PESC is building a core competency in XML architecture and data modeling and serves as a data standards-setting body for higher education.

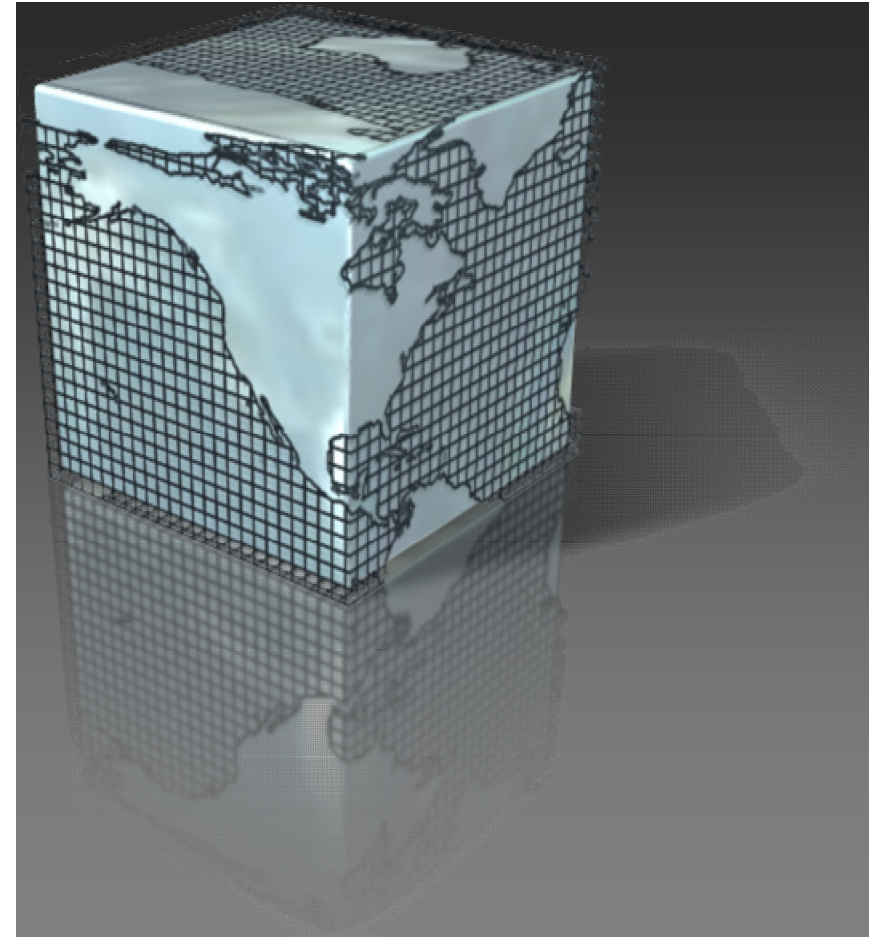
PESC is collaborating throughout education and with the strength it derives from the actions and involvement of its membership, PESC is activating interoperability in higher education.
