THE TIME HAS COME...

METHODIST CHURCH

Have you ever read any Dr. Seuss books? There are MANY on the "favorite" list: The 500 Hats Of Bartholomew Cubbins, Bartholomew And The Oobleck, Horton Hears A Who!, The Cat in the Hat, How The Grinch Stole Christmas, Green Eggs And Ham, Hop on Pop, Oh, The Places You'll Go!...just to name a few. I read most of his books to my sons MANY times over the years. But, for my money, the best book he wrote might be...Marvin K. Mooney Will You Please Go Now!

I have referenced this book before- most recently in the last piece I wrote BEFORE my recent surgery. I used it as a way to talk about the fact that it was "time to go"- the surgery was imminent. ("The time has come. The time is now. Just go, go, go! I don't care how.") Therefore, it seems appropriate to reference it again...now that it is time to come back!

As you saw, the text of the book includes these words, "The time has come. The time is now." Only THIS time...it is NOT time to "go, go". Instead, it is time to...come BACK! And it's been a LONG road! In the past 12 months. I have had:

- 1 major in-patient surgery, 1 fairly major in-patient surgery and 1 outpatient surgical procedure
- 4 CT scans and 6 MRI's
- 10 trips to the lab for blood draws
- 6 trips to the oncologist, 7 trips to the Ear, Nose and Throat doctor and 3 trips to the neurosurgeon and 7 trips to the family doctor
- about 4,000 miles driven and 14 nights away from home.
- 180 doses of one experimental drug and 36 doses of a much more debilitating 2nd experimental drug.
- 4 rounds of steroids, 3 rounds of antibiotics and 4 rounds of pain meds
- part of my skull, part of my "brain pan" and the "cap" that covers my right side jaw joint re-built with titanium mesh
- that little bone in my right inner ear disintegrate, making me 100% deaf on that side.

44 days have passed since my surgery. 44 DAYS! That's LONG time! But I'll be honest- I usually bounce back quickly from...well...everything! But I needed every bit of those 44 days to bounce back from this one! I am undergoing electrical stimulation therapy in an effort to regain some of the facial/ mouth movement I lost from nerve damage.

I am seeing a specialist in July for my right eye, which I can't blink or squint, causing some issues. I will continue to see the oncologist, have blood draws and get MRI's, in an effort to monitor the small portion of the tumor that remains in my head, attached to the outside of the dura- the "sack" that encases the brain. Extensive research is being done on the tumor, with the goal of helping both other people who get this rare tumor and...ME!

If you had asked me a year ago if this is where I would find myself, I would have offered a resounding, "NO!" If you asked me NOW if this is where I would WANT to be, I would offer the same, "NO!" AND YET...if you asked me if this experience dampened my spirits or diminished my faith in any way, you would receive the SAME, "NO!" I do NOT have a gear to see this is a "test from God" or "punishment from God". God didn't CAUSE this rare tumor, but He DID find many "silver linings" in this dark cloud. Why? Because that is exactly what our God does!

"Thank you" seems so inadequate a response to what you all have done for me and my family. You will never know how much we appreciate your love and support. The prayers, the cards, the food, the gifts, the love...you have truly shown what it means to be the hands and feet of God. And I am proud...PROUD...to serve with you in ministry. God had done GREAT things here. And He is FAR from done yet!

I will be back in the office starting Monday, June 2. I will be helping lead worship starting Sunday, June 8, with Bill Joseph preaching that Pentecost Sunday and my wife preaching on Father's Day, Sunday, June 15. I will begin my new sermon series, The Psizzlin' Psummer Psalm Psermon Pseries (see accompanying article), on Sunday, June 22. That series will lead us to the end of August. I am SO glad to be able to say, "The time has come. The time is now. I'm back!"

NEW SERMON SERIES

Some are lyrical devices for remembering major events in Israel's history. The Book contains 150 psalms, making it the longest book in the Bible, based on number of chapters. - Sunday, July 27, 2014- Here is Our King (Psalm 93) Who's at the top of YOUR list? (Luke 1:31-33, 1Timothy 6:12-16)



Every day on my commute to and from church, I pass this John Deere combine just outside Viola, IL. As you can tell from the picture, it is pretty rough; its whole body is covered with rust, faded & chipped paint, ensnarled with branches & debris, unmovable, and dead. It sits like a hollow memorial to what could have been. It's almost sad to look upon...a well made instrument wasted.

In His parable of the talents, Jesus says in Matthew 25:18, "But he who received the one talent went away, and dug a hole in the ground and hid his master's money." This verse got me thinking about the abandoned combine; surely at one time, that green and yellow machine had to have been running and successfully assisting its creator in fulfilling his work. Now it is unproductive and broken.. literally and fig-

uratively frozen to the ground.

In this world, I'm afraid to say that many people fall into this category; hiding away their gifts and stalling out in their productivity. Regardless of our reasons why, God has still bestowed upon all of us a unique array of talents! And this bundle of talents is the thing God has given you to make you who you are and sets you apart from other people. We are challenged and called in 1 Peter 4:10 "...Use whatever gift He has received to serve others, faithfully administering God's grace." Since we are the body of Christ, and each part matters...meaning NO ONE who is insignificant. We are shaped to serve others through our talents.
