From Our Pastor: What is the Mission of the Church?

One of the chapters in the book, "Rich Church – Poor Church", that we are studying in Adult Sunday School talks about the mission of the church. One of the questions in the book is if all the members know the mission statement of the church? Do you know it? The book says it's important for members to know the mission statement, so that they can work together to help the church accomplish it's mission. Makes sense, right?

The book uses the example of a MASH unit in Iraq as it sought to realize it's mission. First, every member of that unit had been taught, to put the mission first, to never accept defeat, to never quit, and to never leave anyone behind. Wow! What focus!! I wonder how our churches would be doing, if each and every one of our members had this attitude toward the church.

And second, when command met to review its plans for achieving the mission, the supply officer would report on supplies, the sergeant would report on the personnel, the chaplain on the morale of the troops and etc. In short, if someone brought up something that wasn't a part of the mission, it was dismissed. Wow again! What if being a part of the church wasn't about meeting our personal desires, but about being enabled to participate in Christ's mission to the world?

Now there are a variety of church mission statements, but the book we are studying suggests this one – go forth and make disciples of all people, teaching them to obey all that Jesus taught us. In my 25 years of ministry, I have always emphasized that our discipleship in Christ calls us to do more than just care for ourselves, but to call others to Christ and welcome them into the church. This isn't just the pastor's mission, it is the mission of every member of the church!

How can you do this?? First of all, participate in the worship, fellowship, and mission of your church. Your participation is the most important thing you can do for Christ's church! Second of all, share the good news of what the church is doing for others when they ask you how you are and what you are doing? Third, invite them not just to worship, but to join us for fellowship, mission and ministry. We all know about the mission of the church, but outsiders don't, help them to find a way to connect to our church! Fourth, call the pastor about those who are hurting and in need of spiritual care, not just our members, but people in the community you know who don't have a spiritual advisor or church home.

Remember, put the mission first, never accept defeat, never quit, never leave anyone behind! This simple change in spirit and attitude can make all the difference in the world, for the future of Union Congregational Church!

*We are very thankful to all who donated to our Hurricane Relief special offering in September in the aftermath of Hurricane Harvey. On fairly short notice we received \$650.00! Some of the money was used to purchase supplies for clean up buckets which were assembled here at church and Pastor Ted delivered them to a Church World Service collection point in Elgin. They were taken to TX within a few days after that. The rest of the money was sent to the UCC disaster relief fund.

2017 CROP WALK will be on Sunday, October 1. It will be hosted by St. Paul's UCC in Hinckley (corner of McKinley & N. View St.) Registration begins at 1:15 and the walk steps off at 2 p.m. Ginny has the sign up information if you would like to be a walker, and if you can't walk there will be people from our church walking who would love to have a donation from you. Stop in or call the church office for more information. 75% of money raised on the walk goes to Church World Services. They use the funds in several ways: They help underdeveloped nations obtain fresh water, and teach them better farming techniques. CWS also is a presence at natural disaster scenes all around the world, providing tools, blankets and food to those displaced by the disaster. The other 25% of funds raised on this walk will be divided evenly between Our Sharing Pantry and the Hinckley Food Pantry. Please support this worthy cause in any way you can.

Foods Resource Bank Harvest Celebration will be held Saturday October 21 at the Dolder Farm, 11625 Countyline Rd, Somonauk. The worship service is at 10 a.m. Lunch will be served and there are many activities until mid-afternoon. If you've never attended one before, plan to go this year. Prayer Chain: At the deacon's meeting, Pastor suggested a plan for creating a prayer chain at Union Congregational. This was a request of a number of people in the church.

1. Have a sign up list for people who want to participate.
2. If there is a prayer concern, CONTACT the pastor, so that he might make sure it is OK with the person being prayed for to be on the list. We do not want to violate anyone's privacy!
3. Pastor will start the list and call the next person. If they are not there, he will call the next, and so on, until he gets someone.
4. Each person will be given a list and they will do the same.
5. The last person on the list will call the pastor to let him know that the chain has been completed.

The purpose of the prayer chain is not to be a gossip line! It is for us to pray for those in need, because PRAYER does work! Pastor will write and send prayers to people to help those who do not know how to pray for others. Several academic studies have indicated that prayer makes a significant difference in people's lives and in their healing. God HEARS our prayers! We will have a sign up sheet in the fellowship hall, please consider being a part of our prayer chain!
