


As we begin this month of October, there is a lot about which to be excited. This Sunday we have our traditional St. Francis Feast Day animal blessings here and in Quilcene (see the article on the front page of this bulletin). Linked with this is the fact that October is also Respect Life Month. This gives us the opportunity to reflect on the gift of life in all its forms and stages. It is an opportunity to reflect on the gift of all the plant and animal life on the planet and our responsibility to care for it, cf. Genesis 2:15 "The Lord God took the man and put him in the Garden of Eden to work it and keep it," <u>https://</u> bit.ly/34fQqQT and Pope Francis' encyclical: "Laudato Si," https://bit.ly/319xxWB. But, most importantly, this month provides us with the opportunity to reflect on and express our gratitude for the most spectacular of all of God's creation: the human person, cf. Genesis 1:27 "God created mankind in his image; in the image of God he created them; male and female he created them," https://bit.ly/33iS3ha. Recently, in response to the pandemic and protests, Pope Francis spoke about the dignity of all humans, cf. <u>https://bit.ly/2SnK4In</u>. Along with this theme of Respect Life, October is traditionally the month of the Rosary, which, of all prayers, most perfectly reflects the respect life theme.

And lastly, we have a cause that is related to the above in a very broad way, we are now in the period of 40 days of prayer leading to our presidential election. It is important that we all work to prayerfully, study and form our consciences regarding the important issues and candidates before us. This is a particular concern as many people are unprepared to engage in dialogue in a respectful and peaceable manner and it is increasingly difficult to understand where the candidates truly stand on the issues important to us. The pastors of the Port Townsend Ministerial Association are all concerned about our ability to discuss these important issues in a peaceable manner. I add my voice to this concern. I invite you all to not avoid these important conversations but perhaps take care to "frame" your interactions by sharing your concern that our dialogue needs to be peaceable and for the purpose of better understanding each other's concerns and reasoning. We all need to first invite our brothers and sisters to share their thoughts and feelings on these issues. We need to listen, quietly, without interrupting them, and then, when invited share our thoughts and feelings. 


GREAT NEWS - ST. MARY'S IS LIVE!
