The Alexander Macomb Award (Organization) was awarded to the Michigan Transit Museum. John



Jamison, III, accepted the award for the Michigan Transit Museum. Its home is located in the 1862 Depot in Mount Clemens. The depot was still functioning until 1980 when the City of Mount Clemens bought it and leased it to the Michigan Transit Museum for use as its headquarters and museum. The depot has been restored to its 1900 appearance.

A great lunch was catered by our hosts. Following the delicious lunch and business meeting, tours were given of the grounds and buildings of Simpson Park Campground.
