Update and Thanks...



Our Hospitality Committee is collecting used plastic grocery bags for a project to make mats to give to homeless people. The bags must NOT have any holes. The committee is working with a woman who creates the mats, like the one pictured here, by hand-weaving the plastic bags. It takes about 500 bags to make one mat. The committee decided to test whether the congregation would support this effort, hoping this could be a long-term outreach (and environmentally friendly) project for our congregation. The mats will be given to groups who work with the homeless in our area!



With all the bags we have contributed so far, she has made 30 mats!


Pentecost Offering, June 8, 2025.

The Day of Pentecost is considered the birth of the Church. The Pentecost Offering unites us in a church-wide effort to support young people and inspire them to share their faith, ideas, and unique gifts with the church and the world. Psalm 71 testifies that a foundation of faith established during childhood helps ensure lifelong faith and service. The patterns and lessons learned during these

formative years continue to bear fruit throughout a person's life. The Pentecost Offering helps to nurture the faith of those who are the church to come, children, youth, and young adults.

The Resource Management Committee has chosen the FPC Childcare Center to receive 40% of our offering. They strive to provide a creative, nurturing, and stimulating environment in which to learn and grow. The remaining 60% will go to the Presbyterian Mission Agency. They will divide it between young adult volunteers at 13 mission sites and a program established for youth ministries.

Parish Nurse News -

Measles – A quick guide on what to know......

At the time I am writing this, 11 cases of measles have been reported in North Dakota. Below are some quick facts and guidelines provided by North Dakota Health and Human Services:

- Measles is a <u>highly contagious</u> viral disease with a sudden onset. It can cause fever, rash, cough and runny nose.
- Serious complications of measles can result in pneumonia, swelling in the brain, convulsions, deafness and even death.
- It is transmitted from person to person by a cough or sneeze and can stay in the air for **up to two hours** after a person has been in the area.
- There is **no specific treatment** for measles, instead just supportive care for the virus unless secondary bacterial infections develop.

Measles is prevented through vaccination.

The CDC considers individuals **born before 1957** to have a high likelihood of **natural immunity**.

Vulnerable populations include:

unvaccinated individuals (including infants less than 12 months)

immunocompromised individuals - cancer patients, organ transplant recipients, people with HIV/AIDS, those on long-term corticosteroids or immunosuppressive therapy such as lupus,

rheumatoid arthritis or inflammatory bowel disease and

people with genetic or congenital immunodeficiencies.

If an exposure to Measles occurs:

Those who **NEED** to quarantine include:

People who have NOT had any doses of measles vaccine and

People who are NOT immune to measles through prior infection

Those who **<u>DO NOT</u>** need to quarantine include:

People who have had one or more doses of measles vaccine

People who are immune to measles from prior infection

People who were born before 1957

People who received a measles vaccine within 72 hours of their first exposure

MODERATOR'S REPORT

Pastor Leanne thanked those assisting with Youth Sunday. June events will include participation in Pride, Juneteenth and the picnic with all 3 churches.

Session approved the baptism request of Gus and Alyssa Shockman for their baby, Hayes Dean Shockman. This will occur some Sunday in June.

COMMITTEE REPORTS

Administrative and Personnel—They are reviewing the health insurance policy and the outdated phone system.

Hospitality—The summer worship service with all three Presbyterian Churches will be June 22 at Shelter #10 in Sertoma Park.

Proclamation-Christian Education—There will be 3 youth attending Triennium this summer.

Proclamation-Worship and Music—Plant Perfect refunded \$81 from the Easter lily purchase—due to poor conditions of the plants. In the future, silk flowers will be used. Different candles for the altar will be purchased.

Property and Equipment—A few water leaks following the rain were detected, some may have been condensation. An engineering company will do a structural review including the roof. Some of the very worn pew seats will be replaced.

Resource Management—The Child Care Center will receive 40% of the special Pentecost offering. A CD was renewed and the \$3,294 interest was put in the General Fund.

Board of Deacons—Dot Glaser was added to the visitation and recording lists. The Gift of Giving received over \$1.000 in donations at Easter.

Nominating—the committee will begin searching for 6 Elders and 7 Deacons for the Class of 2027.

Child Care Center Board—Assistant Director Vanessa Heim will be leaving to start a different job. She will be missed. A \$14,000 grant was received and used to purchase some appliances, high-chairs, crib, and walkie-talkies.
