Child Abuse Awareness Month- Every Kid Deserves a Hero

The Eastland County Children's Advocacy Center believes every child deserves a hero in his/her life– especially the estimated 175 children who will be victims of abuse today in Texas. Child abuse can take many forms, be perpetrated by males and female care givers, and be very difficult for children to talk about. If a child does make an outcry to you, it is best to listen to the child, thank him/her for sharing with you about the abuse, and avoid asking any investigative or probing questions. Adults who suspect abuse of a child or have been told of abuse by a child, are strongly encouraged to report the allegation to Child Protective Services (800-252-4500) and/or law enforcement. Sexual Assault Awareness & Prevention Month– Consent Matters

According to studies conducted by the University of Texas (Austin), National Children's Alliance, and the Rape Incest National Network (RAINN), sexual assault impacts approximately 6.3 million Texans at some point in their lifetimes. This translates to 2 in 5 women and 1 in 5 men being victimized. Most often the perpetrators are known to the victims. This year, the Crime Victim Assistance Center is providing prevention and awareness education programs and materials with a focus on establishing consent and respecting boundaries in all types of relationships with the "Ask First" campaign.
