Ret. Lt. Col. GreenPope is currently a member of the Salt City Woman Veterans, Disabled American Veterans, American Legion, and the Veterans of Foreign Wars. She also serves on the Onondaga County Executive Veterans Advisory Board, Watchfire Committee, and is also on the Board of Directors with Honor Flight Syracuse. Working with Veteran groups has given her an opportunity to serve fellow Veterans and their families and to continue to advocate for their rights and benefits.



Local Jobs for a Big Project

Assemblyman Magnarelli was in attendance for a press conference in early September hosted by the New York State Department of Transportation (NYSDOT) regarding the Local Hire Initiative for the I-81 Reconstruction Project. NYSDOT Commissioner Marie Therese Dominguez came to Syracuse to talk about how NYSDOT is meeting its goals for local hiring through partnering with the area's local trade unions. NYSDOT is working with several workforce partners to provide training through apprenticeships and on-the-job training programs. Persons are eligible for this job initiative if they reside in the City of Syracuse or the Onondaga Nation Territory.

Honored Guest Panelist

Assemblyman Magnarelli was invited to serve on a panel for a conference at NYU Law School's Center on Civil Justice. The conference was on the topic of litigation financing. Assemblyman Magnarelli sponsors bill A.115 that would establish registration and regulation of litigation financing to consumers.The bill was a topic for one of the panels.

Consumer litigation financing provides money to plaintiffs in a lawsuit, usually a personal injury case, to provide them with short-term living expenses while the case moves forward. The company is paid back with interest only if the case ends in a recovery. Consumer litigation financing is currently unregulated in NY, and there have been several instances of companies charging exorbitant interest rates, leaving people with little or no recovery from the case.

The conference brought together stakeholders on all sides of the litigation financing debate to discuss how to best regulate this industry going forward.
