



Pastoral Reflection

Catholic Social Teaching #9. With Palm Sunday we enter the holiest week of the year. In preparation for Easter, we enter fully into the mystery of Christ's passion. The Paschal Triduum begins with Holy Thursday and the commemoration of the Last Supper. On Friday we walk with Jesus on the way to the Cross and accompany him into the tomb. The week culminates with the Easter Vigil on Saturday and Easter Sunday. Is there anything we can learn from this week that will contribute to our understanding of Catholic Social Teaching?

1. Jesus was condemned unjustly by those who were trying to preserve their power. They were afraid of Jesus because of the empowering words of Jesus to the poor and powerless. This highlights the importance of resisting unjust systems that seek to keep the powerful in power and the poor powerless.
2. The horrible torture and execution of Jesus remind us of the importance of human life and our responsibility to work for a deeper respect for human life from the moment of conception to the last breath at natural death.
3. The manner of Jesus' death also reminds us of the many people who are alone in this world. The passion encourages us to seek out those who are homebound, in hospitals and nursing homes.
4. The torture and abuse that Jesus experienced continues today in those who are trafficked and tortured, unjustly deprived of their freedom. Because they are the suffering Christ today, we have an obligation to do our part.

These are just a few examples of how the passion of Jesus relates to our responsibility to care for others. Ultimately, it's about remembering that what we do for others we do for Jesus and what we fail to do for others we fail to do for him (Mt. 25). As we enter Holy Week, we aren't just remembering what happened to Jesus, we are coming face-to-face with Christ who continues to suffer today in our brothers and sisters.



Liturgy of the Word

- Isaiah 50:4–7 The Suffering Servant speaks to the weary.
- Psalm 22 “My God, my God, why have you abandoned me?”
- Philippians 2:6–11 Jesus emptied himself, and accepted death on a cross.
- Matthew 26:14—27:66 They came to a place called Golgotha or 27:11–54 and crucified Jesus there.

The climax of today’s liturgy of the word is a climax befitting a Hollywood blockbuster. Saint Matthew’s account of Jesus’ death is the most dramatic of the four Gospels. When Jesus breathes his last, the earth quakes, tombs burst open, and the sanctuary veil is torn apart. The soldiers at the foot of the cross, blown away by all of these natural and spiritual phenomena, look up at Christ and proclaim, “Truly, this was the Son of God.” At the last moment of Jesus’ earthly life, these witnesses have received the gift of faith. May our faith be strengthened as we listen as we do each year at this time to the Passion of our Lord Jesus Christ.


