## **Current Projects:**

- Completed the 2024-2025 regional Hazard Vulnerability Assessment (HVA) report

- Completed the required Readiness Assessment Plan, which is essentially the HERC's five-year workplan guiding the assessments, plan development, and training/exercise schedule
- Participating on the North Central RTAC Trauma conference planning committee and developing the
  preparedness track for the conference that will take place at North Central Technical College on April 10;

- Continue to provide WISCOM radio technical assistance and run drills with hospital partners twice monthly

- Awaiting to hear of potential H5N1 funding coming this spring/summer

    of a Family Assistance Center, risk communications, and patient tracking so that other partners can
    participate and test their plans as well

    partners will want to open their own ICP/EOC to work through the injects
