## McKinley Avenue is Closed!

The SWHNA Board appealed the Planning and Zoning Board's decision to close SW McKinley Avenue between SW 46th to SW 56th. This well-traveled street is utilized by many due to it's impressive scenic overlook of the city. The Planning and Zoning Board deemed this area unsafe due to the deterioration of the bridge at the SW 46th intersection. This intersection is next to the Great Western Bike Trail, and because of this closure, you can not enter the trail when traveling from the west. Your neighborhood board appealed to fix the bridge at a reduced cost based on the following conditions; traffic volume, possible future housing development, an alternative route as Park Avenue will be widened in 2016, and emergency access during rush hours on Park Avenue. Our Ward Councilmember, Chris Hensley, supported the proposal to leave McKinley open for walkers and bike traffic. The vehicle traffic measure is on hold until the Airport Authority decides their future land use needs in this area.

#### **Absentee Homeowners and Renters**

Homeowners in the Southwestern Hills Neighborhood are concerned that State Legislatures will override the City of Des Moines' ordinances that limit rental requirements for absentee homeowners. The HF 161 Bill is being debated and thus far has not passed. The main concern that has been voiced is turning a neighborhood of single family homes into an unlimited number of rental units with an unlimited number of renters. If one of these absentee owner's houses were converted to a rental unit next door to you, what would happen to your property value? This issue is not about a family, large or small, renting a home, its about that homeowner renting to several families in a single house. Call your state representatives, Senator Matt McCoy or Representative Jo Oldson if you have concerns or if you, too, want to voice your opinion.

## SWHNA 2015 Board Meeting Dates

The SWHNA Board meets the 3rd Monday of every month except December, when no meeting is held. Board meetings are open to neighborhood members and by calling a listed Board Member, you can be placed on the meeting agenda. Meetings are hosted at the Wakonda Christian Church upstairs meeting room, beginning at 6:00p.m. Neighborhood members are encouraged to use your neighborhood association regarding issues in the neighborhood.

## Water Works Unveils A Dream Park

The projected future plans for Waterworks Park, which borders the northern edge of Southwestern Hills Neighborhood, will be a family entertainment venue. It will start with connecting the trail from Grays Lake to Waterworks by way of a tunnel, under Fleur Drive. The tunnel will have a more inviting approach than a bridge over Fleur Drive. The current Arie Den Boer Arboretum will be enhanced with a children's play zone and an added amphitheater. The open field next to this area will continue to be a mixed-use athletic field. Traveling deeper into the park will be an added pier, large fishing terrace and a paddle boarding pond. Additional parking areas will also be constructed. The west node of the park will have a retention pond, with surrounding trails and a performance stage. Wildlife, water enhancements and a possible adventure park area is also included in the plans.

The improvements will not only make the park, a destination spot for Des Moines, it will add another asset to our great neighborhood. Lets break ground!

## Burglars Will Be Caught

The winter season brought an increase in home invasions and break-ins. Some invasions took place during the day, with people in their homes. Our neighbors in the Grays Lake Neighborhood (east of Fleur Drive) were hit the hardest, and co-hosted a special meeting to address the issue. The meeting was attended by a contingent of south side citizens and city officials to bring an end to this menacing situation. Constant neighborhood media updates and e-mail alerts were instrumental in keeping the neighbors and police on the alert. The value of being on our neighborhood e-mail list goes with out saying, keeping you informed on safety information. Our police department put in many hours investigating and arresting the criminals involved. They kept us informed at all levels, and for that, a special thank-you is owed!
