

# Glenn Iddings

Glenn R. Iddings, 64, Chandler Township, died Wednesday, April 10, 1991, at his home of an apparent heart attack.

He was born May 2, 1926 in Bradford, Pa., son of Ruth (Lafher) Iddings and the late Glenn Iddings Sr.

He married Donna Walker on Aug. 15, 1945 in Pennsylvania. She preceded him in death Sept. 15, 1970.

He married Florence (Lutat) Bouck on Nov. 6, 1971 in Elkton.

He moved from Pennsylvania to Huron County in 1951 and settled in the Elkton area in 1965.
