We might indeed be whispered about and snickered at by the other passengers but knowing that we were coming to a moment of jumping from the aircraft, do you think you would take it off? No you wouldn't take it off because you would know that the only hope you had when the time came to exit the aircraft was the parachute strapped to your back."

Galatians 3:27, "For all of you who were baptized into Christ have clothed yourselves with Christ." Jesus is your only parachute available to save you from hell. Without Him you are lost!
