

NvFRW Regents Standing Rules – Revised 4/7/17

Mission Statement:

The mission of the NvFRW Regent Program is to provide a separate source of funding to educate NvFRW members by providing political education materials, campaign management schools and training workshops, or by assisting with the cost of such seminars, schools and workshops, and to support affiliated Republican organizations with their goal of educating their members and electing Republicans to local and state offices. These standing rules must not conflict with NFRW or NvFRW Bylaws. The NvFRW Regents shall be a self-sufficient program under the direction of the NvFRW. Membership in the Regent program is open to any registered Republican, whether a member of NvFRW or not, however, non-NvFRW members do not have voting rights. The following guidelines shall apply.

1. Leadership Training: The Regents program pays for room rental, course and resource materials, speaker fees and expenses, members' lunches, and travel expenses for the Regent Chair, or, in the event there are co-chairs, expenses for the co-chair representing the area in which the leadership training is held. Any speaker's fee greater than \$1000.00 must be approved under Rule #6.
2. Campaign Management Schools: Regents program grants fee assistance for interested NvFRW members or Regents.
3. Grants: Regents grants to cover some expenses may be awarded to NvFRW members attending other NvFRW sanctioned training and educational programs. Grant request forms may be obtained from a Regents chairman.
4. Regent Meetings and Receptions: Regent business meetings are open to paid Regents only. Regent receptions held at NvFRW Board of Directors meetings and at the biennial convention are open to paid Regents. Guests may attend with a payment of 25% of current Regents dues. This admission fee may be applied to Regents membership if the participant joins at the reception.
5. Other Regent Expenses: Other annual disbursements shall be limited to the purchase of pins, postage, Regent Co-Chair travel and cost of attending club meetings within her jurisdiction to promote the Regents program.
6. Special Circumstance Expenses: From time to time other expenses related to the education and training of Republican women may be recommended for approval by a majority vote of the current Regent membership.

7. Donations to NvFRW General Fund: Upon approval by the Regents and the availability of funds, a transfer of funds may be made to the NvFRW Operating Budget. If the funds are not used for a function related to the Regents' stated purposes and goals of education and training of NvFRW members, they must be repaid to the Regents account when the NvFRW Operating Fund is financially able to do so.
8. Regent Voting: Regent voting may be done at Regent meetings during the Spring and Fall NvFRW Board of Directors/General Membership Meetings and the Biennial convention or via phone or e-mail vote in the interim.
