We are coming into the stretch, and for some Units, a very busy time. The weather is warming up a bit and those outdoor activities just seem to fill our schedules.

I would like to encourage all of you to look for ways to not only enjoy the outdoor activities, but maybe even create an event

that would benefit the Auxiliary Emergency Fund such as a campaign that collects 'pocket change' in a water bottle or mason jar that once full, can be converted into a cash donation to the AEF program. Some banks or credit unions have coin counting machines that provide a receipt that can be deposited into your bank account so it's easy to write a check to your Unit, Department, or National. If you choose to send it directly to National and it is \$100 or more, National will send you the new AEF pin. They are sent quarterly so be patient, it could take a couple of months. Unit donations must go through the Department. Mark the memo section of the check with AEF donation.

A recent report received by this Chairman from National, the **Department of Arizona contributed \$1,455 to the AEF program** between October 1 and December 31, 2022. Nationwide total donations were \$54,162.42 during the same period. A summary report provided by National also listed the following:

Education February 2023



As we all know, college is very expensive, and all of our high school students should be taking advantage of any and all scholarships available to them. Units and departments are responsible for promoting American Legion Auxiliary scholarships and making sure the schools have them in ample time for students to apply. The American Legion Auxiliary offers four scholarship opportunities to students:

- 1. Children of Warriors National Presidents Scholarship: Scholarship is awarded to children of veterans who served in the armed forces during eligibility dates for The American Legion. Three \$5,000 scholarships will be awarded in each division. Fifteen outstanding students will be awarded a total of \$75,000 to further their education. The applicant must complete 50 hours of community service during their high school years to be eligible for one of these scholarships. Applicants must submit this scholarship online this year by March 1, 2023. It will be forwarded to the Department Secretary by the National Organization.
- 2. The Non-Traditional Student Scholarship: One scholarship in the amount of \$2,000 will be awarded in each American Legion Auxiliary division. Applicant must be a member of The American Legion, American Legion Auxiliary or Sons of The American Legion and shall have paid dues for the two preceding years and for the calendar year in which the application is made. Applicant must present the completed application to the American Legion Auxiliary unit president on or before March 1, 2023 to be forwarded to the Department Secretary by March 15, 2023.
- 3. Spirit of Youth Scholarship: One Junior member in each division will receive a scholarship valued at \$5,000. The applicant must have held membership in the American Legion Auxiliary for the immediate past three years, hold a current membership card and continue her membership in the American Legion Auxiliary during the four-year scholarship period. Applicant must present the completed application to the American Legion Auxiliary unit president on or before March 1, 2023 to be forwarded to the Department Secretary by March 15, 2023.
- 4. Junior Member Loyalty Scholarship: American Legion Auxiliary Junior members are the future of our organization. To reward those who retain their membership into adulthood, the American Legion Auxiliary offers the Junior Member Loyalty Scholarship to current college students. Ten scholarships, in the amount of \$2,500 each, will be awarded to a current college student for 2020. Two scholarships will be awarded in each division of the American Legion Auxiliary. The scholarship is a grant; not a loan. Applicant must present the completed application to the American Legion Auxiliary unit president on or before March 1, 2023 to be forwarded to the Department Secretary by March 15, 2023.

Please promote these American Legion Auxiliary scholarships to enable our children of veterans to apply and receive funds the American Legion Auxiliary has so graciously provided. Applications are available online at www.ALAforVeterans.org/Scholarships. Links to the scholarship applications can also be found on the Department website.

Legislative

March 2023

Greetings Members,

At the State Capitol, several rallies/demonstrations have been held in reference to Tyre Nichols, Roe vs. Wade and the 2nd Amendment.

Things are kinda crazy at the moment and busy for law enforcement. Fortunately, nothing too serious has happened.

Many legislative days at the Capitol have also taken place. These are events, where groups and legislators can mingle and discuss topics important to them. The event calendar is filling up fast.

On February 17th, National President Vickie Koutz made her official visit to Arizona. She visited the State Capitol where she and a delegation from Arizona including Department President White were given a personal guided tour of the museum and grounds by the Department Legislative Chairman.

As for Congress, the 118th Congressional session convened on January 3rd, 2023. On January 23rd, the Senate began its first work period of the year. The House has opted for two weeks of recess in February, and both chambers will be away for two weeks at the end of June and beginning of July. The Congressional Calendar can be found on www.rollcall.com.

The 2023 State of the Union Address was given by President Biden in the House Chambers on February 7th. A full transcript of Biden's State of the Union Address can be found at www.nytimes.com.

There is an important House bill that was voted on in the 116th Congress that passed affecting all veterans. It is called the Veterans Compact Act of 2020.

How is this beneficial? In short, starting Jan. 17th, Veterans in acute suicidal crisis will be able to go to any VA or non-VA health care facility for emergency health care at no cost — including inpatient or crisis residential care for up to 30 days and outpatient care for up to 90 days. Veterans do not need to be enrolled in the VA system to use this benefit.

This expansion of care will help prevent Veteran suicide by guaranteeing no cost, world-class care to Veterans in times of crisis. It will also increase access to acute suicide care for up to 9 million Veterans who are not currently enrolled in VA.

It is important to know who your State Representatives are, as well as your Congress members. Some are new, some have been re-elected. Please stay in the loop on the agendas these

officials are working, especially when it affects veterans, active duty service members and the four pillars.

Remember your reports are due to the Department Chairmen on or before May 1st, 2023. Make sure to include a narrative meeting the requirements of the program to be considered for an award.

VA&R REPORT TUCSON VA MEDICAL CENTER 1-31-23

All events are suspended until further notice. There is communication that some volunteer activities will be restarting. No specifics as of this date. Thank you volunteers for your help!

Ward W2 (Dementia Ward) in Building 60 is currently seeking twin size blankets for their patients. They request that the blankets be different colors/patterns so each patient will recognize their personal blanket. Thank you Unit 8 for your generous donation. They are also requesting clothing donations (sweatshirts and sweatpants all sizes especially size small in "girly" colors for the two female Veterans, socks and shoes men's sizes 9 and above). Many of the Veterans they serve come in with no clothing.

Southwestern Blind Rehabilitation Center (SWBRC) is continuing going on outings where they are invited. They would like to request support for outings which are not direct donations such as going to the movies, Pima Air & Space museum, Botanical Garden, etc. These outings must be financed by donations of either gift cards or the purchase of tickets directly by the sponsor. They currently have a population of twenty.

Patriot Pantry is up and running at is currently supporting 40 to 50 Veterans with food insecurities. The current monthly cost for this program is estimated at \$1,000. Since VA funds cannot be used to purchase the food, different donors are shopping and delivering the items to SAVAHCS. Our new Deputy Representative Dawn Davidson and I had a wonderful time shopping for and delivering the second donation from the American Legion Auxiliary. Thank you to Units 109, 131 and 132 for their generous contributions to this program.

The grand total of monetary donations for the American Legion Auxiliary for May 1, 2022 to January 31, 2023is \$7,975.00. Thank you to Units 66 & 131 for their generous donations. Through their help, we were able to support the Wheelchair Games, the Community Gardens program and the Gathering of American Indian Veterans program.

The grand total of material and activity donations for the American Legion Auxiliary for May 1, 2022 to January 31, 2023 is \$14,128.43. Thank you Unit 7, Unit 24, Unit 39, Unit 66, Unit 109, Unit 131 and Unit 132 for your generous donations to support our programs.

Eight registered hospital volunteers donated time which was credited to the American Legion Auxiliary. The grand total of registered volunteer hours May 1, 2022 to January 31, 2023 is 738. We have on-boarded two new volunteers whose hours will benefit the American Legion Auxiliary.

This chairman is working with the Homeless Program to ensure that our Homeless Veterans and those in Transitional Housing have the food and beverages that they need during this time of enormous stress on all community resources. This chairman is actively supporting the Patriot Pantry at SAVAHCS. This chairman is working with the Recreation departments to purchase needed supplies for the National Veterans Creative Arts Program and other recreational activities. National Veterans Creative Arts Festival was held September 14 & 15, 2022 and this chairman participated both days. Annual Joint Review was completed December 8, 2022.
