- Do not mark NEW women veterans when they are renewing.

Please let your members know that if they pay online they need to let you know. Members can now also pay by phone using a credit/debit card. Call National at 1-317-569-4500 and tell them you want to pay your dues by phone. National will start sending out cards for the 2018-19 year until then they have to let you know. They can only pay the current years dues. If they owe 2017 or before they will pay 2018 first until January 1 and they must pay 2019 to be current...this will be a rejoin member.

- 8. Donate 10 pair of shoes.
- 9. Give 10 dictionaries to third grade students.
- 10. Support a scholarship fund (including National Scholarships) by donating \$10.

American Education Week is November 12-16, 2018. Visit the schools to promote the Auxiliary scholarships. Send a card to all local school staff, including all school personnel who children interact with, teachers, office staff, bus drivers, custodians, etc.

Promote Teacher Appreciation Week, May 5-11, 2019. Send cards to your local schools' teachers. Donate resources that teachers or needy children may need. Plan teacher appreciation events at your schools.

SEPTEMBER 2018 IT'S BUZZING TIME FOR FINANCE

HEADS UP EVERYONE BEFORE YOU GET HIT WITH A STINGER FROM ONE OF THE MANY "BEES" flying within your Unit. Sorry I am not an artist therefore you won't see an actual Bee on this page but this Committee is still buzzing around with some helpful information for each of you.

First of all I would like to talk about your Unit raising funds for a **SPECIAL PROJECT.** You need to know if funds are raised for a "Special Project", for instance to send an officer or designated member to a National Convention, special meeting or whatever, all funds RAISED MUST GO THRU YOUR UNITS BOOKS, THEN A CHECK CAN BE WRITTEN FOR THAT CAUSE. If you don't do this you are asking for a lot of trouble and it is not legal to spend that money for any other purpose. If spent for any other purpose you are defrauding the donors. Another item you should be wary of, **NEW OFFICERS HAVE BEEN ELECTED & THERE ARE NEW SIGNERS ON YOUR UNIT ACCOUNTS BUT YOU HAVE NOT BEEN DILIGENT IN HAVING THE OLD SIGNATORS REMOVED** – then one of the former signers needs some funds for herself – at this point your Unit has been <u>succered out of its money</u>. It is up to the Unit to make hard decisions on what is to be done and do it immediately. Those funds belong to the Unit, not one person, and the decision of how it will be spent is up to the Unit by their Budget or at a meeting.

This brings on another subject. All Units are to register with the Arizona Secretary of State as a Veterans Organization legally authorized to solicit funds from the public. An article in the ARIZONA DAILY STAR NEWSPAPER of Monday, Aug.8, 2018 made this more relevant-a man from Phoenix is securing people to sit on the sidewalk asking for donations for children. These people get a cut of what they collect, NO AUDIT HAS EVER BEEN DONE ON HIS FIRM AND NO ONE KNOWS WHERE THE MONEY GOES. A PICTURE WITH THE ARTICLE SHOWED A LADY STUFFING BILLS INTO THE COLLECTION CONTAINER. A simple call to the Secretary of States office could have determined if this type of collections was legal or registered with the Secretary of State to collect funds for his (supposed to be) charity . This kind of thievery makes me angry enough to be a BUMBLE BEE WITH A LONG STINGER.

Be cautious of who gets your hard earned money as we know if turned in to a Units funds it will be used for the needy children, Veterans and their families. If you are out collecting for the Poppy program be sure you have an identification that insures what that collection is for.

As Auxiliary members we all work to hard for our programs to allow something like this to happen. I personally am wondering why ALL UNITS & DISTRICTS CAN'T OR WON'T READ THE BULLETIN ARTICLES AND ADHERE TO THEM ESPECIALLY DEALING WITH THEIR FINANCES. IF YOU ARE A NEW UNIT OFFICER AND NEED HELP – GET IN TOUCH WITH THAT CHAIRMAN FOR CLARIFICATION. FROM THE Finance Committee we are here to help not hinder – bless you all for the work you do in your communities, for our veterans and their families.

Legislative

September 2018

Greetings Ladies,

I have quite a bit to update on, from the last update. I will try to be as brief as possible and only update on things that occurred in late July and August.

First off, I would like to thank Nancy Raistrick, Legislative Chairman from Unit 93 for her updates and communication with me. She has already helped a great deal.

As many of you already know, President Trump had a summit with Kim Jong Un in hopes of bringing peace to the Korean Peninsula and putting an end to the ongoing tensions involving the US, South Korea, North Korea and other allies. As of the end of July, fifty-five sets of remains of US service members from the Korean War have been returned to the US for proper burial. Vice President Pence was on hand to accept the remains in the United States upon their return. Three hostages have also been returned.

Committee Member Anita Ritter attended the Arizona State Legislature Veterans Caucus in my absence due to work obligations on July 23rd, 2018 at the Arizona State House. A presentation of the 2018 Veteran and Military Legislation Wrap-up was made. Twelve House bills were signed by the Governor or transmitted to the Secretary of State. This included HCM 2007 Blue Water Navy; Vietnam Veterans. This urges the United States Congress to enact the Blue Water Navy Vietnam Veterans Act. Nine Senate bills were also signed, including SB1089 which declares August 7th Purple Heart Day. Twenty-one bills relating to veterans died in process, and eighteen were not heard in committee. I will include a full list of all bills during this caucus in my report for Fall Conference.

On August 13th, 2018 at Fort Drum New York, President Trump signed the John S. McCain National Defense Authorization Act. The signing of this bill is giving the largest pay raise in nine years to service members and authorizes billions of dollars for military construction, including military family housing. The bill will also authorize spending to replace aging vehicles, ships, aircraft and equipment.

Reminder, Election Day in the General Election is Tuesday November 6th, 2018.

Visually Impaired Veterans

I BELIEVE

For those of you who actually read my report last month, there was a decimal point where there should have been a comma. The Veterans Administration estimates there are approximately **130,500** legally blind veterans in the United States and over **one million** veterans with visual impairment causing inability to perform activities of daily living.

The Southwestern Blind Rehabilitation Center (SWBRC) in Tucson is one of nine veterans facilities for visually impaired in the US and Puerto Rico and is rated number one. It offers inpatient rehabilitation training. Each "student" lives in a private room with a dresser, desk, and private bathroom as well as a bed. Having their own space not only allows privacy, but affords training in the activities of daily living. The students attend classes Monday through Friday which are individually structured to help them achieve individual goals of independence. There are recreational outings and events offered in the evenings and weekends where students socialize with other Veterans in the program.

All of the money raised for this Special Project will stay in Arizona and the SWBRC is just one example of the programs for Visually Impaired Veterans in Arizona. VA&R funds and Poppy funds may be used.

This team is here to facilitate raising funds for this very worthwhile program.

MEMBERSHIP

(Please type or print – see instructions on reverse)

ELIGIBILITY: Any member of the American Legion Auxiliary in good standing (having a valid membership card for the current year) may pay dues in advance for the remainder of her life. After January 1, a member whose dues are not paid for the current year is delinquent and such member must pay her current dues to the Unit before becoming eligible to purchase a PUFL membership. If a member pays her dues in advance and later decides she wants to purchase a PUFL membership cost until January 1 of the current membership year.

<u>COMPLETING APPLICATION</u>: The APPLICANT completes and signs the top portion of the application form and submits to the Unit Secretary for certification. Payment or charge card information must be provided before the application can be processed. Make check or money order payable to: **National Treasurer, American Legion Auxiliary**. See the rate chart or calculation below for payment due.

The UNIT SECRETARY must: 1) certify that applicant has paid current year dues; 2) complete and sign the second section of the application; 3) send the fully completed application, along with payment, to the address listed on the reverse.

PROCESSING APPLICATION: After the application and payment are accepted and processed by National Headquarters, a permanent PUFL Membership card is sent to the member. The card is proof of her paid-up-for-life membership status.

Each year thereafter, National Headquarters will send the Unit, through its Department Headquarters, the Unit's share of the member's annual dues. The Unit will receive the same amount each year as long as the member lives and remains a member of that Unit. The member will continue to receive an annual membership card each year.

COST: The cost of a PUFL membership is based upon two factors -- the member's age at the time of application/purchase and the total dues of the Unit at the time the application is processed. The total dues of the Unit consist of the Department per capita, the National per capita and the amount of annual dues retained by the Unit. The dues amount used to compute the cost of a PUFL membership may not be less than the sum of the Department per capita plus National per capita. (Units may waive their portion of dues. By doing so, the Unit forfeits or "gives up" the annual payment of that member's dues from the Paid Up For Life Trust.) Note: see "ELIGIBILITY" section (above) about deducting dues paid in advance from the total PUFL fee.

The rate chart or calculation must be used to determine the exact cost of a Paid Up For Life membership. At the top of the chart, select your age group -- the age at your last birthday. In the left-hand column, find the amount of your annual Unit dues (*round* to the nearest dollar amount) and trace across to your age column. This amount is the cost of your PUFL Membership.

Example: if you are 62 years old and your Unit dues are \$12.50, the cost of your PUFL membership is \$268.00.

If your dues amount is higher than \$50.00, you can find a continuation of the PUFL rate chart in the Member section of the ALA National Headquarters website.

NOTE: For members under age 18, find the PUFL rate for 18-24 age range for your Unit dues amount. To that amount, add \$2.00 for each year of age preceding 18^{th} birthday.

For example, the total PUFL fee for an 11-year-old member whose Unit dues are \$25.00 would be \$916. \$25 dues for 18-24 = \$902 +\$14 (7 years preceding 18^{th} birthday x \$2) = \$916.00
