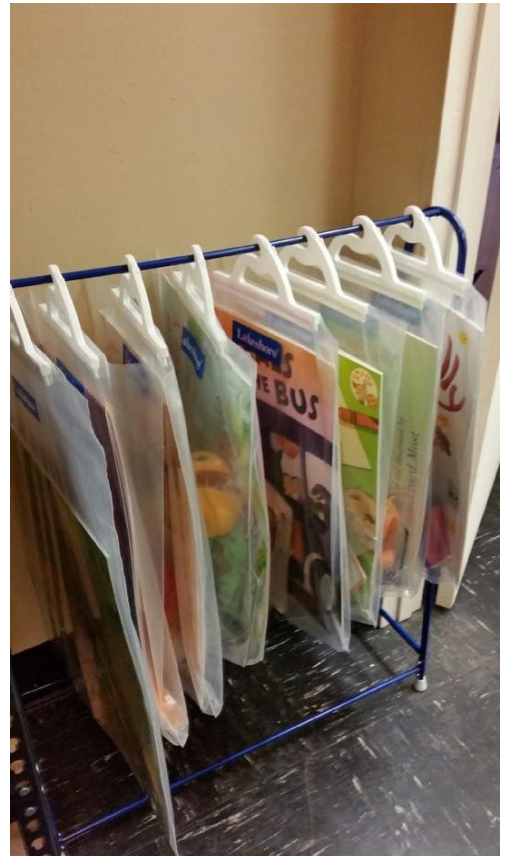

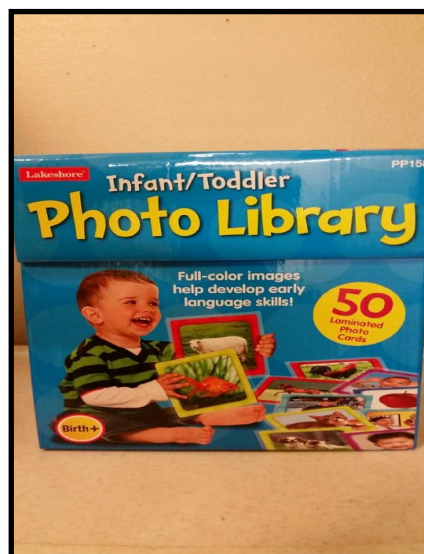
WHAT YOU NEED TO KNOW NOW: This new Lending Library section is located at the GPCCRR Resource Room in Elgin. Beginning August 1st, these materials can be checked out 1box/book set per teacher or provider for up to 30 days at time. You may check out items in person, through email or by mailing in the Resource Request Form located on our website (link below). We will mail or deliver the requested items to you at no charge. Returning them is your responsibility. A new library catalog is currently being created to include this new section of items as well as including the many new resource books & DVDs we've added during the past year. During this first year, while we are building our selection of Educational Equipment, there will be **NO CHARGE** for borrowing these items.

WHAT YOU NEED TO KNOW FOR THE FUTURE: The fee policy (free this year) will be revisited next year and a policy adopted that may result in a nominal fee (less than \$20 annually) for membership. Future fees would cover replacement & maintenance of equipment. Memberships would include an unlimited number of items checked out annually. (Tulsa R&R charges \$40 per annual membership & OKC charges \$25 per annual membership.) This is just the beginning for our Educational Equipment section, new items will be added each month and featured on our Facebook & Pinterest pages. 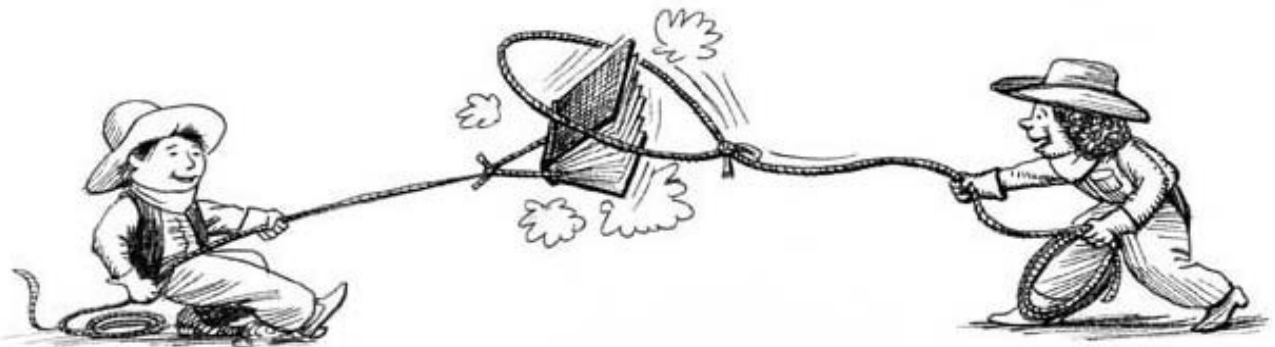

Disaster Survivor Assistance Teams

Visit Oklahoma Neighborhoods

Oklahoma City – People in Oklahoma who’ve been affected by the recent severe storms and flooding may soon see Disaster Survivor Assistance (DSA) teams in neighborhoods, knocking on doors.

The Oklahoma Department of Emergency Management (OEM) and the Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA) are partnering to provide this mobile resource to help connect homeowners, business owners and faith-based and community organizations with the necessary resources to start the recovery process.

“It’s great to have DSA teams out in the communities where they can help connect the dots between survivors and assistance that may be available for them,” said State Coordinating Officer and OEM Deputy Director Michelann Ooten.

The teams offer survivors registration assistance; up-to-date information on their application status; on-the-spot needs assessment; and referrals to help fill any outstanding needs.

“These teams are here to help,” said Federal Coordinating Officer John Long.

“They will all be carrying FEMA badges and may ask for some critical information to help speed your case along.”

The DSA teams may request the following information:

- A phone number where you can be reached;
- Your social security number;
- Your current mailing address;
- The address of the affected property;
- A brief description of the damages; and
- Insurance information including your policy number.

DSA teams are currently visiting neighborhoods and businesses in Cleveland, Grady and Oklahoma counties.

When DSA teams arrive at a home, business or any other organization, they will display official photo identification. If the photo identification is not displayed, it is important to ask to see it. This helps prevent fraudulent activities.

Additionally, survivors can apply for state and federal assistance online at www.DisasterAssistance.gov or via smartphone or web-enabled device at m.fema.gov. People may also call 800-621-3362 or (TTY) 800-462-7585 from 6 a.m. to 9 p.m. Those who use 711-Relay or Video Relay Services can call 800-621-3362.

Classroom Tips to Decrease or Prevent Biting and Other Challenging Behaviors

Adapted from No Biting: Policy and Practice for Toddler Programs: G. Kennell, Readleaf Press, 2002

Provide a Supportive Environment

- Have duplicates of new/popular toys to reduce frustration.
- Keep popular toys available, but avoid over stimulation by making sure all the toys aren't available to the children at once.
- Rotate toys, storing some away for a while, and then bringing them back out. This also keeps children interested in the environment.
- Provide small, private spaces where children can go to feel alone. Remember supervision is important so make sure the child can still be seen and heard.
- Toddlers are working on understanding spatial relationships; that's why they like to try fitting themselves into small spaces. Spaces under lofts, tables, or in shelving units are usually popular.
- Provide several soft areas in the room. Use pillows, rugs, and comfortable upholstered furniture to provide coziness.
- Have safe materials visible and available to children at the children's level so they can use them without an adult having to get them.
- Create a variety of activity centers to discourage toddlers from bunching up in one area. Children often want to go where the adults are, so adults will need to spread themselves throughout the space.
- Keep some of the activity areas and materials that the toddlers find most interesting, available throughout the day.

Provide a Consistent, Flexible Schedule

- Keep the daily schedule consistent, so it is predictable for children. Being able to predict what will come next is empowering for children.
- Simply the daily routine, so children aren't asked to transition from one activity to the next too often.
- Allow for flexibility to meet children's individual needs.
- Children need to eat when they are hungry and sleep when they are tired, regardless of whether it's snack or naptime.
- Talk about unavoidable changes in the schedule and be understanding of children's reactions to them.
- Provide several times each day for children to go outside.
- Take the time to go through the daily routine calmly and don't rush children through activities or routines.
- Keep waiting to a minimum.
- Most teachers are surprised when they learn how long children are actually waiting between activities. Try asking an objective person to observe your program and keep track of actual waiting time in minutes. To put waiting time into perspective, take the number of minutes toddlers must wait, put a zero at the end of it, and reflect on how you would react to the waiting time in that situation. For example, if the actual waiting time between an activity and lunch is seven minutes, consider how you would respond to a seventy minute wait in a similar situation. Also remember, you would be expected to be still, be quiet, and "be good" during those seventy minutes.
- Offer the same thing over and over, so that children have many opportunities to experiment.

Classroom Tips to Decrease or Prevent Biting and Other Challenging Behaviors Continued...

Provide a Variety of Sensory Activities and Materials

- Provide a wide variety of soothing materials and activities.
- Scarves and dress-up materials that are soft and silky.
- Painting and play dough, daily
- Sand and water table, at least several times a week (individual basins can be used if your program doesn't have a sand and water table)
- Provide many cause and effect toys that toddlers can act upon to make them "do something".
- Musical instruments, busy boxes, pounding boards, jack in the boxes, etc/
- Provide opportunities for toddlers to put collections of small, choking safe objects (clothespins, jar lids, juice can lids, etc.) in containers to carry and dump out.
- Instead of planning teacher-directed activities, offer interesting materials and experiences. Observe the children's reactions to the materials then plan how to further their interest. Offer the same thing over and over, so that children have many opportunities to experiment.
- Offer adult-initiated activities that are spontaneous, short, and optional, such as songs, stories, and finger plays.
- Do not expect toddlers to have formal circle time or to sit in whole group activities.

Provide Gentle and Empathetic Interactions

- Show children what empathy looks and sounds like; model it in your interactions with them.
- Respond positively to children.
- Help children to identify and name their feelings. Say things such as, "Mark, you look sad to me. Are you feeling sad right now?" or, "Robin, you look frustrated to me. You really wanted to play with truck, and Sarah has it."
- Show and tell children how to use language to express feelings and state their needs and wants. Say things such as, Robin, you can tell Sarah, 'my turn next' that way she knows you are waiting for the truck."
- Encourage children to comfort themselves by using transitional items such as stuffed animals or blankets brought from home.
- Comfort children with soothing voice tones and physical actions such as hugs, a thoughtful hand on a child's shoulder, etc.
- Help children fix mistakes. For example, if a child looks genuinely upset that she hurt another, you can say, "Sammy, you look upset that Lonetta is crying. I wonder if she'd like a hug? " Other possible ways to fix a mistake; helping to rebuild a knocked down tower, fetching ice for a bite, or saying you're sorry (if this is genuine and comes from the child's own feelings, not as an adult-imposed formula).
- Give attention in a generous and genuine manner.

Despite even the best prevention efforts of the best caregivers, biting and other challenging behaviors still happen. When it does occur, caregivers must be prepared to respond appropriately and effectively and be willing to ask for help when necessary. 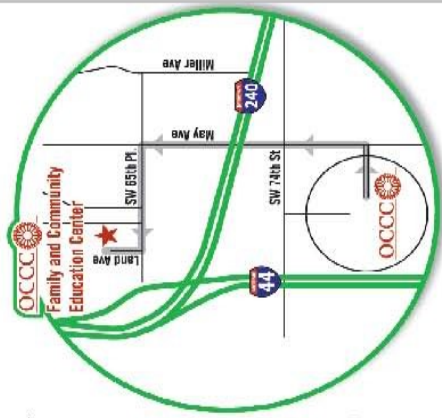

Applications are now being accepted through
July 31, 2015 for the Early Childhood
Association of Oklahoma Scholarship.

The Early Childhood Association of Oklahoma provides scholarships to students enrolled in an Oklahoma institution of higher education and majoring in early childhood education or family and child development.

The student must be a sophomore, junior, senior or graduate level student. Scholarships are provided in varying amounts not to exceed \$1500 on an annual basis. Funds are managed by the Oklahoma City Community Foundation (OCCF). In general, two scholarships are awarded on an annual basis to students enrolled in an Oklahoma institution of higher education in early childhood education, child development or a related field and employed early childhood care/family services to include family child care homes. They must have demonstrated an active concern for the well-being of young children and have contributed in an exceptional way to the profession.

Did you Know?

Did you know that DHS offers a higher special needs reimbursement rate to contracted child care providers who care for a child with disabilities? To meet the DHS definition of a child with disabilities, the child must participate in one of the following programs: SoonerStart (IFSP required), Special Education Services (IEP required), or Supplemental Security Income (Health Professional's statement required if the child doesn't participate in SoonerStart or Special Education services).

Recently the process for approval of the special needs rate has changed. Child care providers can now initiate the process by accessing the revised form 08AD006E Certification for Special Needs Rate for Licensed Child Care Homes and Centers on the Provider Web at <https://www.ebt.acs-inc.com/ecc>.

Parents or guardians will no longer need to contact their DHS workers to begin the process. This simplified process should make it easier for more qualified children to be approved for the special needs rate and more providers to receive the higher reimbursement.

Have you done this? - Policy Reminders for the Oklahoma Professional Development Registry (OPDR)

Child Care Center programs at 1+ or higher must be registered as a direct care organization with the OPDR.

Family Child Care Home and Child Care Center program staff that are counted in staff to child ratio must have a current Professional Development Ladder Certificate (PDL) within 12 months of employment or by PDL expiration.

Directors of a center must have a current Oklahoma Director's Credential (ODC).

One star programs CAN join the OPDR and assist in monitoring and maintaining their training records (R&R highly recommends this, it really is a good thing!)

Additional Info You May Not Be Aware Of:

Some providers (several actually) assume that because they have received the ID and password they are registered. There are ADDITIONAL steps in the individual application process, including personal info, verification of education, employment history, \$10 enrollment fee and submitting the participant agreement.

Staff of facilities MUST register individually with the OPDR.

Staff need to attach themselves to the child care program so that they appear on the direct care organizations report and MUST then be verified by the director or owner. (many are forgetting to do this step)

HOMEMADE BUBBLE MAKER



To make a homemade bubble maker take an empty plastic water bottle and cut the bottom off. Then use a piece terry cloth fabric and fasten it with a rubber band around the bottom of the bottle. We had some old baby wash-cloths here that were perfect for this.

That is it, your homemade bubble maker is complete. Now pour 1/4 cup of dish soap and an 1/8 cup water into a small container and gently mix. These amounts can be varied to get the results you want.

After you have dipped the end of the bottle into the soap solution blow into the mouth of the bottle. You can create a long snake of bubbles by blowing with a slow gentle stream of air. Huge warning, make sure you warn your kids not to inhale or they will get a mouthful of bubbles!!
