DPRA OFFICERS CONCERNS ABOUT THE NEW CCW PERMIT PROCESS

Regarding changes to the State CCW Law:

Range Officers wanted to make sure you were aware of the DPD internet changes and were able to forward the info to our retirees. The biggest change for our officers is that they will **no longer be able to Renew the state permit with DPD if they are not Denver residence**. CBI has already returned a few applications and clarified that an applicant must renew in their county of residence or owning real property...

Found on the web under How To Renew your Permit:

Due to House Bill 14-1166 that went into effect March 14, 2014, you must submit a concealed handgun permit application (new and renewal) to the county sheriff's office where you reside, own property or own a business. If you currently have a concealed handgun permit with Denver County and now live in another county, you must renew your permit with that county.

Permit applications are processed on a walk-in, first come, first served basis Tuesday -Friday between the hours of 8:00 a.m. and 3:00 p.m., excluding Holidays at 1331 Cherokee Street, Denver, CO 80204.

Be sure to prepare the appropriate documents and bring them with you

With reference to the HR218, DPD policy now reflects that **any officer that meets the criteria must also live in Denver to apply.** For non-DPD officers that meet the criteria and live in Denver, they are required to provide documentation from their previous employer/ agency, showing that they meet the criteria at time of application.

Found on last page of Retired Officer Forms/ House Resolution Bill...

NOTE: Non-DPD retired officers seeking a Federal CCW permit from our agency must live in the City and County of Denver. They will be responsible for providing proof of eligibility from the agency from which they separated.
