<u>Q3 Neighborhood Luncheon – July 17 – SAVE THE DATE!</u>

Our Q3 program will provide an **Overview of Chevron's Future Energy Direction including Venture Investment in New Technology**. The details for the schedule and location are in the table below. While we may schedule other events, this will be the only Neighborhood Luncheon program in Q3!

Our speaker will be Akshay Sahni, with Chevron Technology Ventures (CTV). He is GM of Strategy and Technology and has been with Chevron for over 25 years, starting as a research scientist in La Habra, CA. He leads development of enterprise technology strategy for Chevron's current and future businesses, including technology deployment efforts for Chevron's upstream, midstream and downstream businesses.

This luncheon will be held at <u>The Ion</u> in Midtown and is generally known as "the old Sears building". Chevron has a variety of collaborative workspaces on the 3^{rd} floor where we will have a social time followed by a brief presentation and Q&A. Afterwards, there will be a short tour of Chevron's workspace.

The map below shows the two free visitor parking lots, both on Fannin Street. The smaller (yellow) lot is directly in front of the building and is intended for patrons of the vendors. The larger (red) lot is recommended for Chevron guest parking. It is directly across the street and has security. There is a safe, traffic-light protected cross-walk to <u>The Ion</u>. This will be a brown bag lunch only and is not catered. You can order a meal from one of the two small restaurants on the first floor and bring it up to Chevron's 3rd floor workspace. The **Common Bond** (832-661-2566) serves early breakfast, lunch & coffee. The adjacent **Lymbar Kitchen & Cocktails** (713-485-6230) opens at 11:00, however, expect some delay. Nearby options for lunch outside of The Ion include **Stuff'd Wings** drive-through at 401 Richmond Ave, opening at 11:00 and **Jack-in-the-Box** at 4403 Fannin St, which is always open.

After entering <u>The Ion</u> and obtaining your optional lunch, you will check-in at the front desk in the lobby and be given a pass to allow you access to the elevators. Just say you are here to attend the Chevron Retirees lunch. One of us from the Chapter will be nearby to help direct you to the elevators for the 3rd floor. Once you arrive at the Chevron workspace, you will sign-in and get your name badge.

We have space for up to 80 attendees on a first-come-first-served basis, so please send a note to <u>activities@cra-metrohouston.org</u> if you plan to go. If we receive more than 80 acceptances, we will ask you to use Zoom in the order of receipt. The Houston Food Bank is one of many volunteer opportunities available to Chevron retirees, spouses and guests. MHC Members can easily search and volunteer for many Chevron-sponsored volunteer events in the Greater Houston area by going to Chevron's Humankind website at http://www.chevronhumankind.com/. You will need your 8-digit Chevron Humankind User ID. There are helpful hints there if you have problems logging in.

Once you have successfully logged in, click on the "Volunteer" tab on the home page and then "Search Opportunities". You can search by events closest to your home, by date and by interest. Some of the filters are: Education, Human Services, Public and Societal Benefit, ENABLED Network, Assembling, Community Outreach, Education, Mentoring Youth, STEM, Season Party/Carnival, Soup Kitchen/Food Pantry, Walk/Run.

Eligible participants can request a \$500 grant for either individual or company-sponsored projects after volunteering 20 hours of verifiable volunteer time with one nonprofit. A maximum of two grants per year per individual for one nonprofit or two different nonprofits is allowed. Volunteer grants are included in an individual's annual match cap.

Changes to Q3 Neighborhood Luncheon Schedule & Location

As noted in the article on Page 2, **our Q3 Neighborhood Luncheon schedule and location has changed** since it was published earlier this year and on Page 5 of the 2023 MHC Membership Directory that was recently mailed out. **Please note that we will NOT be meeting on July 5 (West Area), July 18 (North Area), August 1 (Southwest Area) or August 16 (Central Area).** Instead, we will have one larger luncheon on July 17 at the ION in Midtown Houston. We strive to bring quality programs and guest speakers to our members and we are confident that this Q3 event will provide useful information on Chevron's technology ventures. A calendar invitation has already been sent out and our traditional e-mail invitation will be sent out shortly. **Please join us either in-person or via Zoom.**

<u>Membership</u>

The revised MHC Membership chart, shown below, reflects the addition of 2nd quarter 2023 membership information and shows a decrease in the number of Dues Paying Members from 928 to 783, a 16% decrease from the 1st quarter of 2023. Our Total Members shows a decrease from 1485 to 1076, a 28% decrease. Many of these were part of a large reduction in force by Chevron in 2021 and were included in our Introductory Membership program. The reductions reflect our annual removal of non-renewing members, which occurred at the end of March 2023. We are grateful for the many new members who have recently joined us and we hope you will keep on coming. **Thanks to all of you who have renewed your dues paying status!** Your participation helps us keep our chapter programs going!

At this time, 264 members are enrolled in our First-Year-Free program. We hope that those of you in this program have had the opportunity to participate in our Neighborhood Luncheons and found value in the friendships you have renewed and the information that was shared. **Please consider formalizing or renewing your membership so we can continue to offer these programs.**

The number of Dues Paying Members, while variable, continues to increase since we restarted our Neighborhood Luncheon programs in 2022, following the Pandemic. We will continue our luncheon program with a **major Q3 event at the ION in Midtown Houston**, as detailed on Page 3.



By the way, in Q1, members of our BOD met for a **Special Events Brainstorming Session** where we discussed opportunities to offer more fun and interesting activities to our members. So, be attentive to those upcoming invitations and we hope to see you there!

MHC Member Supports Houston Ground Angels

Houston Ground Angels (HGA) was founded in 2000. HGA's sole purpose is to provide free ground transportation to cancer patients and their caregivers from/to Houston's airports, as well as homes of cancer patients in the Houston area, MD Anderson Cancer Center and nearby hotels. HGA aims to provide out-of-towners and local residents a sense of security and relief from the stress of driving and paying for transportation. **HGA currently** needs more drivers. Since its inception, HGA volunteers have completed more than 38,000 missions and each year the number of requests for rides grows.



If you volunteer for HGA, you are not held to any fixed schedule. A volunteer simply looks at a list of out-oftown and local requests for rides, also called "missions". Using your computer, you decide which mission you want to take, then use the online tool to contact the cancer patient to arrange the pickup. It's completely up to each volunteer how many missions he/she takes. HGA has 75 volunteers who take one or more
