- Step Two: To reserve your seat, complete the <u>Workshop Registration Form</u> on the CHQ website under the <u>Program Workshops and Event Calendar</u> section. Once you have registered you can submit your payment for the workshop. Your registration is not complete until your payment is received.

There are several payment options:



Quilt Examples for Quilts of Valor





Courage Block 12 1/2" Unfinished Fabrics & Cutting: SCRAP IT UP!

White: (2) 5" squares, draw a diagonal line on wrong side

(2) 3" squares - draw diagonal line on wrong side

(8) 2 1/2" x 4 1/2"

BLUE: (2) 5" squares

(8) 2 1/2" squares - draw diagonal line on wrong side

RED: (2) 3" squares

(8) 2 1/2" squares - draw a diagonal line on wrong side *Sewing Instructions:*

Make Half Square Triangles (HST) by placing (1) 3" WHITE square on top of (1) 3" RED square, right sides together. Stitch 1/4" on each side of line. Cut apart on line, and press to Red.

Make Half Square Triangles (HST) by placing (1) 5" WHITE square on top of (1) BLUE square, right sides together. Stitch 1/4" on each side of line. Cut apart on line, and press to Blue.

Square up to 2 1/2"





Make 4

Square up to 4 1/2"







Make 4

Place (1) 2 1/2" RED square on one end (1) 2 1/2" x 4 1/2" WHITE strip, as shown. Sew on line. Cut 1/4" seam allowance, and flip back and press.

Repeat process on opposite end of 2 1/2" x 4 1/2" strip, using (1) 2 1/2" BLUE square, being careful of placement. Flip back and press.








Repeat above process, but reversing direction of sewn 2 1/2" square, as shown:











Assemble your quad unit as shown:






Make 4

Assemble your block using (4) Quad units, rotating until unit is as shown below.






Your block should measure 12 1/2" Unfinished

Here is what a finished quilt (62x62) might look like - using 16 blocks, with a 2"(unfinished) inner border, and a 5 1/2" (unfinished) border:



Repeat above process, but reversing direction of sewn 2 1/2" square, as shown:



Finishes 64 ½" x 80 ½"

Delbert's Glory QOV

Red – 1 5/8 yards

- 1. Cut 1 strip 9". Cut into 3 squares 9".
- 2. Cut 2 strips 8 ½". Cut into 8 Squares 8 ½".
- 3. Cut 2 strips 5 ½". Cut 13 squares 5 ½".
- 4. Cut 5 strips 2 ½". Cut into 52 squares 2 ½".

White – 2 ¾ yards

- 1. Cut 1 strip 9". Cut into 3 squares 9".
- 2. Cut 6 strips 7". Cut into 26 squares 7".
- 3. Cut 4 strips 4 ½". Cut into 26 squares 4 ½".
- 4. Cut 7 strips 2 ½" for 1st border.

Blue - 3 1/2 yards

- 1. Cut 2 strips 8 ½". Cut into 8 squares 8 ½".
- 2. Cut 2 strips 5 1/2". Cut into 13 squares 5 1/2".
- 3. Cut 5 strips 2 1/2". Cut into 52 squares 2 1/2".
- 4. Cut 8 strips 6 ½" for 2nd border.
- 5. Cut 8 strips 2 1/4" for binding.

Backing

72" x 88" piece or 5 yards (2 pieces 2 ½ yards x 2)

Sewing Instructions

- 1. Make flying geese with 13 white squares 7" and 13 blue squares 5 ½".
 - a. Draw a diagonal line corner to corner on back of blue squares.
 - b. Place the blue square rights sides together with the 7" white squares. They will be placed in center with \(^3\)4" of white showing on all sides.
 - c. Sew scant 1/4" on both sides of line.
 - d. Cut apart on line. Press to white.
 - e. Place squares right sides together to match the sides, not the center. Match blue to white side and white side to blue.

There will be sticky out corner points and the seam line you sewed will not match in the middle.

- f. Draw a diagonal line corner to corner the opposite way the seams are already sewn. Sew on both sides of line with scant ¼" seam allowance.
- g. After sewn, cut apart on marked line.
- h. After cut apart, before you do anything else, fold in half along seam line and clip to the seam line. This allows you to press each side to the sky portion (white) of the flying geese, or what was the original 7" square.
- i. After you have pressed to the white side, cut your flying geese units to $2\frac{1}{2}$ " x $4\frac{1}{2}$ ". They will finish 2" x 4" when sewn in quilt.

2. Take the flying geese units and with the matching 4 ½" white squares and the matching blue 2 ½" squares and make 13 sawtooth stars. It will measure 8 ½" x 8 ½".



Need 13

- 3. Make flying geese with 13 white squares 7" and 13 red squares $5\frac{1}{2}$ ".
 - j. Draw a diagonal line corner to corner on back of red squares.
 - k. Place the red square rights sides together with the 7" white squares. They will be placed in center with 34" of white showing on all sides.
 - I. Sew scant ¼" on both sides of line.
 - m. Cut apart on line. Press to white.
 - n. Place squares right sides together to match the sides, not the center. Match red to white side and white side to red.

There will be sticky out corner points and the seam line you sewed will not match in the middle.

- o. Draw a diagonal line corner to corner the opposite way the seams are already sewn. Sew on both sides of line with scant 1/4" seam allowance.
- p. After sewn, cut apart on marked line.
- q. After cut apart, before you do anything else, fold in half along seam line and clip to the seam line. This allows you to press each side to the sky portion (white) of the flying geese, or what was the original 7" square.
- r. After you have pressed to the white side, cut your flying geese units to $2\frac{1}{2}$ " x $4\frac{1}{2}$ ". They will finish 2" x 4" when sewn in quilt.
- 4. Take the flying geese units and with the matching 4 ½" white squares and the matching red 2 ½" squares and make 13 sawtooth stars. It will measure 8 ½" x 8 ½".



Need 13

- 5. With the 3 white 9" squares and the 3 9" red squares.
 - a. Mark the back of the 3 white 9" square diagonally corner to corner. Place right sides together with the red 9" squares. Sew on both sides with scant ¼" seam allowance. Cut apart on marked line.
 - b. Press to red. Trim to 8 ½" to make 6 half square triangle squares 8 ½: x 8 ½"



Need 6

Now start assembling the rows of the quilt. Each row should measure 8 $\frac{1}{2}$ " x 48 $\frac{1}{2}$ " when complete.



- 14. After all the rows are assembled, sew the rows together to complete the quilt top center. The center section of the quilt should measure $48 \frac{1}{2}$ " x $64 \frac{1}{2}$ ".
- 15. Sew together 2 of the white 2 $\frac{1}{2}$ " strips for each of the sides and 1 $\frac{1}{2}$ of the 2 $\frac{1}{2}$ " strips for the top and bottom of the quilt. Press.
 - a. Cut the side border pieces cut to 2 ½" x 64 ½". Sew onto sides. Press to border.
 - b. Cut the top and bottom border pieces to 2 ½" x 52 ½", Sew to top and bottom. Press to border.
- 16. Sew together 2 of the 6 $\frac{1}{2}$ " blue border strips for each of the sides and top and bottom of the quilt. Press.
 - a. Cut the side border pieces to 6 ½" x 68 ½". Sew onto sides. Press to blue border.
 - b. Cut the top and bottom to 6 $\frac{1}{2}$ " x 64 $\frac{1}{2}$ ". Sew onto top and bottom. Press to blue border.
- 17. Sew binding pieces together in one long strip. Add together on 45 degree angle and press open. After sewn, pressed at seams, and trimmed, fold in half lengthwise and press. Binding is now ready to be sewn on when quilt has been quilted.

Liberty block 15" finished

Cutting Instructions:

Red..... (5) 3 1/2" squares

(8) 3 1/2" squares - draw a diagonal line on wrong side

White.....(4) 3 1/2" squares

Blue.....(4) 3 1/2" x 9 1/2"

(4) 3 1/2" squares

Sewing Instructions:


Sew 3 1/2" RED and WHITE squares together to make a 9-patch, as shown:




Your 9-patch should measure 9 1/2"

Make 1

Place (1) 3 1/2" square on each corner of (1) 3 1/2" x 9 1/2" BLUE strip, being careful of placement as shown. Sew on line. Cut 1/4" seam allowance, flip back, and press.




Sew blue 3 1/2" squares to both sides of the top and bottom 9 1/2" finish strips from above. Assemble your block as shown:



Fabric	Placement	Amount
Light blue	Background & plain columns	1 3/4 yards
Dark blue	Star points	2/3 yard
Red	Star centers & border corners	1/2 yard
White	Star ribbon	1 1/4 yards
Blue/white Stars	Border	1 1/3 yards
Binding		5/8 yard
Backing		3 3/4 yards



Please read through ALL instructions before beginning this project.

- All seams are made with a 1/4" seam allowance unless otherwise noted.
- WOF = width of fabric LOF = length of fabric
- RST = right sides together
- HST = half square triangle



Important Notes

- All half-square triangle units are made 8-at-a-time, over-sized and then trimmed to exact size.
- I normally press seams to the side and I've given instructions for that in most of the steps; however, you may want to press all seams open to reduce bulk.

Cutting Instructions

Light blue:

- (2) 6 1/2" x LOF strips (approx. 64" and CUT PARALLEL TO THE SELVAGE)
- Cut the remaining fabric into (8) 10" x 10" (A) squares (Ribbon Star HST's)

Dark blue:

• (2) 10" x WOF strips; sub-cut into (8) 10" x 10" (B) squares (Ribbon Star HST's)

White:

(4) 10" x WOF strips; sub-cut into (16) 10" x 10" (C) squares (Ribbon Star HST's)

Red:

- (2) 4 1/2" x WOF strips; sub-cut into (15) 4 1/2" x 4 1/2" (D) squares (Ribbon Star center)
- (1) 6 1/2" x WOF strip; sub-cut into (4) 6 1/2" x 6 1/2" (E) squares (border corner squares)


Blue/white stars:

• (7) 6 1/2" x WOF strips (borders)

Ribbon Stars

Make the half square triangle units (HST's). Each ribbon star requires four light blue/white HST's and four dark blue/white HST's. You will be making a total of 60 HST's for each color combination.

- 1. On the wrong side of each 10" white (C) square, draw a diagonal line from corner to corner in both directions forming an "X". Then draw a horizontal and vertical line through the center (at 5"). (Figure 1)
- 2. Place a marked white (C) square, right sides together with a light blue 10" (A) square. Stitch 1/4" on both sides of the diagonal lines. (Figure 2)
- 3. Cut apart on the horizontal and vertical lines and the marked diagonal lines. (Figure 3)
- 4. Press towards the light blue.
- 5. Trim each HST to 4 1/2" square. (Figure 4) Repeat to make 60 light blue/white HST's. You will have 4 leftover.



6. Using the remaining 10" white (C) squares and the 10" dark blue (B) squares, repeat steps 1 thru 3. Press towards the dark blue and trim to 4 1/2" square. (Figure 5) Make 60 dark blue/white HST's. You will have 4 leftover.




Ribbon star assembly

- 7. Arrange the half-square triangles, and center red 4 1/2" (D) square as shown. (Figure 6)
- 8. Sew the units together into rows and press following the pressing arrows. (Figure 6)
- 9. Sew the rows together to form the Ribbon Star. Press row seams open to reduce bulk or to the side. It should measure 12 1/2" square. (Figure 7)



10. Make 15 Ribbon Star blocks.

Quilt top assembly

- Join 5 Ribbon Star blocks to form a column. Press seams open. Make three Ribbon Star columns. (Figure 8)
- 12. Measure the length of the columns and cut both of the 6 1/2" wide light blue strips to that length. It should measure approximately 60 1/2" long.
- 13. Join the Ribbon Star columns to both sides of a 6 1/2" wide light blue strip to form the quilt top. Press towards the light blue column. (Figure 8)

Add borders

- 14. Join the 6 1/2" x WOF borders trips together to form one long piece.
- 15. Measure the length of the quilt top and cut two strips to that measurement for the side borders.
- 16. Measure the width of the quilt top and cut two border strips to that measurement for the top and bottom pieced border.
- 17. Sew the side border strips to each side of the quilt top. (Figure 9)
- 18. Sew a 6 1/2" red E square to each end of the top and bottom border strips. Press towards the border strip. (Figure 9)
- 19. Sew the pieced top and bottom border strips to the quilt top. (Figure 9)

Finishing

- 20. Baste the backing, batting and quilt top.
- 21. Quilt as desired. Straight lines connecting the ribbons of the stars is easy and effective. (Figure 10)
- 22. Bind using your favorite method.
- 23. Don't forget a label!





Board Meeting Minutes January 2025

CHQ Board Meeting Minutes January 17, 2025

In Attendance: Lysa Martinelli, Kerry Cogen, Cheryl Dennis, Barbara Fusco, Cass Garner, Cathie Giambalvo, Gina Krejsa, Sara Mlynarchek and Donna Slovak.

Lysa called the meeting to order at 7:00 PM.

December Board Minutes: Cathie made a correction to the membership notes to state that members who do not renew by the end of January will not receive the February newsletter. Cheryl will amend the minutes. Gina made a motion to approve the amended minutes and Kerry seconded the motion. Approved unanimously by 8 board members.

Old Business:

2025 & 2026 Executive Board Election Results.

At the November 2024 Guild meeting the Nominating Committee presented the slate of officers for the 2025 and 2026 years. The slate was approved by a vote of the guild members in attendance.

Elected were:

- President Lysa Martinelli
- 2nd Vice President Kerry Cogen
- Secretary Donna Slovak
- Treasurer Patty Gertz
- 1st Vice President Barbara Fusco moved up to 1st Vice President for 2025 from 2nd Vice President as per the guild bylaws.

Board/Committee Status:

President: Lysa Martinelli

- New committee Chairs were presented, Cathie Giambalvo to Web and Sara Mlynarchek to Membership. Barbara made a motion to approve the new Chairs and Kerry seconded. Approved unanimously.
- Open Committee Chair positions were discussed for Hospitality, 4H, Boutique and Raffle Sales. A Hospitality Chair should be in place by the March in-person meeting. Lysa mentioned that occasionally in the past the position has rotated between individuals on a short term basis, which is a possibility. A 4H Chair will be needed before June. Barbara stated that the Hunterdon Quilting Guild contacted her regarding the ribbon order for the fair and she is expecting more details from them about that. Cathie mentioned that there is quite a bit of prep

work that needs to be done by a chairperson prior to a full 4H meeting, such as advertising and promotion. Barbara stated that she has a to-do list ready. CHQ is responsible for hanging the quilts this year at the fair. Boutique Chair and Raffle Chair are currently on hold.

Lysa shared a document* created 2 years ago about CHQ roles and
responsibilities. She highlighted the fact that most members who previously held
positions are available to mentor the people new to the role. Kerry asked for
clarification on committee money in the budget coming to the board for review.
Gina confirmed that committee chairs have discretion in the use of their budgeted
funds unless it is an out of the ordinary expense. See attached.

Lysa stated that the CHQ shared Google drive has a wealth of information available to board members especially those that are new to their roles.

- In December the CHQ website was down and users were receiving error messages. The platform certification had expired and Lysa approved a temporary patch to be installed at the cost of \$139.98 which will function until December 2025. Cheryl asked if, for future reference, an emergency email could be sent to board members to approve a decision that needed an immediate response. A new CHQ website will need to be created. Lysa and Cathie are currently looking into possible new platform options. Cathie welcomed suggestions and stressed the need to have a site with payment options that produce invoices. Gina made a motion to approve adding an additional \$110 to the December budget proposal for 2025. Kerry seconded the motion. Approved unanimously. Each Committee Chair will need to review the information that is included on the current CHQ website and recommend any changes and updates necessary. It was mentioned that currently the name on the account for the Treasurer ID cannot be changed when a new individual takes the role. Research will be done to address this on the new website.
- January and February calendars were reviewed with one correction made the storage unit rent is due on the 15th of each month, not the third Thursday of the month.
- Cass suggested as part of the previous library committee, that the rulers remain available to members. Barbara may use them for a future program activity. They could also be sold at the summer auction.

 Lysa suggested moving the CHQ Board zoom meetings to Thursdays at 7:00 PM instead of Fridays. All agreed. She will finalize the specific dates for 2025 to be included on the CHQ website.

Treasurer: Patty Gertz – (Not present)

Kerry reported that as of December all the accounts look good. The right time to
move money out of the raffle account is to be determined. Donna mentioned that
the last Hospitality expenses of \$61.10 for the holiday party did not show on the
report. Kerry will amend the report.

1st Vice President/Program: Barbara Fusco

Barbara stated that the January workshop with Rachel Derstine is full with 20
people signed up to attend remotely via Zoom. Rachel will also be the guest
speaker at the evening member meeting via Zoom.

2nd Vice President: Kerry Cogen:

Archivist: Gina Krejsa

Lysa called the meeting to order at 7:00PM. Zoom recording started.

January Board Meeting Minutes A motion was made by Jan to approve the January Board minutes, Barbara seconded. Minutes approved by 8 members with 1 abstention.
