



**Lulu Roman** has enjoyed many successes in her life, but also more than her share of disappointments and hardships. She is best known for her side splitting humor and jovial disposition, but a lesser known story lies behind those sparkling radiant eyes which have often been filled with tears, both of pain and of joy.

LuLu is best known as the most requested female cast member on the long running hit television Show "Hee Haw." The show ran from 1969-1993, and is now in reruns on the RFD-TV network. LuLu is also known for her accomplished and celebrated songwriting and singing all over the world.

A native of Dallas, TX, LuLu was born in a home for unwed mothers, and placed in an orphan's home shortly after birth. She was born with a thyroid dysfunction, and it would be in the orphan's home that she first endured the pain of being unaccepted because of her weight. Her weight made her the brunt of much name-calling and teasing, and also prevented her from being adopted into a loving home. It was then she learned to use her sense of humor as a defense mechanism.

LuLu's sense of humor later evolved into a highly successful career as an actress and comedienne with a lead role on "Hee Haw." However, suc-

cess and wealth proved poisonous to the young actress. LuLu's search for acceptance and happiness eventually lead her to a drug addiction, which sent her down a spiral that nearly destroyed her life and career in 1971.

In 1973, a chance meeting with an old friend lead her to discover a new found faith in the Lord, and changed her life forever. It was in this revelation that she discovered she had a hidden talent in her voice. LuLu then began singing Gospel music, and eventually introduced it to "Hee Haw."

LuLu's new found career as a vocalist proved to be very successful. She is the recipient of a Dove award, and has been nominated many times. She is also a member of the Country Gospel Music and Christian Music halls of fame. LuLu has also been honored with the JD Sumner Living Legend Award and named Favorite Crossover Artist by the Country Gospel Music Association. The TV Land network also awarded LuLu with their prestigious Entertainer's Award.

To date, LuLu has recorded 21 albums and is still singing in churches, seminars, fairs, performing arts centers, and anywhere she is welcomed to share her life story and music.

Her latest gospel project "Seven Times" has garnered an international hit song ("Do You Know How To Fly"), and is still being shared across the globe. It also features one of the last songs her pre-

cious friend Dottie Rambo wrote for her, "Move Upon Us."

LuLu has just completed a new project entitled "At Last." The album features 12 of her favorite standards and classics, such as "I Will Always Love You," "Summertime," "You Don't Know Me," "Til I Can Make It On My Own, " and the title song. LuLu's dear friends Dolly Parton, T. Graham Brown, Linda Davis, and Georgette Jones also joined her on the album.

In addition to "Hee Haw," LuLu has also been a guest star on such television programs as "The Love Boat" and "Touched By An Angel." She is also an accomplished author, with her autobiography and her cookbook "Kitchen Komforts."

Although she has been performing for over 40 years, she has no plans to rest or retire. LuLu continues to travel sharing her testimony, her humor, and her music.

He started singing in church and performing in school plays. He was influenced as a child by George Strait, Randy Travis, Reba McEntire, and

Loretta Lynn. Donnie has entertained all across the United States. He was a special guest on the Ernest Tubb Midnite Jamboree in Nashville, TN, singing with Grand Ole Opry Stars Jan Howard and Jean Shepard. Donnie has performed several times on Carnival Cruise ships. He was a top 20 finalist on Fox 50's Gimme the Mic in 2005. He just ended a 14 year run with the cast of the American Music Jubilee country variety show at the Rudy Theater in Selma, NC. Donnie has opened for Country artist Jeff Bates, and has performed in many Conway Twitty and Loretta Lynn Tribute Shows with fellow singer Emily Portman. Often compared to Country crooner Josh Turner, Donnie has rich baritone vocals. He was awarded "Male Vocalist of the Year" in 2014 at the Shepherdsville Country Music Show in Shepherdsville, KY. His most recent recording honors Country Legend Conway Twitty. The newest CD, "Remembering Conway", has proven to be one of his best. He has also been recording an upcoming project in the studio which could be released as early as March 2015. Donnie is currently on the "Country On the

Radio" tour, which will visit many theaters and other venues throughout this year.

#### Greg McDougal and his family have been in full time music ministry since 2007. What began as a spe-



cial cause and need in their lives, God has turned into a great desire for them to go and tell of His mercy and grace in the midst of it all. Greg and Diane moved to Nashville, Tennessee to be in the Country Music Business in 1992. In 1997, Atlantic Records Recording Artist, John Michael Montgomery recorded one of Greg's songs, and it seemed as if Greg and Diane were living a dream. In 1998, they had their first of 4 children, but with three of their four children diagnosed with Cystic Fibrosis, life got complicated. It was clear that God had different plans than the ones Greg had been chasing. Greg walked away from a promising career in music and spent the next seven years as a home repair carpenter.

This family will tell you that this is when they first learned how God takes the years that the locusts have eaten and makes them new. It was during this season that God led Greg to record a

life changing and award winning CD called The Work of a Carpenter. Because of this project, so many lives across the country and around the world, have been touched by their story of faith, love and determination for the sake of their.

As he speaks, sings, and plays his Martin guitar, you will hear of forgiveness, faith, family, and how God indeed redeems all things through Jesus Christ. And then, the McDougal kids sing. (By the way they won ICM Youth in Music Award in 2013 and 2014)


Kat Taylor

Born and raised in Tuscaloosa, Alabama, Kat Taylor found her love of music early in life. Riding with her father on work trips, she belted out 90s country and cultivated a deep appreciation for the vocal talents of Martina McBride, Faith Hill, and Reba McEntire. At 18 she auditioned for the hit TV program Nashville Star and made it past the first round. During the next round she would have to perform an original tune, which she did not have, so she never went back for the next round of competition. For years, she didn't revisit the idea of songwriting until seeing a flyer for Tips for Tuscaloosa, a charity event held monthly and hosted by singersongwriter Hope Cassity. Hope, as well as the other songwriters, were all floored with Kat's pristine vocal tone and range. She began to network with local and regional musicians, and before long, had written and co-written several songs. Combining the lyrical influence of Norah Jones and the vocal range and tone of Aretha Franklin, Kat quickly developed a powerful sound all her own. Her regular appearances at Tips

for Tuscaloosa opened doors for her to perform in other local venues and for session work in Tuscaloosa and Nashville. Rarely do the elements of natural talent, beauty, personality, and drive come together in one performer, and it is refreshing to witness in the current music industry. Kat has assembled a band of talented and experienced musicians and is currently booking duo, trio, and full band performances for 2016-2017. Over the next 18 years, Lawrence worked clubs from New York to Florida and local clubs such as Sammy's Supper Club, the Five O'clock Club, the Patio, Diamond Jim's, the Boom Boom Room, the Pussycat a Go Go and Constantine's at the Sheraton. He worked with such bands as the Roadrunners, the Premiers, Little Hugh and the Mad Men, the K'Otics, the Classics IV, and many others that he can't remember. Over the years he was in tour packages which included Sam The Sham, the

Shangri-Las, Lonnie Mack, Mitch Ryder, Johnny Rivers, the Drifters, and Ace Cannon.

In 1980, Lawrence played his last club, then drove a truck for a while, and then helped run the family business. He presently lives in Cottondale, Alabama. #### The Good Shepherd Statue

After the death of his mother, Pearlie Mae Williamson, Johnny Williamson was inspired to create a representation of the 23rd Psalm. It was her favorite scripture.

A cypress log was chosen for *The Good Shepherd Statue* because of the longstanding belief that the Cypress is the "gopher wood" (or kopher which is the Hebrew word for waterproof) that Noah used to build the ark. He worked alongside longtime friend and local artist/sculptor, Willie Logan (1940-2010), to carve the 6-1/2 foot statue of *The Good Shepherd*.

The best recognized example of a symbolic shepherd is in the Son of God, Jesus. In John 1:11, Jesus spoke of himself, I am the good shepherd; the good shepherd giveth his life for the sheep.

Joshua 4 teaches us to set up memorials as reminders of what God has lead us through and to give us opportunity to teach our children about our spiritual heritage to glorify God. The Good Shepherd Statue is intended to be such a memorial. It is located on Highway 43 North, approximately 2 miles north of Northside High School.

We respectfully request that the statue be referred to as The Good Shepherd and not Jesus in a box!

#### Shepherd Hill Opry

The outdoor Amphitheatre was built in memory of Johnny Williamson by his children on the property where he called home and created deep roots.

Johnny called family gatherings parties, which consisted of family, friends, food and music. He instructed his children to continue having parties on his property after he was gone. This site is intended to glorify God and continue Johnny's legacy in the community he loved so dearly with his multitude of friends. All net proceeds benefit the Johnny Williamson Good Shepherd Foundation.

Concerts are held throughout the year. Well-known artists Allen Frizzell (Lefty Frizzell's younger brother), Marty Raybon (lead singer with Shenandoah), Lulu Roman (former Hee Haw Star), Clinton Gregory Bluegrass Band, Jennifer Brantley, Gerald Smith, and Addison Johnson and Donnie Lee Strickland have performed at Shepherd Hill Opry as well as Shannon Knight formerly with The Gaithers. It is a tradition that the last song is always I Saw the Light with all the crowd joining in.
