

## You Are Here For A Purpose

Revelation 4:11; Psalm 102:18; Isaiah 43:71

If I were to ask you today why are you here.... now, I don't mean why are you listening to this program. I mean why are you on Earth? Well, today we're going to look in Revelation chapter 4 and verse 11, and then we're going to also look in Psalm 102, verse 18, and then we're going to look in Isaiah chapter 43 and verse 7. Why are you here?

Well, today, we look around us and we understand that some do not know where they came from, what they are doing here, or where they are going, but in God's Word, we find the answer. First, we see that you are here to bring pleasure to God. In Revelation chapter 4 and verse 10, it says we see people.... In this verse, it says we see people casting their crowns before the throne and saying, in verse 11 of Revelation 4, *Thou art worthy, O Lord, to receive glory and honour and power: for thou hast created all things, and for thy pleasure they are and were created.* We were created for the pleasure of God, and we were created by God.

In Psalm 139 in verse 16, it says, *Thine eyes did see my substance, yet being imperfect; and in thy book all [my members] were written, [which] in*

*continuance were fashioned, when [as yet there was] none of them.* We were created by God, and we can only bring pleasure to Him by first being saved.

But think of this in the last verse that we read in Psalm 139 and verse 16. God knew us before we were even born. God sees us before we are even born. God knows us. He created us, and so, therefore, He knows our hearts. We can't fool God. We need to understand that as God looks at us we are to bring pleasure to Him. We are to serve Him because He is God, because He is the Creator. He made us. Now, we were created by God and we can only bring pleasure to Him by being saved.

In Romans chapter 8 and verse 8, it says, *So then they that are in the flesh....* That's the people who are not saved ....*cannot please God.* Some people want to believe that they are living for God simply by doing good works. Well, that's not the case. Unless you have been born again, you are not bringing pleasure to God. His pleasure is for you to receive His Son, Jesus, who came to this earth. It says in the Bible in John 3:16, *For God so loved the world that he gave his only begotten son that, whosoever believeth in him should not perish, but have everlasting life.* You please God by receiving His Son into your heart.

In verse 9 of Romans chapter 8, it says, *But ye are not in the flesh....* That's speaking of a saved person.... *but in the spirit, if so be that the spirit of God dwell in you. Now if any man have not the spirit of Christ, he is none of his.*

Now, there are some who teach that, if you want to be saved, you must pray for the Spirit....you must pray for the Spirit to come upon you. But God's Word teaches us that in order to be saved we need to pray that Christ comes upon us, that He comes in our heart. Some people get the cart

before the horse. They want the Spirit before they receive Jesus as Saviour.

Well, let me say that the way you receive the Spirit is by receiving Jesus Christ as your Saviour, because if you have not the Spirit of God you're none of His, according to the Word of God.

Now, notice in Hebrews chapter 11 and verse 6, *But without faith.... That's trust in Christ.... [it is] impossible to please [him].... That's God.... for he that cometh to God must believe that he is, and [that] he is a rewarder of them that diligently seek him.* No, receiving the Spirit of God is not salvation. That's a result of salvation. Salvation comes by trusting only in the Lord Jesus Christ.

Now, we bring pleasure to God, also by being surrendered to Him. In Romans chapter 12, verses 1 and 2, it says, *I beseech you therefore, brethren, by the mercies of God, that ye present your bodies a living sacrifice, holy, acceptable unto God, [which is] your reasonable service.* In verse 2 it says, *And be not conformed to this world: but be ye transformed by the renewing of your mind, that ye may prove what [is] that good, and acceptable, and perfect, will of God.*

*Acceptable* here means well pleasing to God. We are well pleasing, first of all, by receiving Jesus as our Saviour. We're well pleasing secondly by surrendering our lives in His service by serving Him. And then we're well pleasing to God as we live for Him and we strive to do His will. The Bible says, if we confess our sins, He's faithful and just to forgive us our sins and to cleanse us from all unrighteousness. Yes, Christians do sin. You may not agree with that, but you need to read the Bible. If you do not agree with that, you're not agreeing with the Word of God.

God says to that Christian who is out of His will today, "You're in sin." You've sinned. You haven't lost your salvation, but you've lost the fellowship that needs to be restored between you

and God the Father. If we confess our sins, He is faithful and just to forgive us our sin and to cleanse us from all unrighteousness.

And notice this, you are also here to bring praise to God. In Psalm 102 and verse 18, it says, *This shall be written for the generation to come: and the people which shall be created shall praise the LORD.* In Psalm 50 and verse 23, in the first part of that verse, it says, *Whoso offereth praise glorifieth me.... That's God.*

We need to praise God. We need to go to Him in prayer daily, and as we pray, I believe we need to start our prayers off by praising God, by telling Him who He is. Now, He knows who He is, but He wants us to let Him know that we know who He is. He is the great Creator. He is the sustainer of life. Without God, there is nothing. There was nothing made that was made without Him. He is from eternity through eternity. There was no beginning and no end of God. He has always been and He always will be. Now, my small mind cannot comprehend everything about God. I simply take God at His Word when He says, *I am.* He is the great *I am.* He has always been and He will always be God.

In Psalm 69 and verse 30 and 31, it says, *<sup>30</sup>I will praise the name of God with a song, and will magnify him with thanksgiving. <sup>31</sup>[This] also shall please the LORD....* You are here to bring praise to God. In Psalm 107 and verse 8, it says, *Oh that [men] would praise the LORD [for] his goodness, and [for] his wonderful works to the children of men!* In verse 15, it says the same thing as verse 8. In verse 21, it says the same thing. It says that we are to bring praise to God. Are you praising Him today? Do you praise the Lord for your breath? Do you praise the Lord for your good things that come into your life? Do you praise God for the material blessings that He has bestowed upon you? Each of us needs to realize that without God we have nothing.

In Psalm chapter 146 through 150, it says, *Praise ye the Lord* [v.1]. Hebrews 13, verse 15, says, *By him therefore let us offer the sacrifice of praise to God continually, that is, the fruit of [our] lips giving thanks to his name.* We need to praise God continually. We need to have a mindset of prayer and thanksgiving in our hearts. We need to have a prayer and mindset of praise to God in our hearts continually, for without God we are nothing.

You are also here to bring glory to God. Not only are you here to bring praise to God, but you're here to bring glory to God. In Isaiah chapter 43 and verse 7, the Bible says here as God's speaking, *I have created him for my glory....* God says that he created man for His glory. In 1 Corinthians 10:31, *Whether therefore ye eat, or drink, or whatsoever ye do, do all to the glory of God.* And I would say to you today, may your life bring pleasure, praise, and glory to God. And may each of us say, as the book of Philippians in chapter 1 and verse 21 says, *For ... me to live [is] Christ.....*

Are you living for Him today? Do you serve Him today? Why are you here? You are here to bring pleasure to God. Why are you here? You are here to bring praise to God. Why are you here? You are here to bring glory to God.

Without Jesus as your Saviour, you can do none of those things. Jesus said that He came to give life to all those who would believe. Have you believed and trusted in Him today as your Saviour? Bow your head right where you're at now and say, "Lord, come into my heart. I repent or I turn from my sin as best I know how, and I receive you as my Saviour as best I know how. Come into my heart and save me today."

The Bible says whosoever shall call upon the name of the Lord shall be saved. It goes on to say, *For with the heart man believeth unto righteousness,* the heart, the innermost being of a person. Ask Him to come in and save you today.

If you're a saved person, you need to be doing the things that I've mentioned in these verses today. You need to praise God; you need to bring pleasure to God; and you need to bring glory to God. Are you doing that? If not, ask God's forgiveness today. Ask Him to restore the joy of your salvation.
