LAGUNA WOODS ART ASSOCIATION COVID-19 MASTERPIECE SHOW 2021 August 21, 2021– October 4, 2021

1. NUMBER AND SIZE OF ENTRIES

Due to exhibit space limitations, artists may enter only 1 painting TOTAL.

An artist may enter (1) entry with dimensions no larger than 52 inches.

2. ELIGIBILITY AND ARTWORK PRESENTATION

All entering artists must be current members of the Laguna Woods Art Association and residents of Laguna Woods. Submissions must be the artist's own original artwork and must have been completed during the COVID-19 months of March 2020 to August 20, 2021. Entries must be signed by the artist and be properly wired for hanging. Wire should be attached with screw eyes that are installed on each side 1/3 of the height down from the top of the frame. Wire should arch at the midpoint about one inch below the frame top. Collage entries must be framed or mounted on a 1-inch gallery wrap support. Gallery wrapped canvases of 1 inch will be accepted.

We will have an area for 12" or smaller submissions.

No artwork may be entered in this show if exhibited at a previous Laguna Woods Art Association Show.

Each entry must have the identification form completed and attached to the back, lower right side of the artwork.

REGISTRATION FORM DEADLINE

THURSDAY, AUGUST 12, 2021 at 3:00 pm at the Club House 4, Art Studio information table. Entry forms may also be e-mailed to gordondeirdre@gmail.com through THURSDAY, AUGUST 12, 2021 at 7:00 pm.

No entries will be accepted after this date and time.

Starting on August 2nd, members of the Laguna Woods Art Association are graciously invited to enjoy painting, sketching or photographing on Monday and Tuesday mornings anytime from 8 to 11 a.m.

Horses will be brought into the arena from approximately 9:30 to 10:30. Bring your own refreshments and a sun hat or umbrella for shade. We are hopeful that this opportunity will provide some exceptional art works that can be auctioned off for the benefit of the 'Herd'.

UPON ARRIVAL:

- Go into the office and sign-in
- · You will also need to sign a one-time waiver
- It will be okay if you overstay your visit a short while
- Chairs will be provided
- Bring your own refreshments or there is drinking water in the office

If you have one, bring a small umbrella for shade

You will be welcome to set up anywhere on the grounds as long as you are not disturbing the staff, owners or horses.

If there is a rider in the arena please announce your presence, and ask permission to paint or photograph.

You may also visit the horses in their stalls. **Please don't feed them** (apples or carrots) unless you check with staff first, as some of the horses have feeding restrictions.

Please remember to be courteous and check with riders/horse handlers if you enter their spaces.

Watercolor Experiences for Intermediate/Advanced Painters September 20 2021 Monday 1:00 – 3:30

limit: 20 Students With Sheila Parsons, Nancy Nadel, & Ellen Zimet

This class is for students who are familiar with basic painting techniques and would like to take their paintings to the next level. Students will learn the skills of critiquing but not limited to: identifying and appraising good design, value identification and distribution, brush technique and overall impressions. This article will be available on the first day of class.

Each class will begin with a critique session and then allow time for painting. There will be one offered project per month beginning in October for those who would like to participate. students will paint from their own references and photos. Teachers will assist as needed.

Very Beginning Watercolor Sept 21 -Feb 22, 2022 Tuesday 1:00 – 3:00

With Peggy Simmons

This class is geared for people who want to know the basics of watercolor. A supply list will be given at the first class. The course will concentrate on: brush techniques, color mixing for transparent watercolors, differences in papers, stretching paper, composition, how to make corrections, techniques, and how to present work for art shows.

The Figure: Intermediate Drawing Wednesday 1:00 – 3:00

With Jae Sung Ryu September 22 - December 8, 2021

This class will make figure drawing easy. Basic to advanced techniques and step by step drawing skills will be taught with demonstrations each week. Materials needed: Drawing or newsprint pads, medium to soft charcoal, charcoal pencils, drawing pencils # B4, B6; kneaded eraser, drawing board, knife or pencil sharpener.

Intermediate/Advanced Oil & Acrylic Painting Thursday 9:00 – 11:30

With Marge Kinney September 23 – December 2, 20221

This class is for the experienced painter. Refine the basics of what makes a good painting: Focus, color mixing, edges, composition and how to choose a good subject to paint. Work from your own photos or use reference pictures for inspiration. The palette for the class will be: Alizarin crimson, cadmium red light, Cadmiun yellow light, Lemon yellow, Yellow ochre, Orange hue, Sap green, Viridian, Cerulean blue, Ultramarine blue, Raw sienna, Titanium white & Ivory black.

Chinese Calligraphy Sept. 10 - Dec. 10, 2021 Friday 9:00 - 11:00

With Byung Hee Gwak

Calligraphy is the artistic expression of characters that has been widely practiced in the Far Eastern countries China, Korea, and Japan. It is a set of skills and techniques for positioning and inscribing words so they show integrity, harmony, rhythm, creativity, and some sort of ancestry. This class focuses on Chinese Calligraphy, with additional teaching of Korean Calligraphy.

INTRODUCTION TO PRINTMAKING WORKSHOP with Christine Kelly

Saturdays 10 am -1pm August 14, 21 and 28

In this class you'll learn about relief, intaglio and monotype printmaking techniques. We'll discuss how to choose the right technique for the effect you want to achieve.

At the end of the class, students will:

- Understand the craftsmanship of plate making and fine printing
- Demonstrate a basic familiarity with a wide range of printmaking processes including relief printing, drypoint, collagraph, and monoprinting
- Understand paper registration, press operation and print an edition and prepare prints for presentation using archival materials
- Demonstrate knowledge of safe shop practices

Laguna Woods Community Center Juried Art Exhibition for Intermediate and Advanced Village Artists

September 20, 2021—September 20, 2022

ELIGIBILITY AND ARTWORK PRESENTATION

Artists must be current members of the Laguna Woods Art Association and have a valid email address. Submissions must be the artist's own original artwork (no copies of other artworks). Entries must be signed by the artist and be properly wired for hanging. Entries must have the completed ID form attached to the lower right back of the work. Selected artwork will be hung on walls of each of the three floors of the Community Center. This is a juried exhibition so not all artwork submitted will be selected. Artwork will hang for one year – plan accordingly!

NUMBER AND TYPES OF ENTRIES

Each artist may enter 1 or 2 artworks. Submitted work must measure "12X16" or larger before framing. All work must be matted, framed and wired. Studio or gallery wrapped canvases are acceptable. Pastels: under glass.

REGISTRATION DEADLINE: SEPTEMBER 5, 2021, 3:00 pm

Fully completed Entry Forms MUST be delivered to the Club House 4 Art Studio information table by this date and time. **No entries or substitutions will be accepted after this date and time.**

CATEGORIES

All medium work may be submitted EXCEPT photography or digital artwork so long as it is 2 dimensional. Selected entries must be suitable for public and family viewing and corporate appropriate work. Preferred are landscapes including Village and local scenes, portraits, abstracts, still life and figurative images. Members must also adhere to the "Policy & Rules for Art Shows and Exhibits" contained in the 2020 Membership Handbook.

ARTWORK VALUES

On the entry forms: Indicate the value of your painting for GRF insurance purposes; and Indicate the price if your work is for sale, otherwise indicate NFS

ENTRY FEES AND CHECK-IN

FEES: one entry \$3; two entries \$5

DELIVERY & CHECK IN: Friday, Sept. 13, 2021, 9:00 am - 11:00 am at the Laguna Woods Community Center – back door.

FINAL CHECK IN & PICK UP: All artists must check back THAT SAME DAY between the hours of 1:00 pm and 3:00 pm to sign a release form for selected works OR to pick up non-selected works.

SELECTION

This will be a juried show with selections being made by three designated members of the Laguna Woods "General Management Office with input from two members of LWAA. There is no guarantee that any of an artist's submissions will be selected for this show. As the Exhibit is sponsored by the Village General Management Office, in conjunction with the LWAA, our sponsor's preferences carry the greatest weight.

ENTRY PICK UP AT END OF SHOW

Calendar a day one year from the date of the opening of the show, namely September 20, 2022, as the day to pick up your artwork at the conclusion of the Exhibition. You will receive an email notice of the particulars. Artwork not picked up as here indicated will be considered abandoned and disposed of at the Chair's discretion.

SALES

If your artwork is sold and Buyer wishes to take possession of same, notify the chairperson for removal arrangements. A replacement painting may be submitted and juried in like manner with no additional entry fee.

More Printing Making Information

About the Press: The press is easy to work and is suitable for etching, collagraphy, unmounted linoleum block printing, and embossing. It's perfect for smaller prints and greeting cards. The Blick Econo Etch Model II is a simple, direct-drive press that features solid steel rollers. Total clearance without blanket is 0.95" (23 mm). Two gauges, micro and super micro, allow for precise leveling of the press rollers.

Experienced individuals who wish to use the Printing Machine must take the August 14th class with Christine or make special arrangements with her at christinekelly199@gmail.com in order to be qualified.

Steel bed plate measures 11-11/16" wide x 19-3/4"long (9-1/2" x 18" recommended max print size)
