Essay Component:

One hundred years victory in the First World War would not have been possible without American intervention. Over 4 million Americans died in the conflict and 137,000 died. Without their sacrifice, the principles enumerated in Wilson's 14 points of international cooperation, free trade, self-determination, and an end to colonialism would never have become a reality.

What made the patriotism of those who fought even more meaningful was the ghastly nature of this conflict. Nerve gas, machine guns, long range artillery, land mines, submarines, and airplanes made killing easier and more impersonal. On the home front American women provided everything imaginable to support the soldiers over there along with taking over jobs formerly done by men. In Europe, nurses and ambulance drivers ministered to the sick and wounded. And when the soldiers came home from being over there, veteran organizations were set up both in our community and all over the country to honor those who fought.

On a separate piece of paper, write a letter of appreciation of no more than 500 words and/or a maximum of 5 paragraphs to a local soldier, sailor, pilot, nurse, ambulance driver, organizer of a veteran's post, or citizen volunteer

The best essay will be selected by a board composed of members of the Eastchester Historical Society who will judge the essay on the basis of historical insight, use of supporting evidence, and clarity of expression.
