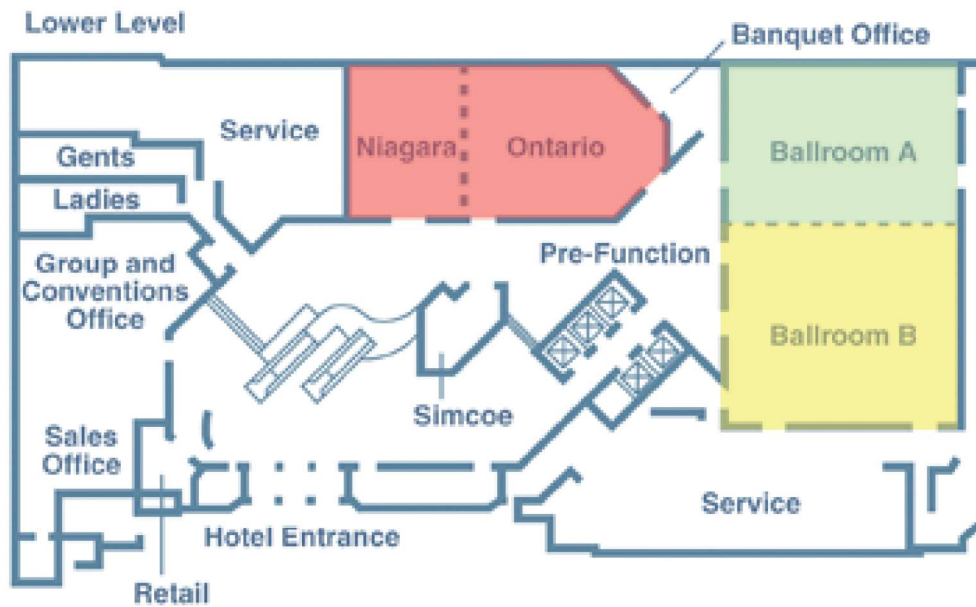

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Hotel Floor Plan



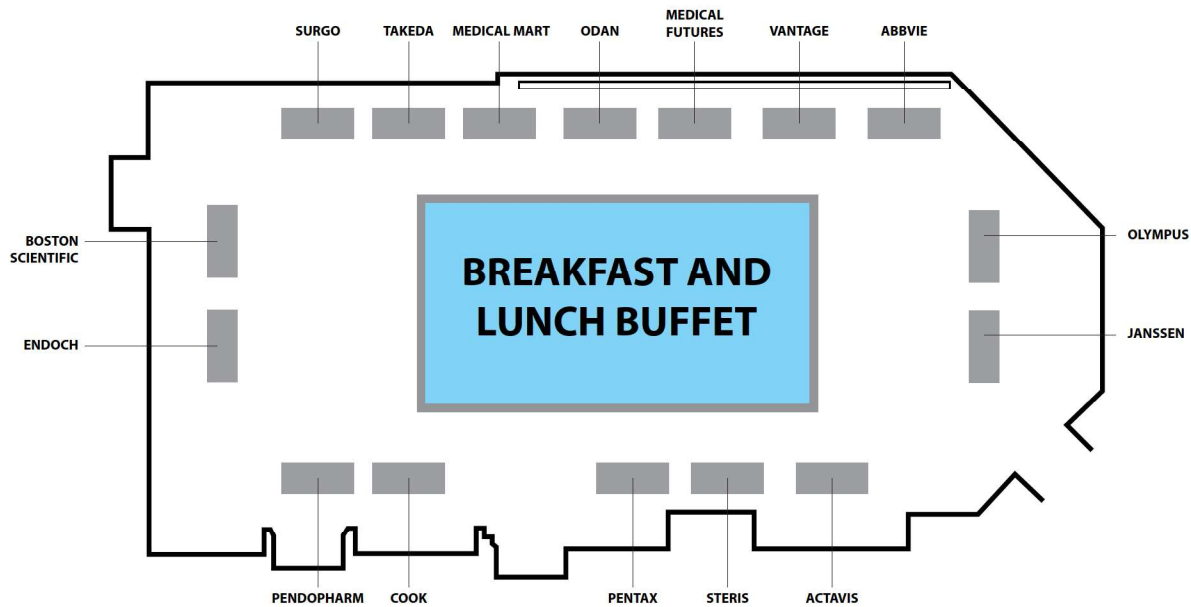

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Outbreaks of Hepatitis C Related to Sedation Practices in Endoscopy Clinics in Ontario

OVERVIEW:

This presentation will review the circumstances leading to the 4 recent outbreaks of Hepatitis C in Ontario Endoscopy Clinics. The mechanisms of infection control practise breaches related to improper sedation practises will be examined. Suggestions for changes to your clinic's current Injection Medication Guidelines will be discussed.

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Therapeutic Endoscopy in OHP/IHFs: What Should We Be Able to Do?



Dr. Imran Rasul

Dr. Imran Rasul completed his medical school, residency and advance therapeutic endoscopy fellowship at the University of Toronto. He has been working at Credit Valley Hospital for over ten years. He is the director of endoscopy at CVH. His area of interest advance therapeutic endoscopy and provides regional expertise in endoscopy and ERCP. He has worked in ambulatory endoscopy clinics in the region and is an active member of the West GTA endoscopy clinic. He also has been involved with the gastroenterology fellowship at U of T to provide ERCP and therapeutic endoscopy training many gastroenterology residents.

OVERVIEW:

Colonoscopy and polypectomy is the mainstay of therapeutics in endoscopy. This talk will provide an overview on the classification, impact of polypectomy and associated risks. The various methods utilized in polypectomy and issues surrounding these techniques. Lastly discuss what type of polypectomy should be performed in an out patient endoscopy clinic.



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What is the CAG SEE program and what does it offer the practicing colonoscopist?



Dr. Don MacIntosh

Dr. MacIntosh graduated from Memorial University of Newfoundland in 1983 and, after a rotating internship and two years of general practice, subsequently completed GIM and GI residencies at Memorial University and the University of Ottawa. He was on staff at the Health Sciences Centre in St. John's from 1993-99 and has worked since 1999 at the QE II Health Sciences Centre in Halifax. Dr. MacIntosh's practice has included speciality interests in IBD and therapeutic endoscopy including ERCP and complex polypectomy. Over the past 6 years, he has developed an interest in colonoscopy quality improvement.

Dr. MacIntosh is the former Medical Director of the Endoscopy Program of the Capital District Health Authority in Halifax and former Interim Division Head of Gastroenterology at Dalhousie University. He is the Quality Chair of the Nova Scotia Colon Cancer Prevention Program and national co-lead of the CAG SEE program. He has to date taught over 50 skills improvement and train-the-trainer courses across Canada and internationally. For reasons of maintaining sanity, he and his wife will be walking the Camino again this fall.

OVERVIEW:

This presentation will provide an overview of new methods in colonoscopy such as more efficient and ergonomic scope handling techniques, water insufflation, dynamic position change on insertion and withdrawal. The potential of magnetic imaging for colonoscopy will also be discussed.



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Transformation of Endoscopy Services in Ontario



Dr. Nancy Baxter

Dr. Nancy Baxter obtained her MD from University of Toronto (UofT) followed by general surgery training and PhD in Clinical Epidemiology at UofT. She completed her fellowship at the Mayo Clinic and is board certified in colon and rectal surgery (2002) and a Fellow of the ASCRS. Currently, she is a practicing colorectal surgeon and the Chief, Division of General Surgery at St. Michael's Hospital. She is a Scientist with the Li Ka Shing Knowledge Institute. Dr. Baxter holds the position of Provincial GI Endoscopy Lead with Cancer Care Ontario.

Dr. Baxter is an Associate Professor in the Department of Surgery and Institute of Health Policy, Management and Evaluation at the UofT and a Senior Scientist in the Cancer Theme Group at the Institute for Clinical Evaluative Sciences (ICES). She is a health services researcher interested in the effectiveness of cancer screening, long-term survivorship of cancer survivors and quality of surgical care.

Her clinical interests include the care of rectal cancer patients and minimally invasive colon surgery.

- Discuss ongoing work of CCO/MOHTLC on the Ontario Health System Funding Reform (HSFR)
- Provide an introduction to the Quality-Based Procedures (QBP) funding model for GI endoscopy (improve quality of care, standardize care delivery across the province and increase cost efficiency)
- Provide an overview of the funding of community clinics as part of the Ontario's Action Plan for Health Care
- Efforts to date in building a world class endoscopy service in Ontario to ensure that patients are receiving the right care, at the right place and at the right time

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PRESIDENT



Dr. Fred Bray received his medical education from McGill University, Montreal, Quebec, where he specialized in Internal Medicine. He further specialized in Gastroenterology, having done a fellowship at the University of Ottawa, Ottawa,

Ontario. At the University of Ottawa he received an award for Teaching Excellence.

He began his practice in 1994 at the Riverside Hospital, a community based hospital in Ottawa. At the Riverside Hospital he initiated and ran the ERCP program. In 1999 the Riverside Hospital was amalgamated with the Ottawa Civic and Ottawa General hospitals to form the Ottawa Hospital. While at the Ottawa Hospital, he was able to fulfill one of his natural interests, medical education at the University of Ottawa.

In June 2001 he resigned from the Ottawa Hospital and opened up an outpatient Endoscopy Clinic where he performs colonoscopies and gastroscopies.

He was involved with Capsule Endoscopy in its infancy and was one of the first to offer the "pill camera" in Canada. He belongs to many international and national associations.
