

ORDINANCE NO. 230-88-1

AN ORDINANCE REGULATING THE PARKING OF VEHICLES
UPON PUBLIC STREETS AND ALLEYS

BE IT ORDAINED by the Board of Trustees of the Village of Chapin, Morgan County, Illinois, as follows:

SECTION 1. DEFINITIONS. Whenever in this Ordinance the following terms are used, they shall have the meaning ascribed to them in this section:

(a) ALLEY: A public way within a block, generally giving access to the rear of lots or buildings, and not used for general traffic circulation.

(b) DRIVER: Every person who drives or is in actual physical control of a vehicle.

(c) PARK: To stand a vehicle, whether occupied or not, for a period of time greater than is reasonably necessary for the actual loading or unloading of persons.

(d) STREET OR HIGHWAY: The entire width between property lines or every way or place of whatever nature when any part thereof is open to the use of the public, as a matter of right, for the purpose of vehicular traffic, and not including alleys.

(e) VEHICLE: Every device in, upon or by which any person or property is or may be transported or drawn upon a highway, except devices propelled by human power or used exclusively upon stationary rails or tracks.

(f) EMERGENCY VEHICLE: Police vehicles, vehicles of fire departments, ambulances, vehicles carrying a state, county, town or village officer or employee in response to an emergency call, and emergency vehicles of public service corporations on an emergency call.

(g) PAVED: That part of the street that has been surfaced with oil or gravel by the village.

SECTION II. PARKING. It shall be unlawful for any driver to park a vehicle in any of the following places, except when necessary to avoid conflict with other

AN ORDINANCE REGULATING THE PARKING OF VEHICLES

SECTION 1. PURPOSE. Whereas in this Ordinance the following terms

are used, they shall have the meaning ascribed to them in this section:

(a) ALLEY: A public way which is a road, generally giving access to

the rear of lots or buildings, and not used for general traffic circulation.

(b) DRIVER: Every person who drives or is in actual physical control

of a vehicle.

(c) SALE: The placing of a vehicle, whether occupied or not, for a purpose

of more than is reasonably necessary for the actual loading or unloading

of persons.

(d) STREET OR HIGHWAY: The portion which is between opposite lines

of any way or place of whatever nature when and where it is open to the

use of the public as a matter of right, for the purpose of vehicular traffic, and

not including alleys.

(e) VEHICLE: Every device in upon or by which any person or

property is or may be transported or drawn upon a highway, except bicycles

propelled by human power or used exclusively for stationary sale or display.

(f) EMERGENCY VEHICLES: Police vehicles, vehicles of fire

departments, ambulances, vehicles carrying a state, county, town or village officer

or employee in response to an emergency call, and emergency vehicles of public

service corporations on an emergency call.

(g) SALE: That part of the street that has been enclosed with a

bar or travel by the vehicle.

SECTION 2. PARKING. It shall be unlawful for any person to park a vehicle

in any of the following places, except when necessary to avoid conflict with other

traffic or in compliance with the directions of a peace officer or traffic control device:

(1) In or upon any street or alley in the Village where the standing of such vehicle will reduce the usable paved width of such street for moving traffic to less than 20 feet.


(2) In or upon any street in the Village where such vehicle would block the use of a driveway or alley.

SECTION III. EMERGENCY AND OTHER VEHICLES. The provisions of this Ordinance regulating the parking of vehicles shall not apply to delivery vehicles while making normal deliveries or to emergency vehicles while the driver thereof is engaged in the performance of emergency duties. Nor shall such provisions apply to persons actually engaged in repairing or otherwise improving the streets under the authority of the Village Board of Trustees or of the State of Illinois.


SECTION IV. PENALTIES. Any person, firm or corporation violating any provisions of this Ordinance shall be guilty of a petty offense and shall be fined Twenty-Five Dollars (\$25.00) for each offense. The Village Board of Trustees may pass and approve of such suspension of enforcement of this Ordinance as it deems fit.

SECTION V. EFFECTIVE DATE. This Ordinance shall be effective upon its passage, approval and publication as required by law.

traffic in accordance with the functions of a peace officer or traffic control device.

(1) In an open street or alley in the Village where the station of

such vehicle will reduce the width of such street for moving traffic

to less than 20 feet.

(2) In an open way street in the Village where such vehicle would block

the use of a driveway or alley.

SECTION III. TRAFFIC CONTROL DEVICES. The provisions of this

Ordinance regarding the parking of vehicles shall not apply to delivery vehicles while

making normal deliveries or to emergency vehicles while the driver thereof is engaged

in the performance of emergency duties. Not shall such provisions apply to persons

actually engaged in receiving or delivering merchandise the streets under the authority of

the Village Board of Trustees or of the State of Illinois.

SECTION VI. PENALTIES. Any person, firm or corporation violating any

provisions of this Ordinance shall be guilty of a petty offense and shall be fined Twenty-

five Dollars (\$25.00) for each offense. The Village Board of Trustees may pass and

approve of such suspension of enforcement of this Ordinance as it deems fit.

SECTION V. ENFORCEMENT DATE. This Ordinance shall be effective upon its

passage, approval and publication as required by law.
