BHP CNS TEMPORARY PROGRAMMING ADJUSTMENTS FOR COVID-19

The high level of COVID-19, particularly the Delta variant, transmission rate in Montgomery County have led us to revise, temporarily, our daily programming procedures. Beginning on September 8:

1. Each class will be assigned an outdoor classroom. The classroom will have a 10 x 15 canopy to provide shade and to define each class' area. The outdoor classrooms will have tables, handwashing stations, coat racks, and tarps for wet ground.
2. Children will be dropped off and picked up from their outdoor classrooms. Adults and children will be asked to wear masks for drop-off and pick-up, even if fully vaccinated.
3. Daily health screenings will be conducted for staff and students. At drop-off teachers will take the children's temperatures and ask a series of quick health questions. Any child with a temperature of over 100.4 or who answers yes to the questions, will be sent home until they are cleared by a medical professional to return to school.
4. Masks must be worn indoors by everyone who can successfully wear a mask over 2 years of age, per Montgomery County requirements. Depending on the outdoor activity masks may be required. If your family requests your child(ren) wear a mask both indoors and outdoors at all times, we will have your child(ren) wear a mask, except when eating and drinking. Please discuss your request with your child(ren)'s teacher.
5. Children will eat snack and lunch outdoors, weather permitting.
6. There will be a daily rotation between the 3 playgrounds, the Outdoor Discovery Center, the field and Big Blue Blocks, 2 blacktop areas for bikes, trikes, bubbles, and more.
7. Using the bathrooms and diaper changing will be indoors.
8. Each class will be allowed to use their indoor classroom on a limited basis. (While indoors, the children will be masked. Classroom windows will be open. Classroom doors will be opened and the ventilation will be running while school is in session.)
9. In the event of an all-day heavy rain, we will hold school indoors with modified drop-off and pick-up procedures.

Daily Arrival of Staff (Teachers and Administrators)

- When warranted or required, the Director or Assistant Director will conduct a daily temperature check and health questionnaire for each staff member upon the staff member's arrival. There will be a recordation of the staff member's temperature and health questionnaire responses. Responses to the health screening will be logged and kept in a private, restricted file following privacy guidelines.
- Staff will be advised to not come to campus if they do not feel well or have any indication that they may have been exposed to an individual with COVID-19.
- BHCNS reserves the right to request that staff retake their temperature at any time while they are on campus.

Daily Arrival of Children

- Upon arriving at school all children are to have their hands washed, either at the handwashing stations or with hand sanitizer by parents/caregivers.
- Bring your child to their assigned area, **NO EARLIER** than 8:55 am.
- Each classroom has a clipboard where a parent or caregiver **MUST** initial that the child is attending school each day. This daily login is required by the Maryland State Department of Education, MSDE.
- Never leave a child in a classroom area without an adult present.

Daily Health Screenings for Children

Classroom teachers will check each child in the morning as the child arrives, and BHCNS reserves the right to request that the child return home if the child appears to be ill.

When warranted or required, a daily health screening for each child may be conducted by the classroom teacher.

- The classroom teacher will take a child's temperature and ask a series of health questions upon a child's arrival. There will be a recordation of the child's temperature and health questionnaire responses. Responses to the health screening will be logged and kept in a private, restricted file following privacy guidelines.
- A child who does not pass the health screening (as determined by answering 'yes' to any questions on the health questionnaire and/or having a temperature of 100.4 degrees or higher) will not be allowed to attend school.
- If there are multiple children attending BHCNS from the same family, all the children's temperatures will be taken at the first child's drop-off location. If one child from a family does not pass the health screening, all children from the family will need to return home, until such time as they are cleared by a medical professional to return to programming.
- Upon successful completion of the health screening, children will be admitted to their classroom.
- **Children are not to come to school if they do not feel well or have any indication that they may have been exposed to an individual with COVID-19.**
- **Contact the school office immediately if you think your child or another family member may be infected or have been exposed to an individual with COVID-19**
- **Follow all steps required for a child to return to school if they have been absent with any illness.**

WHAT YOUR CHILD SHOULD BRING TO SCHOOL EVERYDAY!



Your child will need to bring their tote bag to and from school every day to carry all their school stuff, extra clothing and masks!



Your child is to bring a water bottle to school each day. We will refill as needed.



If your child is staying for lunch, they must have a small, soft-sided lunch bag. We refrigerate all lunches.



Folders, school provided, are to go to and from school each day. They will contain important information.



For your child's comfort on the playgrounds they are to wear closed-toe shoes and socks.

PLEASE label all belongings with your child's name!



School Day Attire!

Children love to climb, swing, run, jump, skip, hop, hang upside down, and more throughout the day. Please make sure your children are appropriately dress for the playground and sitting at circle time. Children should wear underwear at all times. I know it sounds like a crazy reminder, but you'd be amazed at the things we see at nursery school.

PS: The downstairs bathrooms are for children only during the day. Adults, including teachers and staff are to use the upstairs bathrooms.

BETHESDA JEWISH CONGREGATION & BHPCNS FOOD DRIVE FOR MANNA FOOD



BHPCNS is excited to partner with the Bethesda Jewish Congregation, BJC, to collect needed food supplies for the Manna Food Center. BHPCNS will be distributing paper bags with a list of requested supplies at the start of the school year. Please consider donating items between 9-8 and 9-16. Items needed include:

GRAINS: instant oatmeal, brown rice, whole grain pasta

PROTEIN: canned tuna, salmon, chicken in water, dry/canned beans, nut butters

FRUITS & VEGGIES: canned vegetables, canned fruit in juice, fruit cups

Large blue bins will be placed by the parking lot near the BHPC office for donations. Or drop your donations at the school admin table and we will place your donations in the bins.



At BHCNS we believe that early intervention for a developmental delay can make a tremendous difference in a child’s life. There is a wide range of normal development in children. Most developmental delays in children are not serious and with interventions children eventually catch up. Even children who do have serious delays can make big improvements when treatment begins as early as possible.

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To identify if a child may possibly have a developmental delay we do several screenings at BHCNS, including the ASQ-3 for all our children, (For the 2021-2022 school year, only children new to BHCNS will complete an ASQ-3. If your child attended our Spring Term, you will not need to complete an ASQ-3 questionnaire again.) vision screenings for our 3 and 4-year olds, hearing screenings for our 3 and 4-year olds, speech screenings for children identified as possibly having a speech or language delay, and occupational therapy screenings for children identified as possibly having gross, or fine motor delays. All of the screenings are performed by vetted professionals and done in a fun and age appropriate manner. Results and recommendations are shared with parents. Any recommendations for a more thorough developmental assessment will be discussed with parents in a parent/teacher/director conference. Please contact the office if you have questions, comments, or concerns.

How Developmental Delays May Present In Young Children

There are 5 main types of developmental delays in infants and young children. They include problems with:

- language or speech - articulation, expressive, and/or receptive language
- vision – ability to see properly
- movement – fine and gross motor skills, understanding boundaries, controlling one’s movements
- social and emotional skills – age appropriate interactions with adults and peers
- cognitive skills - thinking and processing information

Language and/or Speech Delays in toddlers and young children are common. In fact, language and speech problems are the most common type of developmental delay. Speech refers to verbal expression, including the way words are formed. Language is a broader system of expressing and receiving information, such as being able to understand gestures.

Vision Developmental Delays can be difficult to recognize. Until about 6 months a newborn's vision is normally blurry. After 6 months a child’s vision improves as the child begins to coordinate sight in both eyes. Sometimes this does not happen and vision problems such as farsightedness, near sightedness, lazy eye, may develop impacting a child’s sight.

Motor Skill Developmental Delays may be related to problems with gross motor skills, such as crawling or walking, or fine motor skills, such as using fingers to grasp a spoon, hold a pencil or crayon, or more. Some children have challenges controlling their movements, they may be bouncy, or have challenges recognizing where they are in space leading to walking into things or obstacles, and/or understanding personal boundaries.

Social and Emotional Developmental Delays may be when a child experiences problems interacting with adults or other children. Other challenges include excessive tantrums, hurting themselves, being inconsolable, and forming attachments.

Cognitive Developmental Delays may present as a child not “learning” age-appropriate concepts, such as their colors or shapes, or when a child is challenged following sequential directions and developmental norms.

Tuition Payments:

Payments are due the first of each month, Sept.-May, and are considered late if not received by the 15th of the month. If your payment is not received by the 15th, a 10% late fee will be assessed.

Classroom and Office Email Communication:

By the end of the first week of school you should have received at least one email from your child's classroom teacher. If you have not received an email, please email your child's teacher so they may capture your email address. (Occasionally messages land in spam/trash folders.) BHPCNS staff emails almost all follow the same format. The teacher's first initial and last name at BHPCNS. Example: Lsobrino@bhpcns.org. Occasionally, a teacher may include a middle initial too.

Student Records:

Each year we undergo a rigorous inspection by the Maryland State Department of Education. To be prepared we will be doing a thorough check of all our student's records. We will notify you of any missing paperwork, immunizations, etc. We ask that you submit any missing paperwork promptly. We appreciate your help in making sure our records are compliant with state regulations.

Label all Belongings: Consider using LabelDaddy or minted. for your labels.

PLEASE label all your child's belongings, jackets, tote bags, lunch bags, anything that they bring to school should be labeled with your child's name. You would be amazed at how many children don't recognize their own belongings and how many children have the same jackets, and bags.

Early Morning with Bradley Bear, Lunch Bunch, and Stay and Play Programming,

Forms for these additional programs can be collected outside the office, or downloaded from our website, www.bhpcns.org. All three programs will begin on October 4, 2021. Teachers, parents, and the office will all be part of determining if/when a child is ready for additional programming.

School Snacks:

BHPCNS has a school wide snack schedule. A calendar of the snack schedule is posted on the bulletin board outside the office and on [our website on our calendar page](#). You may request a hard copy from the office.

Children's Lunches:

- BHPCNS provides organic 1% milk at lunch each day. Children are offered a choice of organic milk or water at lunch time. You do not need to pack a drink with your child's lunch.
- Please pack healthy, nutritious lunches for your children. BHPCNS teachers are not allowed by our licensing agency to make the children eat their "growing" foods first. If you pack a cookie and your child wants to eat that instead of their sandwich, we are technically not allowed to have them eat their sandwich first.
- Children's lunches should be foods children are familiar with and should be cut into appropriate sized servings. Sandwiches cut into quarters are much easier for little ones to eat.
- We send home any easily wrapped, uneaten lunch foods. Uneaten yogurts, apple sauce cups, etc. will be tossed out.
- Lunch is a social time. Children like to talk and share their lives at lunch. Sometimes this gets in the way of eating their whole lunch. Don't worry as your child settles into school they will eat more of their lunch.

Donations: Before you throw it out donate it to BHPCNS

- Large oatmeal canisters to be crafted into drums.
- We can never have too many toilet paper or paper towel rolls.
- And you wouldn't believe how much newspaper we can use each month.
- Small glass jars with lids, i.e. baby food jars.

If your family can donate any of these items, we'd be thrilled to collect them from you at the admin table.

Across from the office is the BHPCNS' bulletin board. This space is updated regularly with our school monthly calendar, children's birthdays, and flyers about school events.

Another bulletin board by the bathrooms is used to share flyers about community programs, parenting events, sports programs, etc. that may be of interest to families. Please check these board occasionally when we return to indoor programming.

BHPCNS Open Door Policy:

If at any time you have a concern or praise for something that is happening at BHPCNS, please stop by the office to share your thoughts. Without your input we don't know where we need to improve or what we are doing correctly. We value all input😊

I am very excited to share this beautiful and expressive language with your children. ASL improves fine motor skills, strengthens hand-to-eye coordination, and builds confidence. It also enhances cognitive processes which lead to higher abstract and creative thinking. And, it is so much fun!

This month we will be warming up our little fingers with many familiar songs that include finger play: "Open Shut Them," "The Itsy Bitsy Spider," and "Twinkle Twinkle Little Star." We will learn how to sign many greetings including: "Hello, it's nice to meet you; my name is; how are you?; (and the many the responses to this question), see you later; and goodbye." We will also begin learning one another's name in ASL as well as learning to sign and sing our "Hello Song."
