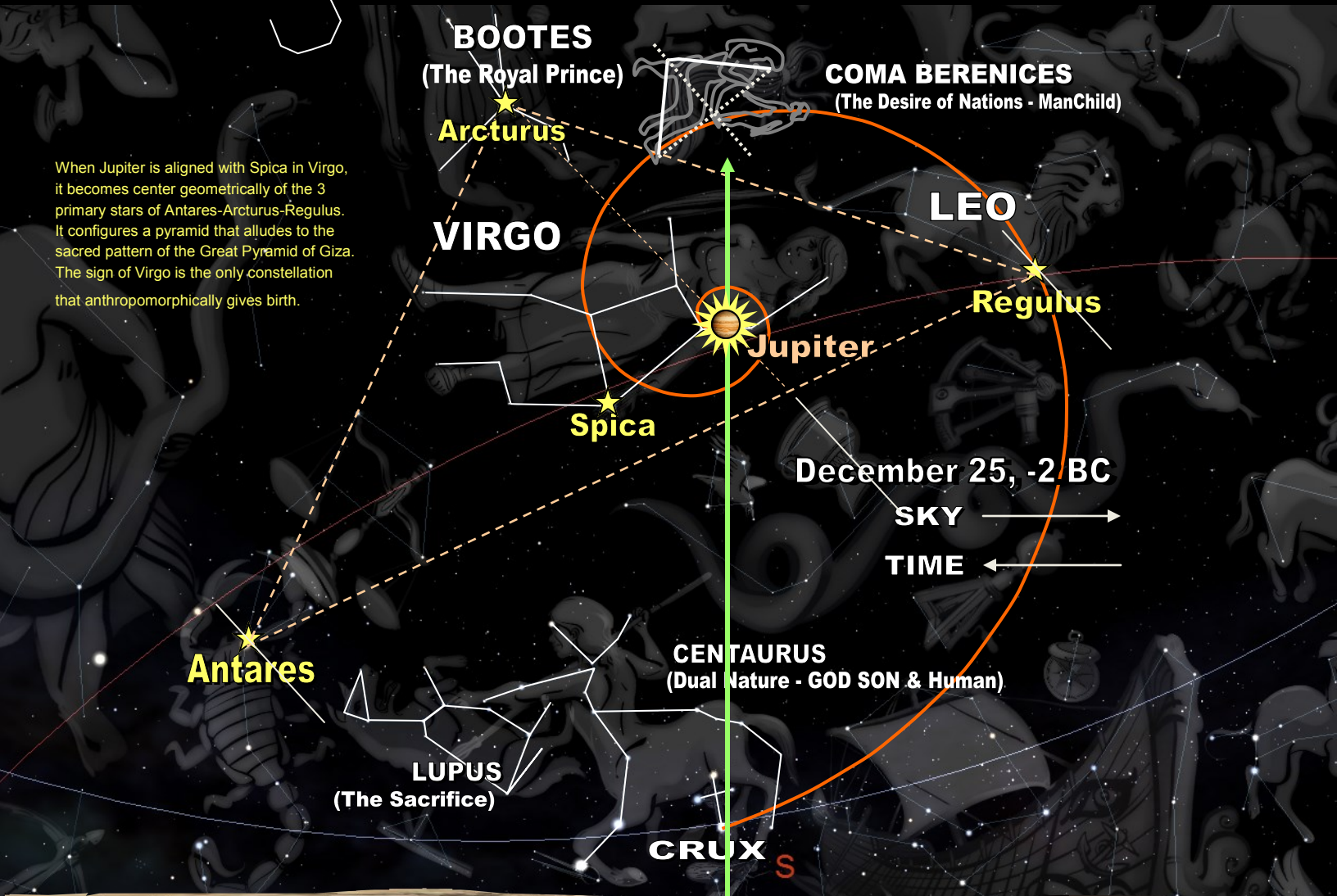


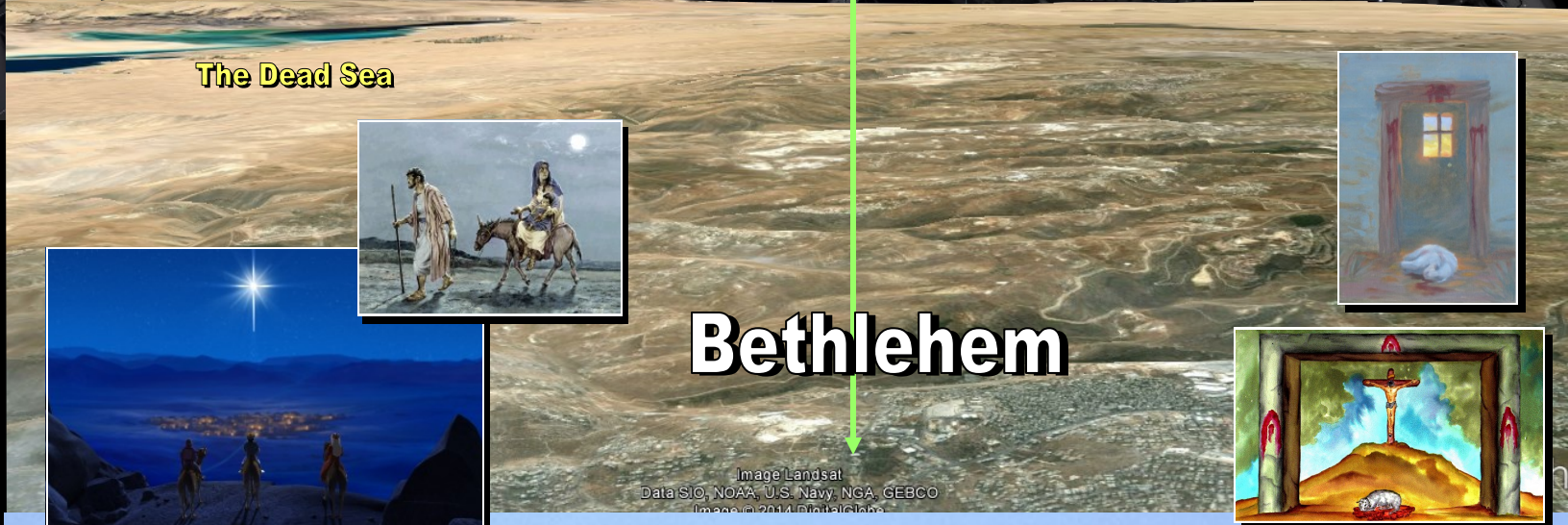
COSMOLOGY OF CHRIST'S BIRTH

The Cosmology of Christ's Birth series does not venture to guess or speculate on the actual date of Jesus Christ's birth but rather emphasize and focus on the peculiarities of the cosmology that perhaps might give additional clues as to the window of the probable time of the King's 1st Advent. This illustration features the depiction of the cosmic configuration of the winter -1BC as it pertains to the window of time after that Jesus Christ was born in Bethlehem. Looking south over the horizon around October 8th, Jupiter is aligned with Spica in Virgo. Spica refers to the Coming of the Branch, the Messiah that would come from a Virgin conception.



When Jupiter is aligned with Spica in Virgo, it becomes center geometrically of the 3 primary stars of Antares-Arcturus-Regulus. It configures a pyramid that alludes to the sacred pattern of the Great Pyramid of Giza. The sign of Virgo is the only constellation that anthropomorphically gives birth.
