BEREAVEMENT SUPPORT MINISTRY MEETING Sunday, September 18

The Bereavement Support Ministry at St. Mary Star of the Sea invites the Parish to a series of video presentations by Fr. Wade

Menezes, CPM, on the Catholic Church's doctrine and teaching about the Four Last Things: Death, Judgement, Heaven and Hell. The series focuses on the differences between the Particular Judgement and the Last Judgement; the Church's teaching on Heaven; the chief characteristics of the risen, glorified and the transfigured human body; the existence of hell; and growing nearer to God. Fr. Wade is a member of the Fathers of Mercy, a missionary preaching Religious Congregation in Auburn, Kentucky. Each part is 1/2 hour long, and will be followed by open discussion. The second of this 5-part series will be shown in the Parish Hall on Sunday, September 18, at 12:30 pm.

CATECHISM of the CATHOLIC CHURCH

THE OLD LAW

God, our Creator and Redeemer, chose Israel for himself to be his people and revealed his Law to them, thus preparing for the coming of Christ. The Law

of Moses expresses many truths naturally accessible to reason. These are stated and authenticated within the covenant of salvation. The Old Law is the first stage of revealed Law. Its moral prescriptions are summed up in the Ten Commandments. The precepts of the Decalogue lay the foundations for the vocation of man fashioned in the image of God; they prohibit what is contrary to the love of God and neighbor and prescribe what is essential to it. The Decalogue is a light offered to the conscience of every man to make God's call and ways known to him and to protect him against evil: God wrote on the tables of the Law what men did not read in their hearts.
