Regular Council Meeting March 13th, 2013

The March 13th, 2013 Council Meeting was called to order with the Pledge of Allegiance by Mayor Steven Rockwell.

Roll call: Barber, Basterash, Fox, Maloney, Weilnau and Wolf. Also present-Fiscal Officer Mary Bruno, Administrator Kevin Ackerman and Solicitor Vickie Ruffing.

Motion by Barber, seconded by Fox to approve the Minutes of the February 27th, 2013 Council Meeting. Vote-all yeas, motion carried.

Motion by Basterash, seconded by Barber to approve the Council Bills for March 13th, 2013 in the amount of \$8,866.93. Vote-all yeas, motion carried.

Motion by Fox, seconded by Barber to approve the Utility Bills for February 27th, 2013 in the amount of \$13,155.13. Vote-all yeas, motion carried.

OLD COMMITTEE BUSINESS

Street, Sidewalks and Storm Sewers-The width on Wilcoxson Street from Main to Liberty Streets during the resurfacing project will be 15 ½ feet.

Also during the Wilcoxson Street resurfacing project, the sidewalks from Main Street to Huron Street will be 4 feet. The sidewalks from Huron to Liberty Streets will remain the same at 3 feet.

The Administrator again questioned the wording of the sidewalk ordinance. He stated it does not state the Village is responsible for sidewalks, it states it is the responsibility of the Street Superintendent. Maloney said that sentence puts the responsibility on the Village. Several sections of the sidewalk ordinance were eliminated in 2009, and at that time the ordinance did not specify residents were responsible for their sidewalks, therefore, a

change in responsibility isn't clear. All sidewalks, residential or business will be treated the same, as a responsibility of the Village.

Letters were sent out to 17 E. Front Street residents asking for their opinion on whether parking spots should be paved where there is currently stone in front of their homes. The majority of letters returned stated stone was preferred over paving.

The Street Superintendent will look at the streets around the fire station.
