Tomato Curry

Soup This soup is very economical and healthy! The aroma is awesome. It's loaded with antioxidants, high in Vitamin C, has lots & lots of fiber, and is a good source of

protein with the added chicken, or mushrooms (vegetarian alternative). I use to make it for my family all the time, especially during cold & flu season.

Ingredients

- 2 cans tomato soup (Generic brand or Campbell's. I've made it with both and don't see much difference)
- 2 soup cans of 1% or 2% low-fat milk. If you can't drink cow's milk, try soy or almond milk, but for goodness sake, don't use water!
- 2 chicken breasts with fat and skin removed
- Vegetarian 8 oz package of whole mushrooms
- 1 large sweet or plain onion
- 1 quarter stick of butter or margarine
- ½ of a package of egg noodles
- Curry powder to taste

Directions:

Cook chicken, set aside to cool, then remove from bone and dice.


Vegetarian: Clean and slice mushrooms. Sauté and set aside.


Cut the onion into quarters, then cut the quarters in half. Sauté onions in margarine or butter

Cook noodles, set aside.

Combine tomato soup and milk in pot and let it simmer. Add the onions, chicken or mushrooms, noodles, and 1 Tablespoon of curry powder. Simmer for another ½ hour, stirring often, then serve. Makes 8 (1 cup) servings. Enjoy!
