

Lloyd A. Wolfe, age 83 of Adrian, formerly of Owendale, Michigan and Bradenton, Florida, passed away Thursday, August 23, 2012 at Hospice of Lenawee. He was born February 24, 1929 in Owendale, the son of Henry and Fredia (Decker) Wolf. He married Alberta (Ruth) Weidman on May 24, 1952, and they recently celebrated their 60th anniversary.

Lloyd was a current member of the Elkton United Methodist Church and formerly an associate member of the Clinton, Michigan and the Oneco, Florida United Methodist Churches.

Lloyd's three passions in his life were his faith, family, and farming. His faith he practiced daily with his daily experiences, in how his love for others was definitely known by all.
