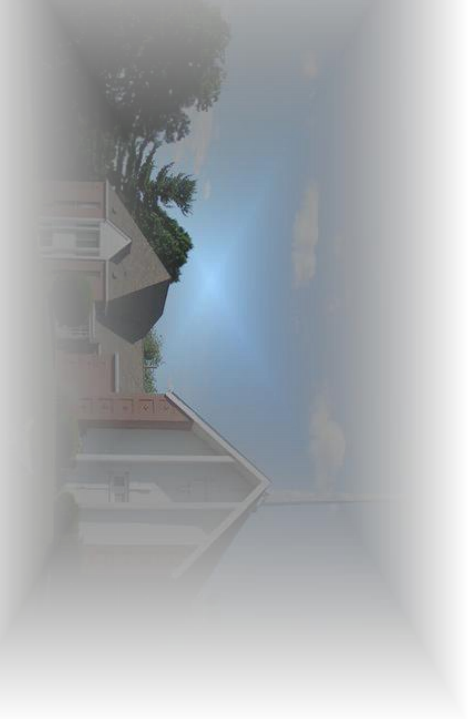

Pastor's Corner

It's EASTER! Some of you reading this (after April 5th) are thinking, "Not anymore." And some of you reading this know exactly what I'm about to say (because I've said it before) – "Yes, it's STILL Easter!" 1) Easter isn't a single "day" – Easter Sunday is the day we recognize the turning point for all creation when Jesus rose from the dead. *But every Sunday is a little Easter* because the risen Lord is alive as ever. 2) To emphasize this, the early Church made Easter a *season* (kind of like Lent) to let the power and impact of Christ's victory take deep root. It lasts for 50 days up to Pentecost. Jesus tells us to spend these days not waiting passively, but praying in the power of his resurrection. In light of that, for people to come on Easter Sunday, but not come back to worship on the 2nd Sunday of Easter ... is like one of the disciples saying, "Yeah, I know, Jesus rose from the grave, been there, done that." Hopefully you see the *absurdity* of that perspective. If Jesus is alive, and you know it, things never go "back to normal."

Let me share a story from the time I visited Israel. When we went to the village of Bethany, our guides father was still one of the caretakers for that pilgrimage sight. He looked as old as the Judean hills – a short, stocky man, draped in soiled robes, standing at the entrance to Lazarus' tomb. Beneath his weathered face was a contagious smile.

His clear, piercing eyes flashed the confirmation of Easter. Proudly, he spoke of Bethany – he commented on how many sites in Israel claim to be the "exact place" Jesus did this and the "true location" where Jesus did that, when there wasn't a lot of historical evidence to support it. But he shared how there was good and reliable evidence about "this place" ... Gently he pointed to the tombs, saying, "Jesus came here and raised Lazarus. This is the place the Master said, 'I am the resurrection and the life' (John 11:25)." Think about that. If a simple steward of the site where Jesus raised a man back to life, who would one day die again, could be so moved, so affected, to *devote* his entire life to its care, with such commitment and resolve ... then how should Easter affect us? How should the ultimate defeat of death, the rising of the King, to NEVER die again, affect us? To start, we will be as fervent and zealous to share the story like that old Judean caretaker, but we will do so knowing its power to change lives, and through those lives, to change the world. So, please, don't get tired of me saying it ... Happy Easter.

From the Hearts and Hands of Session

As Puckety Church, we "***honor God***"

One of the ways we honor God is by answering his call – not just our common calling to follow Jesus as Lord, but our individual special calling with the spiritual gifts we have been given, and the roles we have been called to through the voice of the Church. The Session has begun a RightNow Media course together called "*Developing Leaders*" – which we will be engaging in over the next 5 months, with a focus on cultivating the congregational conviction that every member is called to special service in order to be a disciple-maker for Christ. One example of particular calling are the new Elders & Deacons that have been elected – to be *ordained and installed during worship on Sunday, April 12th*. We strongly encourage all our members to attend so we can recognize their special calling and affirm their leadership with appreciation.

NOTE: The Officer Orientation will be **Saturday April 25th** (9:30 AM) – and it's a great idea for former elders and deacons to come and give some insight to help new officers – the more people who come and contribute, the more helpful the training will be for those attending. For reference, if veteran officers want to attend to sharpen up, the Deacons portion starts at 9:30, and the Elders portion starts at 10:30 AM (their will be joint board information in the middle of the training).

As Puckety Church, we "***grow in faith.***"

We continue to want to let you all know about the LIFE that is happening in our small groups. The Sunday Women's Small Group just finished *The Chosen* (S5: The Last Supper) – perfect timing in how it was aligned with the events of Holy Week. 3 small groups are now awaiting season 6 (the events of Good Friday & the cross) but since that will be in 2027, we are focusing in on other things. The Monday Men's Group have been studying what happens after death (another tip of the hat in terms of timing with the crucifixion and Easter!) The Monday evening group is finishing up Season 2 of *The Chosen* – *ask Jake & Suzie McCann what they're doing next!*

Maria and Rod Schafer were able to begin "Every Thought Captive" – and did 3 sessions in their home. Discussions included ways we can shut out the mindset of "the World" and focus on our relationship with our God. Since small group members had trouble due to illness & schedule conflicts, they pivoted to doing a kind of more "hands on" mission to visit Jack and Lois Barnett in the wake of their recent move and transition. They are also making a donation to Origins (Try Life) for Mother's Day. They

will start again on April 13th and focus on 2nd segment on *Every Thought Captive*.

The New Member – *Discipleship Essentials* group will be finishing soon. It's possible Pastor Brian may lead a shorter RightNow Media study (Joseph in the Old Testament?) before the summer gets here – let Pastor Brian know ASAP if you're interested!

Alice Knopfel – even as she is still recovering from her knee replacement – has filled the spots for her coming “Move It!” class – you blow us away Alice! Beth Dober is leading a new group – “How to Love Your Morning” (Jennifer Dukes Lee) on Saturdays at 9 AM starting April 11th – see the fuller description elsewhere in the newsletter. The summer usually brings a break for most small groups, so ***be sure to plug into one now!***

As Puckety Church, we “***improve our community and world***”

By now, you have heard that in March we raised \$7,000 for our missionary partners at MUST. David Lian gave a report in the meantime (see Matt Wehrle if you'd like to know how to pray for the theology school, the pastors they're sending out, or the Agape House (orphan home and school). We hope to get a report from David in the summer about how the funds are being used for their stated needs. In line with that, it was approved that the VBS mission offering, collected during the week of VBS, will go to the primary students' needs at MUST – with a focus on musical instruments and music education since the biblical book focus of Rainforest Falls VBS are the Psalms of David!

More locally, we are supporting our partner, Origins family life center, by collecting baby wipes from now until ... well, Mother's Day of course! Please see the bags in the ramp hallway and join in the collection to supply this particular item which they told us is their #1 item need. Thank you.

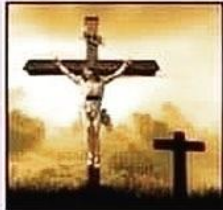
Palm Sunday

Sunday before Easter. Celebration of Jesus' triumphal entry into Jerusalem. Observed with palm branches, parades, and celebration.



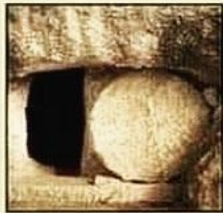
Maundy Thursday

Thursday before Easter. Commemorates the Last Supper. Often observed with foot washing, stripping of the altar, and overnight prayer vigil to keep watch with Jesus in the garden.



Good Friday

Friday before Easter. Most solemn day of the church year. Observes the day Jesus was crucified. Observed by praying the Stations of the Cross and three hours of silent prayer while Jesus was on the cross.



Holy Saturday

Saturday before Easter. Observes the day Jesus was in the tomb. This is a day of somber reflection, reflecting on what we'd miss in a world without Jesus.



Easter Sunday

Hallelujah! Christ has risen! This day we celebrate the resurrection of Jesus. Sing hallelujahs and celebrate with great joy.



Mornings for Real Humans !

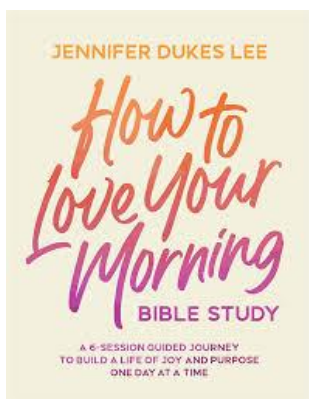
This is your invitation to design a morning that fits your real life so you can experience God's hope, peace, and new mercies every morning. Whether you already like your mornings or are allergic to them!!!

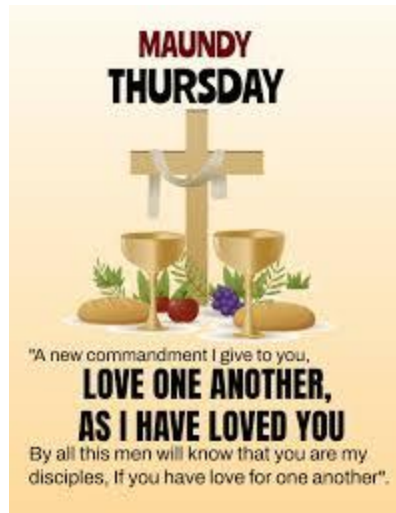

A Devotional for You – Read Luke 24:1-6 & John 20:11-20

In the original manuscripts of the New Testament scriptures (Greek on papyrus), there was *no* punctuation (*let alone verse numbers and chapter divisions – those came centuries later*). But anyone reading the Gospel accounts of the resurrection can *feel* it - like Mary in John 20 when she sees it's Jesus not the gardener and exclaims, "*Rabbi!*" or when the two disciples in Luke 24, after the Emmaus road and Jesus disappearing in front of them, ask excitedly, "Did not our hearts burn within us while he talked to us and opened the scriptures?"

I wonder what it would be like to do the opposite – meaning, if I were to ask you to describe Easter without using any words, you could only use punctuation marks, which punctuation mark would you choose ... but for THIS Easter (in 2026). Maybe this Easter is a *comma* for you. It makes you stop, pause, think, and listen, but that's about it. Perhaps this Easter is a "downer" – a big, bold period. You thought you'd feel excited, but instead it seems to be more like a ritual. You feel like you're not on the inside, but on the outside ... an onlooker.

Remember, at the start of that first day, life felt like a *period* for the first disciples. He was dead. He was buried. Full stop. An end to expectations ... But *wait* – news of an empty tomb – the period is no longer a period, it's a question mark. Well, in some ways, that could be worse than a period. Now they're beginning to doubt – sorrow is now mixed with uncertainty. Where is He? ... They're perplexed. The guards are gone (?) The stone is rolled away (?) If he's not here ... where?

An angel speaks, "Why do you seek the living One among the dead? He is not here, but has *risen*. Remember how he spoke to you ... that the Son of Man must ... be crucified and on the third day rise again?" ... Of course they remembered! The *periods* are gone (for a new beginning has replaced 'the end'). The question marks are gone (Israel's perennial question, "How long, O Lord?" has been answered). Now, there is one *massive* exclamation point! (I bet the empty cross looked like an exclamation point from the vantage point of the empty tomb in the light of rising sun – it was within a few hundred yards after all). But my point is *that's what Easter is about* – this one, that one, and every one in between: an exclamation point of *gratitude* and of praise for the resurrection of Jesus Christ. Just follow the *ellipsis* ... because if Jesus is alive ... that means death is beaten ... if death is beaten, that means the wages of my sin don't need to be collected ... if sin's power over me is conquered, I can live in joy and freedom ... and it goes on into *a thousand daily applications of love for God*, because of the salvation His victory over death has brought us. Happy Easter!!!

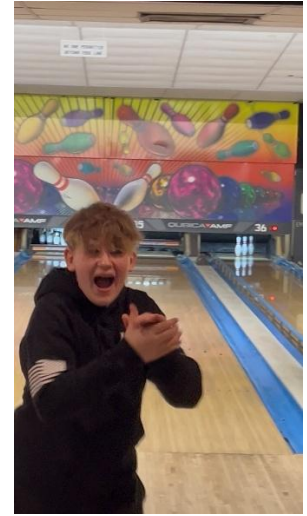

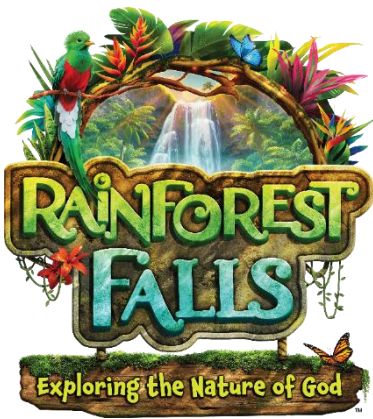

Myanmar Situation

I would like to sincerely thank you for the generous support of 6,000 USD that I recently received again. Your kindness is a great blessing to our ministries and means so much to all the projects we are carrying forward. May the Lord richly reward you for your faithfulness and partnership in advancing His Kingdom.

Myanmar's political and military landscape in March 2026 remains deeply troubled. The junta-backed Union Solidarity and Development Party (USDP) has claimed control of parliament after elections widely condemned as illegitimate. Violence continues across Sagaing, Magway, and Karen, with airstrikes and clashes causing heavy civilian casualties and mass displacement. Millions are uprooted, struggling to access food, shelter, and medical aid.

Yet even in this darkness, we hold to the truth of Psalm 46:1: "God is our refuge and strength, an ever-present help in trouble." We pray for peace, justice, and healing for Myanmar, trusting that the Lord is near to the brokenhearted and will not abandon His people.

Agape House News

We praise God that nearly all the children at Agape House have completed their final exams. Three students will finish tomorrow. While two have struggled, one has done well, and we rejoice in their perseverance. In Myanmar, only about 30% of students pass this exam each year, so we pray for strength, encouragement, and wisdom for them.

The children are now busy learning practical and creative skills: vocational training, computer basics, tennis, music, and English. It is a joy to see older children teaching the younger ones alongside outside trainers. This spirit of service reflects Galatians 6:2: "Carry each other's burdens, and in this way, you will fulfill the law of Christ."

Classes will begin again in June, and we are preparing for their needs. School Supplies Needed (June 2026 – March 2027)

We are trusting God to provide the following for 45 children:

- Umbrellas, uniforms, backpacks, lunch boxes, slippers, rulers, pens, pencils, instrument boxes, exercise books, calculators, correction pens, underpants, mosquito nets, blankets, and mattresses.
- Total cost: 10,320,000 Kyats (approx. 2,600 USD).

We believe Philippians 4:19: "And my God will meet all your needs according to the riches of His glory in Christ Jesus."

MUST School Update

Our new semester has begun, but no new students have joined yet due to the dangers of travel and restrictions in certain regions. Young people from Chin State are prevented from coming to Yangon, as armed groups demand their involvement. Transportation costs are high, and in some places, flights are the only way to reach Yangon.

We continue to pray for students from remote areas who desire to study, asking the Lord to make a way despite obstacles. We trust that God will open doors, as He promises in Isaiah 43:19: "See, I am doing a new thing! Now it springs up; do you not perceive it?"

Church Planting Projects

Our daughter churches are growing in fellowship and Bible study each week. At MUST, we are preparing to plant a new church just 20 minutes away. A small apartment has been rented for \$70 per month, and two graduates, Benjamin and KC Aung, will begin ministry there next week. We pray that those who heard the gospel years ago will be drawn back to Christ through this new work.

We are also praying over a new project near the University of Western Yangon. God has provided a small piece of land, and we hope to begin ministry before land prices rise. Three students will graduate in June or July and are preparing to lead a new Bible house there. Trusting God for Provision

We plan to start in August with a simple bamboo and wood house for worship, Bible study, and meals. We trust the Lord to provide water, shelter, and resources. Our hope is to begin small and continue praying for a permanent building in the future. We are reaching out to partners to share this need, but ultimately, we rest in God's promise: "Unless the Lord builds the house, the builders labor in vain" (Psalm 127:1).

Closing Word of Faith
Despite war, displacement, and hardship, we see God's hand at work in the lives of children, students, and churches. We remain steadfast in prayer, believing that He will use these ministries to bring light, hope, and salvation to many.

As Paul reminds us in 1 Corinthians 15:58: "Therefore, my dear brothers and sisters, stand firm. Let nothing move you. Always give yourselves fully to the work of the Lord, because you know that your labor in the Lord is not in vain."
