

School starts September 7th. watch out for children. Have a great Labor Day.



# Windshield Wipers

Windshield wipers were first patented in 1903 by an Alabama woman, Mary Anderson. She was visiting New York, riding in a streetcar and it was snowing. She noted that the driver had to continually get out and clear the windshield, causing delays. Anderson thought - What if there were some sort of blade that could wipe off the windshield without making the driver get out of the streetcar?

Back in Alabama she made a sketch of her device, wrote up a description and applied for a patent.

The patent application describes how the wiper was to operated by a handle from the inside. She was awarded a patent on 11/10/1903.

Anderson tried to interest manufacturing firms in the device, but was turned down, one firm saying in part " we regret to state we do not consider it to be of commercial value".
