pastor's letter from pastor jane

Dear Brothers & Sisters in Christ,

What a joy to serve you as your Interim Pastor! I am in the process of setting up times to meet with each of our member families, hear your story and history with Hope Lutheran church, as well as review the direction you hope our church will go in the future. This is in addition to the Holy Cow survey your Transition Committee initiated, just in case there was something you wanted to say but didn't have the opportunity, or you thought of something new to add.

I hope each and every one of you had a wonderful Thanksgiving celebration. However, we know that the holidays are not a time of celebration for all people. Members of our church have family in Paradise, California, who lost their homes and all that they had. One disabled young man was rescued but may not survive the year due to smoke inhalation. Other members have lost loved ones, some are not feeling well. At times like this, our faith community surrounds us with love, prayers and compassion. Yes, God is good to us here in Fosston, and especially at Hope Lutheran.

What can we do to show our gratitude to God? King Solomon would say we should simply enjoy God's many blessings, eat, drink and be merry. Which he certainly did! Then in the joy of his many wives, (and children) he was swayed away from the Giver of all his gifts and worshipped other gods to please his pagan wives. Let us not forget from Whom our many blessings come, our abilities, our skills, all good things. Let us enjoy all good things and give thanks to our God Who gives them.

He promises us the "abundant life" (John 10:10). Abundant life for one person is not abundance for another. 
Youth Stewardship


Christmas is coming! Have you made a list of what you'd like to receive? Have you thought about what you're giving to others? Some joke that that's what December 24th is for. We may not even make any PLANS at all about what to give our family members and friends. We may find when we're ready to go shopping that we have neglected to put aside enough money to buy the gifts we want to give. We may give inappropriate gifts.

It's good to think back to that first Christmas, over a thousand years ago, when the world received its greatest gift. That, of course, is when God gave His Son to be born in a manger to fulfill the **PLAN** for our salvation.

There's that word again: PLAN. You see, God's gift to us was PLANNED centuries before it was given. In Genesis when Adam and Eve sinned, God told us about the PLAN (Gen. 3:15), and the prophets continued to proclaim the PLAN (Isaiah 9:6).


