 'Peace of God's Kingdom' rules. He completely satisfies the multitudes and gives them true rest in green pastures and with refreshing waters in His Presence (He puts to rest the fears and worries of the apostles too!) Likely, everyone spent the night, sleeping on the hillsides with Jesus, just like a Good shepherd keeping the night watch over His flocks (Lk 2:8). What a wonderful demonstration of how Jesus our shepherd cares for us, His sheep!

Yet, I love the final detail of this miracle story. Every last piece, however small, is important. Jesus never overlooks the little things—nothing is lost or wasted with Jesus! Notice that the leftovers gathered up amount to 12 baskets (one for each apostle—Lk 9:17)! Yet not only is there the connection to the, now, twelve apostles who will continue 'feeding' people in Jesus' Name after Him, but twelve was also the number of loaves displayed on the Table in the old Temple sanctuary, known as the 'Bread of Presence' (Exodus 25:30, Lev 24:5-9). Of course, Jesus will develop this notion of 'Real Presence' further in John chapter 6 and in His Last Supper Teaching, but we can see the seed of His Eucharistic teaching in this miracle of His Faithful & Feeding Presence. He is always present in the Sacrament of His Body and Blood! In every Mass, as we invoke the Holy Spirit's action and prayerfully repeat His Words of Institution (*'This is My Body...This ...My Blood.... Do this in memory of me....' Lk 22:19*), Jesus is Really Present to us. What a gift of fidelity and lasting nourishment! This is why He can say "Whoever comes to me will never hunger" (Jn 6:35) and "Whoever eats this bread will live forever" (Jn 6:51). Because Jesus is Forever, and He is accessible to us in every reserved sacrament of His Presence in any Tabernacle, Monstrance and of course, in every celebration of Holy Eucharist! Right Here!

Diocesan Campaign to Build Priest Retirement Housing

You've probably heard already about this project in the Diocesan Annual Report, but the Bishop and Priest Council of the Diocese have decided to build a new 2 million dollar Retirement Complex of 4 units for future retired priests to rent, located behind the Carmel Home in Owensboro. Parishes have been presented with the *option* of either 1) simply paying an assessed share of the project or 2) submitting a top 10% donor list as well as hosting campaign receptions to fundraise for the Diocese. We've never been pressured before to turn over contributor names based on previous giving, to the Diocese. So, keeping things simple and clean, our parishes will just donate our Diocesan-assessed payment up front, to help the project, instead of turning over parishioner names and lists for the Diocese to solicit and campaign from. The parish as a whole, will itself just pay its portion to help with the construction of the four retired priest condominium units.

In summary, we are participating in this diocesan cause, but we will not be surrendering parishioner names to outside firms. Our good stewardship practice is not to sell mailing lists, or turn over confidential parishioner information to 3rd parties. Therefore, you should not be contacted by phone or home visit, by any paid diocesan solicitors. Please let me know if you are contacted. There will be periodic updates over time in the Diocesan WKC newspaper or email newsletter about the campaign's progress. Please pray about this. I know we all pray in thanksgiving & support for our 11 retired priests who have served Diocese!

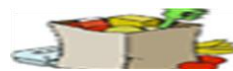
