Much has been completed again this year to keep our buildings in good repair. Extensive work was done on the Doll Museum to the exterior. Bricks were replaced as needed, cleaned and sealed. New gutters were installed with gutter guards to prevent any backup. The building looks beautiful and should be good for many years.

Gutter guards were also installed on the entire Chapman House. These were much needed due to the many trees in the area.

The Chapman House chimney was noticed to be leaning. Repairs have been made and all is well once again.

Our Log Cabin was in need of replacement logs and chinking. Chinking is the fill used between the logs to keep it weather tight. We are still fighting some nasty bees but our exterminator is on the task!

If you think keeping up with one house or residence is a lot, we are taking care of 8 buildings and 2 small structures. Sure keeps us on our toes!
