

## **Brass Mute Recommendations for ROHS**

Below are the brands and models of mutes recommended for students in the ROHS Band Program. Purchasing all of these is not required. Strongly suggested for both trumpet and trombone are the straight, cup, and plunger mutes. They are used frequently. Horn players should own a stop mute.

There are numerous brands and types of mutes available. The suggestions below represent mutes of high quality that are moderately priced. In all cases there are much more expensive and better quality options. There are cheaper options too, but in most cases their quality is sub-standard and the sound produced is undesirable.

The best case scenario is all students having the same brands and types, creating the most consistent blend of sound within sections. If you already own mutes that are different than those below, it's not a problem. If you have any questions about these suggestions or the numerous other mutes available, see your director.

## Trumpet

Type	Recommendation	<u>Prioroty</u>
Straight	Alessi-Vacchiano 3000	High – used often (this mute is best for section playing in band)
Straight	Tom Crown, Dennis Wick	Med-low – these brands are best for solo playing
Cup	Humes & Berg 102	High – used often
Harmon	Jo Ral 2A Bubble	Med – for jazz primarily, some classical
Bucket	Humes & Berg 108	Med-low – for jazz primarily, some classical
Plunger	Std. sink plunger (hardware store)	High – used in both jazz and "pop" classical

## Trombone

Type	Recommendation	<u>Prioroty</u>
Straight	Alessi-Vacchiano 3002	High – used often (this mute is best section playing in band)
Straight	Tom Crown, Dennis wick	Med-low – these brands are best for solo playing
Cup	Humes & Berg 152	High – used often
Harmon	Jo Ral TRB-3 Bubble	Low – for jazz primarily, rarely classical
Bucket	Humes & Berg 160	Med-low – for jazz primarily, some classical
Plunger	Std. toilet plunger (hardware store)	High – used in both jazz and "pop" classical

## Horn

Type	Recommendation	Prioroty
Straight	Humes and Berg 134	High – most commonly called for
Stop Mute	Tom Crown	Med – used less frequently
