WHAT IS THE MONARCH SHOW SERIES?

In 2019, a group of concerned American Saddlebred enthusiasts began discussions about taking a proactive approach to combat issues that were plaguing the American Saddlebred industry. These issues include a steady decline in ASB registrations and transfers; difficulty in bridging the gap between academy participation and horse ownership; young professionals leaving the industry for more secure employment opportunities; professionals and owners, alike, feeling left behind by the Industry's focus on elite levels of competition...the list goes on.

Out of these discussions, a vision was formed to network mainstream horse shows across the country and offer a "Crown Jewel" competition for this core market. This concept resulted in the new Monarch Show Series National Championship that will be held in the Coliseum of Champions on the Illinois State Fairgrounds September 22-25, 2021.

Our Mission:

Network mainstream horse shows across the country and offer a Crown Jewel competition for this core market, to inject a new level of excitement and inclusiveness for competitors that enjoy competing regionally.

- Provide a next step for Academy competitors as well as levels of advancement within this competitive space.
- Support regionally run horse shows by requiring competitors to compete in at least four horse shows within the Monarch Network to qualify for the Monarch Show Series National Championship.
- Support American Saddlebred breeders by highlighting another competitive space in which to market horses.



Juvenile members of the Colorado American Saddle Horse Association (CASHA) showing or competing on an American Saddlebred horse and/or Hackney Pony owned (or leased) by a CASHA member in Saddlebred classes at the Denver Queen City Horse Show.

CLASSES IN WHICH POINTS MAY BE ACCUMULATED ARE (if shown by a juvenile):

- Three Gaited Show Pleasure (under saddle and driving)
- English Country Pleasure (under saddle and driving)
- Hunter Country Pleasure (including Saddle & Bridle class)
- Western Country Pleasure (excluding Saddle & Bridle class)
- Saddle Seat Equitation (all classes except Medal or Challenge Cup classes)
- Roadster Pony
- One point for each session working in Center Ring as a volunteer for ribbons/trophies

Highest accumulated points, from riding/driving classes and other posted activities will be declared Champion. Second highest accumulated points will be declared Reserve Champion.



Rules and Regulations

EVERY CLASS OFFERED HEREIN WHICH IS COVERED BY THE RULES AND SPECIFICATIONS OF THE CURRENT FEDERATION RULE BOOK WILL BE CONDUCTED AND JUDGED IN ACCORDANCE THEREWITH. It is expected that exhibitors, owners, lessees, trainers and coaches will be familiar with the Federation breed and class specifications regarding your particular breed/discipline. Any changes appearing in the 2021 Rule Book automatically become a part of this premium list. Check your Federation Rule Book for class specifications regarding your breed and classes. A current Federation Rule Book will be available in the Horse Show Office. In case of error in the book, the tentative schedule numbering will be the guideline.

Potential exhibitors who have submitted their paid entries by the July 16, 2021 closing date will be notified of any changes made to this prize list via email or regular mail. Notification will also be posted at the following URL: www.coloradosaddlebred.com under the DQCHS tab. It is the responsibility of exhibitors who post enter (after the July 16, 2021 closing date) to check the URL noted above or check in at the Horse Show Office for any changes that may affect your entry.

The horse show office will not accept ANY changes made by text or email message to the manager, secretary or assistant secretary in regard to canceling or adding classes. All additions and cancellations must be made in writing and signed for by the responsible party to the show secretary.

Entries

Entries must be made in writing and signed by the (1) exhibitor, (2) the rider, driver, handler, vaulter or longeur, (3) the trainer, and (4) the coach, if applicable, or by the agent(s) of such person(s) and must be accompanied by funds to cover entry fees, stall fees and Federation fee (see GR208.1). In the case of a rider, driver, handler, vaulter or longeur under the age of 18, his/her parent or guardian, or if not available, the trainer, must sign an entry blank on the minor's behalf. SOCIAL SECURITY NUMBER OF OWNER MUST BE ON ENTRY BLANK. Make checks payable to Denver Queen City Horse Show (DQCHS).

Entries received without remittance in full will NOT be processed. Entries that are NOT complete will be returned and considered Post Entries.

Refusal of Entries

In addition to entries of persons suspended or expelled from the Federation, a Licensed Competition may refuse <u>any</u> entry of an exhibitor or the participation of any agent, trainer, rider, driver or handler who has shown an objectionable attitude or behavior at a Licensed Competition or towards its management, which management is able to substantiate, or previous unsportsmanlike behavior at a Licensed Competition which management is able to substantiate.

Post Entries

Post entries are any entries made after the advertised closing date of July 16, 2021. Per Federation rule GR910.2, the Federation does not encourage post entries, and strongly urges Horse Show Committees to require that entries be made in advance. Any entry received after the closing date of July 16, 2021, will be considered a post entry and will be accepted, at the discretion of the Horse Show Management, with an additional charge of \$30 **PER HORSE**, payment in full (or a signed, blank check made payable to Denver Queen City Horse Show) and a fully completed and signed Entry Blank. **Post entries can only be accepted prior to the starting of the class and upon signature of exhibitor or his/her agent and trainer.**

Personal Checks

Any check refused by the bank for any reason will be assessed a \$60.00 penalty. Then the full obligation, plus the \$60.00 penalty, must be covered by a money order, cashier's check or cash. The Horse Show Management reserves the right to refuse payment in the form of a check from <u>ANY</u> exhibitor. ALL CHECKS MUST BE PRE-PRINTED WITH THE CURRENT INFORMATION (name, address and telephone number). **PRIZE MONEY WILL BE FORFEITED IF ANY CHECK IS RETURNED BY THE BANK FOR NON-SUFFICIENT FUNDS.**

An exhibitor will be notified of the returned check and if not settled within 10 days will be turned over to USEF for settlement.

Per Federation Rule GR913, if a person fails to make settlement with the competition and/or the Federation within 30 days from the date of the notice from the Federation, he or she will be fined the additional sum of \$250 payable to the Federation and he or she and any horses owned by him or her and any horses and/or persons for which the non-negotiable sums have been paid will automatically be barred from taking part whatsoever in any competition Licensed or endorsed by the Federation until settlement is made both of indebtedness to the Competition and to the Federation.

Refunds and Vet-outs

Entries will be accepted through midnight July 16, 2021. Exhibitors canceling their entries <u>after</u> the official date for the closing of entries, <u>without</u> a veterinarian's certificate, shall forfeit <u>all</u> fees. Vet-outs made <u>prior</u> to August 5, 2021 (the start of the show), <u>with</u> a veterinarian's certificate, shall forfeit only the office fee and stall fees. Vet-outs made <u>during</u> the show (August 5, 2021 or later) <u>with</u> a veterinaria's certificate shall forfeit all fees except for entry fees. <u>No refunds</u> will be made during the show. The competition will refund entry fees in the event of cancelation of classes due to severe weather or other emergency. The competition will refund ALL fees paid if competition is canceled due to the COVID-19 pandemic.

Numbers

Each horse shall have the SAME NUMBER throughout the show. This number is to appear on the back of the rider, driver, or handler, or any conspicuous place. Any entry without a number in the ring shall not be judged.





Conduct

Be warned that any act of discourtesy, foul language, or disobedience to the Horse Show Officials on the part of the rider, driver, handler, vaulter, longeur, owner, lessee, agent, coach, trainer, family of the exhibitor of any horse, or any associates thereof, will disqualify such horse from adjudication and the owner shall forfeit entrance and all fees.

The Horse Protection Act of 1970, Public Law 91-550 as amended will be followed. Exhibitors are to use caution in the ring and the schooling areas, especially with respect to training and schooling horses. Whips must not be longer than 6' including snapper or lash (see GR803). Appliances, such as action devices, chains, rope exercising devices, noisemakers such as aerosol sprays, and blindfolds will be prohibited from the show grounds. Leather straps, elastic stretchers with cuffs, and training flags will be permitted, but not beyond the paddock. Appropriate protective boots & half-cup blinkers (per appropriate divisions within the USEF Rule Book) will be permitted. Attention getting devices such as fire extinguishers and fireworks are absolutely prohibited on the show grounds (see GR840). Failure to comply may result in the entry being excused from competition. USEF rules will be enforced including Chapter 3 "Conduct of Recognized Competitions," GR 302 "Abuse," and Chapter 29 "Morgan Horse Division" Sub Chapter 4, Article MO105 "Appointments," Article MO106 "Attire," and SB 104.5 "Appointments." The General Provisions of the Horse Protection Act will be enforced.

Requests for holds will be granted only in cases of back-to-back classes and must be requested prior to the start of the session with the Paddock Manager. A two-minute gate will be enforced throughout the show.

Condition of Entry

Every horse entered for competition will be under the control of the Denver Queen City Horse Show Management. Neither the Denver Queen City Horse Show, the Colorado Fall Charity Horse Show, the Horse Show Management, nor the Colorado American Saddlebred Horse Association will in any case be responsible for any loss or damage that may occur, and it is a condition of entry that each exhibitor shall hold such bodies harmless for any loss or accident to horse(s), property or equipment that may occur from sickness, fire or otherwise. The Denver Queen City Horse Show, the Colorado Fall Charity Horse Show, the Horse Show Management, and the Colorado American Saddlebred Horse Association will not be responsible or liable for any injury or death in any way by exhibitors, spectators or employees. WARNING: Under Colorado law, an equine professional is not liable for any injury to or the death of a participant in equine activities resulting from the inherent risks of equine activities, pursuant to Section 13.21.119, Colorado Revised Statutes.

Health Requirements

All horses more than 7 months of age entering the show grounds **must** be accompanied by documentation of Equine Influenza Virus and Equine Herpes Virus (Rhinopneumonitis) vaccinations within six months prior to entering the stables (see GR845). All horses (both in state and out of state) are to be examined by a licensed veterinarian and found to be free of any infectious or communicable diseases. Such information must be properly recorded on a health certificate, issued within 30 days of the start of the horse show, accompanying each horse. For entry into the State of Colorado, a Coggins test is required within 12 months of the competition. Health requirements for in-state horses are left to the discretion of the Horse Show Management. Horses not in compliance may be required to leave the competition grounds upon request by Competition Management.

Registration

Horses shown at this show must be registered with their respective breed registries (i.e., American Morgan Horse Association, Inc., the Canadian Morgan Horse Association, the British Morgan Horse Society, American Saddlebred Horse Association, Arabian Horse Association, etc.) and must be entered under their full registered name and registration number, or if under one year of age, be eligible for registration. Horses must be entered under the names of the owner(s) or lessee of record with their respective breed organizations. A copy of the registration papers showing recorded ownership or proof of lease must be submitted with entry form at the time of making entry.

Judging System

The one-judge system will be used for all divisions.

Protests

Any rider, driver, handler, vaulter, longeur, exhibitor, owner, agent, trainer or the parent of a junior exhibitor, or any Life, Senior, or Junior member present at the competition may file a protest with the Show Committee or Competition management of a Licensed Competition or The Federation Hearing Committee alleging violation of any Federation rule(s). See Federation Rule GR603 for additional information.

Awards

Prize money will be paid by check, made to the order of the person identified on the entry form, and will be mailed within thirty (30) days of the completion of the show. In the event of cancellation of classes due to severe weather or other emergency, refunds of entry fees must be made upon written request by the exhibitor within 30 days of the cancellation. All premiums not claimed within 90 days shall be deemed forfeited to Denver Queen City Horse Show. Award money for Saddlebred futurity classes is determined and paid by the American Saddle Horse Breeders Futurity of Colorado.

Arabian, Half-Arabian, Anglo-Arabian, Morgan, Saddlebred and Open class awards are as follows: **Championship/Stake Classes:** Trophy and 6 ribbons. **All Regular classes:** Trophy and 6 ribbons. No payback will be offered in any class except in Saddlebred, Morgan, and Open Championships/Stakes. Saddlebred, Morgan, and Open Championships will be paid back as a percentage of entry fees collected not to exceed a total of \$600. $1^{st} - 30\%$, $2^{nd} - 25\%$, $3^{rd} - 20\%$, $4^{th} - 12\%$, $5^{th} - 8\%$, $6^{th} - 5\%$. No paybacks in Championships/Stakes with one horse or Juvenile Championships. No paybacks will be offered in Arabian, Half-Arabian or Anglo-Arabian Championship classes.

Arena and Warm-up Arena

The main arena measures 150' x 300'. The warm-up/paddock measures 90' x 190'. Both arenas have footing composed of 60% sand and 40% non-fat soluble clay.

Food and Beverage

Will be available at the concession stand during show hours. The concession stands will not open prior to show starting. No outside catering may be brought in, all catering must be arranged with CaterWest.

Office and Exercise Schedules

Schedules for office hours and exercising times will be posted at the Show Secretary's office. Horses are NOT allowed to work in the paddock ring during horse show performances.

Changes and/or Cancellations to Classes in the Schedule

When exhibitors, trainers or stables wish to make a change in entries in any class they are required to follow the procedure of scratching the existing entry and making a new entry with the Show Secretary's Office, no later than one hour before the start of the session. Failure to notify the Show Office of scratches one hour prior to the session will be charged a fee of \$25.00. There will be NO REFUNDS for scratches for any reason. In the event of the sale or injury to a horse (Veterinarian's Certificate required), exhibitors may post enter another horse in the same classes at the rate of \$30.00 per horse.

The management of the Denver Queen City Horse Show reserves the right to add, split, combine or cancel any classes it deems appropriate. Juvenile, Academy and Equitation classes with four or fewer entries may be combined. Medal classes that do not have the required number of entries to be complete may be canceled. Exhibitors will be notified accordingly, and entry fees refunded in cases of class cancellation.

Qualifying classes will be split per the suggested number of entries in the USEF Rule Book as listed in each division respectively. All sections will be placed and qualify for their respective championship. Championship classes being split will have a champion pinned in each section.

Federation Classes

A USEF Saddle Seat Medal 17 & Under class will be offered at this show.



Stalls

Stalls will be assigned by the Barn Manager with preference given to properly completed entries submitted by the July 16, 2021 closing date. Out-of-town and out-of-state exhibitors will be given preference if they have entries in by the closing date. Horses must be placed in assigned stalls and no change will be permitted without the consent of the Horse Show Management. Stalls are constructed of wood, metal and/or vinyl with either half-open, mesh, pipe or solid fronts and doors. Exhibitors should order only the actual number of stalls required, and only one stall per entered horse on which fees are paid will be allocated. Exhibitors will be charged for any additional stalls used without permission of the Horse Show Management. Stall usage includes but is not limited to using stalls for hay, straw and bedding storage, storing clothing, tack and show supplies, and storage of garbage or manure. Stall usage will be monitored throughout the show. To avoid any additional charges, do not use any stalls not already assigned to you.

Stalls will not be available until 8:00 am on Wednesday, August 4, 2021. Out-of-state horses may be granted early entry – please contact the Horse Show Manager for arrangements. There will be a \$20 per-day, per-stall fee added for early entry. Exhibitors will be billed for damage to stalls in excess of normal wear and tear. Stall charts will be posted. Any changes of entries after the closing date will be subject to management's approval and subject to a first come/first-served basis. ALL horses MUST purchase a stall – **NO EXCPETIONS**. No first bedding is supplied.

Removal of stall panels by exhibitors is prohibited. Exhibitors desiring removal of stall panels must contact the Barn Manager, who will coordinate the removal with National Western. Only National Western can remove these panels. Denver Queen City Horse Show will charge \$15 per panel for such removal and the exhibitor is responsible for payment.

Stalls in the Events Center stabling area are limited so please get your entries in early. For those exhibitors wishing to stall together, please send entries together to avoid any office oversights.

Feed and Bedding

No bedding is provided free of charge. Bedding, hay or grain may be obtained from the Feed Proprietor selling these items at the show. Please make arrangements in advance with the Feed Proprietor (**B&T Tack & Feed/Bill Amen – 303.809.6352**). Shavings can also be ordered on your entry blank. You are responsible for your payment and at no time will the Denver Queen City Horse Show Management be responsible for payment.

Manure/Stall Clean Up

All exhibitors are required to dump manure in NW designated areas. If not strictly adhered to, the Horse Show Management has the right to request any exhibitor to vacate show grounds. The Horse Show Management will strictly enforce this rule. Please have manure out before the late morning pick up by NWSS employees.

Parking and Trailers

Due to fire regulations, cars, trailers, vans and campers must be parked in designated parking areas. Anyone wishing hookups for campers and/or trailers must arrange for this hookup in the horse show office and will be charged a hookup fee. TRAILERS PARKED BEHIND THE PADDOCK AREA WILL BE TOWED. All Trailers must be parked in the North Lot (Lot H). All vehicles not parked in designed parking areas WILL be towed at the owner's expense.

Camper Hook Ups

Spaces with electric only will be assigned on a first come, first-served basis (no advance reservations), by barn manager Bill Amen 303.809.6352 or show secretary Anne Burton 303.665.3307. Showers are available in the horse barn restrooms. Horse show management will assign hook-up spaces and collect payment. A fee of \$30 per camper per night must be paid in advance to the horse show management.

Farrier

No farriers other than the official show farrier or an appointed assistant will be allowed to work on the show grounds once the show begins at 10 a.m. Thursday, August 5. Del Slaugh will be available Thursday, August 5 through Saturday, August 7.



Federation Entry Agreement

I have read the United States Equestrian Federation, Inc. (the "Federation") Entry Agreement (GR906.4) as printed in the Prize List for this Competition and agree to all of its provisions. I understand and agree that by entering this Competition, I am subject to Federation Rules, the Prize List, and local rules of the competition. I agree to waive the right to the use of my photos at the competition, and agree that any actions against the Federation must be brought in New York State. The complete statement is listed on the back of the entry agreement for this horse show.

Pets - Important USEF Rule

Dogs are <u>not</u> allowed on the National Western grounds and may be impounded. Additionally, the 2021 USEF Rule Book states: **Dogs are not permitted to be loose on competition grounds and must be on a leash or otherwise contained. Individuals must not lead dogs on leashes while mounted. Dog owners failing to comply with this rule may be subject to penalty, as well as issuance of warning cards.**

Protective Headgear

Except as may otherwise be mandated by local law, the Federation strongly encourages all riders, while riding anywhere on the competition grounds, to wear protective headgear with harness secured which passes or surpasses ASTM (American Society for Testing and Materials)/SEI (Safety Equipment Institute) standards for equestrian use and carries the SEI tag. (Exception hunter, jumper, or hunter/jumper competitions refer to GR801.2) It is the responsibility of the rider, or the parent or guardian or trainer of the junior exhibitor to see to it that the headgear worn complies with appropriate safety standards for protective headgear intended for equestrian use, and is properly fitted and in good condition, and the Federation, Show Committee, Competition Management, and Licensed Officials are not responsible for checking headgear worn for such compliance. As defined in the 2021 Federation Rule Book GR801.4, any exhibitor may wear protective headgear (ASTM/SEI) and/or a protective vest either body protecting or inflatable, specifically designed for use in equestrian sport in any division or class without penalty from the judge. Protective headgear must be worn by all riders in lead line and academy classes at all times while mounted.

Ring Procedure and Attire

The show ring will be under the absolute control of the Horse Show Manager. All horses must be ready and waiting to enter the ring promptly. The in-gate must be closed two (2) minutes after the first horse enters the ring. When the gates are closed and the judge has started to work, no exhibitor who is late will be admitted. During the time of the judging, no person will be allowed in the ring except horse show officials, judges, stewards, and when necessary, trainers or attendants of the horses to be judged. All riders, drivers, handlers, and attendants in the show ring must be neatly attired with collared shirts and nice jeans, slacks, or jodhpurs. **JEANS WITH HOLES ARE PROHIBITED.** Any inappropriately attired individual's entry may be disqualified by the judge is sole discretion. FORMAL ATTIRE IS NOT PROPER BEFORE 6:00 p.m. Exception: formal attire is allowed in Championship Hunter Pleasure classes.

It is a tradition of the competition ring that riders and drivers be correctly attired for the class in question, that attendants be neatly dressed, and horses properly presented. The Management may, at its discretion, bar an entry or person from entering the ring if not suitably presented to appear before an audience.

Safety Information

When coaching riders in the ring, the show prefers that coaches stand on the ground level near the in gate and out gate. Please be aware of other horses in the ring when coaching during classes on the pedestrian level of the concourse directly above the horses in the ring, particularly in juvenile classes. Coaching from the seats, in a seated position, is preferred in this area.

Any conduct, inside or outside the show and warm up areas (including but not limited to, excessive yelling, over coaching, towels, whips, bags, and other attention getting devises) which disturbs or interferes with other exhibitors is prohibited. For further information on attention getting devices see USEF GR 840 & SB 103.9.



Driver's License Statement

Minors who do not have a valid driver's license which allows them to operate a motorized vehicle in the state in which they reside will not be permitted to operate a motorized vehicle of any kind, including, but not limited to, golf carts, motorcycles, scooters, or farm utility vehicles, on the competition grounds of licensed competitions. Minors who have a valid temporary license may operate the above-described motorized vehicles as long as they are accompanied by an adult with a valid driver's license. **The parent(s), legal guardian(s), or individual who signs the entry blank as a parent or guardian of a minor operating a motorized vehicle in violation of this rule are solely responsible for any damages, claims, losses or actions resulting from that operation**. Violations of this rule will be cause for sanctions against the parent(s), guardian(s) and/or trainer(s) who are responsible for the child committing the offense. Penalties may include exclusion of the child, parent(s), guardian(s), and/or trainer(s) from the competition grounds for the remainder of the competition and charges being filed against any of the above individuals in accordance with Chapter 6. Wheelchairs and other mobility assistance devices for individuals with disabilities are exempt from this rule.

Sharps Containers

Competition management shall place a minimum of one sharps container per each competition, whether or not stabling is provided. Additionally, at least one sharps container per fifty occupied stalls for the disposal of needles and other disposable sharp instruments in convenient locations in barns housing competition horses. It is competition management's responsibility to replace such containers when full and dispose of them properly. Competition management may fine any individuals including trainers, owners, exhibitors, or their agents up to \$100 for improper disposal of needles or other sharp disposable instruments. Competition management will place a notice of this requirement either in its prize list or on a specific handout given to trainers on check in at the competition. If local law has different requirements, local law will prevail. Competitions failing to comply with placing the required number of containers on the show grounds will be considered in violation of the rules and may be subject to penalty as determined by the CEO or Executive Director and/or the Hearing Committee.

USEF Federation Membership Rules

1. To be eligible to participate as a rider, driver, handler, vaulter, longeur, owner, lessee, agent, coach or trainer at Regular Competitions, Eventing Competitions at the Preliminary Level or above, Dressage Competitions, Combined Driving Competitions at the Advanced Level, Endurance Rides, Reining Competitions, Para Equestrian Competitions, and Vaulting Competitions, persons must be Members of the Federation as provided in Bylaw 201. No organization, other than the USEF and its Recognized Breed and Discipline Affiliates, may require mandatory membership or a non-member fee as a condition of participation in a USEF Licensed Competition.

2. All Life, Senior Active and Junior Active Members of the Federation must designate a primary breed/discipline affiliation upon joining or must do so annually upon renewing. A member will be deemed to continue his or her primary designation unless prior to the record date (November 30 of each year) such Life Member notifies the Federation in writing of change. This shall be considered the member's affiliation for the purpose of allocating Voting Director seats as provided in Bylaw 211.

Definition of Terms

Junior Horse: A junior horse is a horse 4 years old and under (5 years old and under for Arabian/HA/AA). Birthday is to be considered as of January 1, after the year in which he/she was born.

Limit Horse Classes: Open to horses who have not won six (6) first place ribbons in an under-saddle class or driving class at a horse show.

<u>Novice Classes:</u> are open to horses not having won three (3) first place ribbons in an under-saddle class or a driving class at a horse show. A limit or novice entry is as of the closing date of entries. Ribbons won in an under-saddle class shall not count towards limit or novice status if the horse is transferred to driving and vice versa, i.e., Five Gaited to Pleasure Driving or Fine Harness to English Pleasure, etc.

Amateur: As defined under USEF Rules, Chapter 8, and Subchapter 8c. Amateurs and Professionals. Article GR1306 Amateur Status and Article GR1307 Amateur Certification.



Amateur Certification

Every person who has reached his/her 18th birthday and competes in classes for amateurs under Federation rules must possess current amateur status issued by the Federation. This status must be available for inspection, or the competitor must have lodged with the competition secretary, at least one hour prior to such class, an application for such status provided by the Federation. Amateur status will be issued only on receipt of the application properly signed and is revocable at any time for cause. Any person who has not reached his/her 18th birthday is an amateur and does not require amateur certification. A copy of card must accompany entry.

AMHA Membership Rule

Standard or Premium Level, Life, Individual, and Junior AMHA Members shall be eligible to participate in all Morgan classes at the Denver Queen City Horse Show. A non-member may participate as a rider, driver, owner, lessee, agent, or trainer upon payment of a \$45 fee. Participants in the following classes are exempt from the requirements of this rule: 1. leadline, 2. exhibitions, 3. games and races, 4. classes for 4-H members, 5. walk-trot and academy classes. (Academy classes are classes limited to horses used regularly in a lesson program.) and 6. USDF Introductory Level Tests, Pas de Deux and Quadrille Classes, 7. Opportunity classes. Also exempt from this requirement are members in good standing of their national federation. A copy of the appropriate, current AMHA membership card(s) must be sent with entries.

AHA Membership Rule

EACH COMPETITOR (THIS INCLUDES AT LEAST ONE RECORDED OWNER AND ALL TRAINERS, DRIVERS, RIDERS, HALTER HANDLERS, COACHES AND THE PERSON(S) SIGNING THE ENTRY BLANK) IN AN ARABIAN HORSE ASSOCIATION RECOGNIZED ARABIAN DIVISION, AT THE TIME OF ENTRY INTO A COMPETITION, MUST SUBMIT A COPY OF A VALID AHA MEMBERSHIP/COMPETITION CARD, JOIN AHA OR PAY AN AHA SINGLE EVENT MEMBERSHIP FEE PER COMPETITION. WHEN AN AGENT SIGNS FOR THE OWNER AT AN AHA RECOGNIZED COMPETITION, BOTH THE OWNER AND AGENT MUST BE MEMBERS OF AHA OR PAY THE AHA SINGLE EVENT MEMBERSHIP. SINGLE EVENT MEMBERSHIP IS NOT ACCEPTABLE AT AHA REGIONAL OR NATIONAL COMPETITIONS. EXHIBITORS IN WALK-TROT CLASSES ARE EXEMPT FROM AHA MEMBERSHIP REQUIREMENTS AT QUALIFYING COMPETITIONS BUT MUST HAVE AN AHA MEMBERSHIP WITH COMPETITION CARD AT AHA REGIONAL AND NATIONAL COMPETITIONS. EXHIBITORS IN LEAD LINE CLASSES OR PARENTS/GUARDIANS SIGNING FOR MINORS ARE EXEMPT FROM AHA MEMBERSHIP REQUIREMENTS.

Please see the reverse side of the entry blank for the Agreement and Waiver for AHA (Arabian Horse Association) members. If an owner, trainer, handler, rider or driver does not have proof of current AHA membership, s/he may join AHA at the show.

Stripping of Championships

<u>Saddlebred classes:</u> The Five Gaited Open State Championship and Three Gaited Open State Championship with 2 or more entries will be stripped. <u>Morgan classes:</u> Morgan championships will NOT be stripped. <u>Arabian/HA/AA classes:</u> Arabian/HA/AA championships will NOT be stripped.

Morgan Championship Classes

Amateur Ladies competing in any Ladies qualifying class may choose to compete in the Amateur Championship instead of the Open Championship. To be eligible for Championship classes, the entry must have been entered, shown, and judged in a qualifying class.

AHA Rules

AHA Value Shows only count towards AHA qualifications and programs. Per AHA rules, this prize list is required to indicate if the show is holding Working Hunter Championships. The Colorado Fall Charity AHA Value Show is not holding Working Hunter Championships.

Performance Horse Qualifying Criteria: To qualify for a State Championship class, a particular horse would need to:

- The horse may qualify by showing in (and completing) any qualifying class in a particular division at the 2021 Denver Queen City Horse Show, OR
- By placing first or second in any open, amateur, adult, juvenile, ladies, and/or championship/stake class in a particular division at any of the qualifying shows listed above.

If qualified (as outlined above) at a previous horse show, a horse may enter and show in the state championship class without entering a qualifying class at the 2021 Denver Queen City Horse Show. To directly enter the state championship class, horses must list the qualifying show, class, and place in a designated area on the entry blank for the Denver Queen City Horse Show. In the case of multiple qualification (different divisions at different horse shows), horses cannot cross enter divisions per USEF rules for the Saddlebred.

Qualification follows the horse, regardless of the owner and/or rider of the horse. Five Gaited and Three Gaited State Championship performance classes shall be stripped per USEF rules.

The winner of the designated championship class at Denver Queen City Horse Show will be named the 2021 Colorado State Champion!

Equitation Rider Qualifying Criteria: To qualify for a State Championship class, a particular **rider** would need to:

- A particular rider may qualify by showing in (and completing) **any** qualifying class in a particular division **at the 2021 Denver Queen City Horse Show, OR**
- By placing first or second in any 14-17, 13 & under, pleasure, 10 & under walk & trot, walk & trot championship, and/or 17 & under championship class in Saddle Seat Equitation at any of the qualifying shows listed above. Medal, Challenge Cup, and/or Medallion classes do NOT count toward qualification.

If qualified (as outlined above) at a previous horse show, a rider may enter and show in the state championship class without entering a qualifying class at the 2021 Denver Queen City Horse Show. To directly enter the state championship class, riders must list the qualifying show, class, and place in a designated area on the entry blank for the Denver Queen City Horse Show. In the case of multiple qualification (different divisions at different horse shows), riders cannot cross enter divisions per USEF rules for Saddle Seat Equitation.

Qualification follows the rider, regardless of the horse ridden and/or owner of the horse. In the Saddle Seat Equitation Championship class, a pattern shall be required (a pattern is **NOT** permitted in the 10 & Under Walk and Trot Championship).

The winner of the designated championship class at the Denver Queen City Horse Show will be named the 2021 Colorado State Champion!



Academy Division

No USEF membership or non-member fee required for riders in this division. Riders in this division must be riding a horse designated as a "school" horse, a horse used REGULARLY in lesson program instruction. Riders may not enter any other division at this show. Acceptable attire is jodhpurs, breeches or black pants, boots and dress shirt with a tie. Vests are acceptable as are sweaters in cool weather. Absolutely no derbies, cowboy hats, chaps, hunt or show coats. Safety helmets are the only acceptable headgear and are REQUIRED for all 17 & under riders and are HIGHLY RECOMMENDED for all other ages. English tack and attire may be saddle seat or hunt seat with attire matching the tack on the horse.

All classes to be judged both ways of the ring at a walk, trot (or jog) and canter (or lope). Walk and trot (or jog) class to be judged at a walk and trot (or jog) only; a canter (or lope) will be penalized. Walk and trot participants must not have been judged in a class at a recognized or non-recognized show that required a canter (or lope). No tests, extended gaits, or backing to be required.

Academy Equitation classes will be judged exclusively on the ability of the rider. Academy Showmanship classes will be judged on the rider's ability to show their horse and the horse and rider working together as a team, with a focus on horsemanship, showmanship and presenting the horse to the best of its ability. The horse is NOT to be judged in ANY Academy class. A complete set of rules are available from the show secretary.

IMPORTANT COVID-19 RULES AND REGULATIONS WHILE AT THE HORSE SHOW

During this unprecedented time, we ask for your cooperation in stopping the spread of COVID-19 (known as the novel coronavirus). Many of our show participants are in the high-risk category being adults over the age of 65 or persons with severe underlying health conditions. The Denver Queen City Horse Show is asking every participant at the horse show to follow the steps below to ensure that our participants remain safe and healthy throughout the event and the weeks following the show. Thank you for your help!

- Maintain social distancing at ALL times with a 6-foot distance between you and another person.
- Wash your hands frequently using soap and water for AT LEAST 20 seconds (about the time it
 will take you to recite "Happy Birthday to You" twice).
- Utilize the hand sanitizers throughout the horse show facility.
- Avoid close contact with people who are sick.
- Cover your cough or sneeze with a tissue, then throw the tissue in the trash and wash your hands!
- Avoid touching your eyes, nose, and mouth with unwashed hands.
- Clean and disinfect frequently touched objects or surfaces within your stalling area.
- Take your temperature daily **BEFORE** entering the facility. Your temperature must be at or below 100.4° F (38° C). If your temperature is above this mark, **DO NOT** enter the facility and notify the show staff immediately!
- Anyone who exhibits COVID-19 symptoms (including but not limited to cough, shortness of breath or difficulty breathing, fever, chills, chest pain, muscle pain, sore throat, new confusion, extreme fatigue, bluish lips or face, or new loss of taste or smell) or has been in contact with someone who has tested positive for COVID-19 or exhibited the above symptoms of COVID-19 within the last two weeks, cannot enter the competition grounds.
- If you don't feel well, **STAY AT HOME!** We will gladly refund your entry fees!
- The following individuals are not allowed to enter the competition grounds:
 - Anyone who exhibits COVID-19 symptoms, including a temperature of 100.4° F (38° C) or higher,
 - 0 Anyone who has tested positive for COVID-19 within last 10 days,
 - o Anyone who has tested positive outside of the past 10 days, but is still symptomatic, or
 - Anyone who has been exposed to or has been in close contact with someone who has COVID-19 symptoms or has tested positive for COVID-19 within either the last 7 or 10 days (dependent upon certain criteria - refer to CDC Quarantine Options).
 *Exception: Healthcare personnel who have treated patients using appropriate medical-grade PPE during the course of performing professional duties and those individuals who are fully vaccinated are exempted from this quarantine restriction.
- It is MANDATORY that everyone on the show grounds who is NOT FULLY VACCINATED wear a face covering (except while riding or driving a horse).
 - An individual is considered to be fully vaccinated two weeks after their second dose in a 2-dose series (Pfizer, Moderna, etc.), or two weeks after a single-dose vaccine (Johnson & Johnson).
 - Face coverings include cloth face coverings, N-95, KN-95 and surgical masks. Cloth face coverings should fit snugly but comfortably against the side of the face, be secured with ties or ear loops, include multiple layers of fabric, allow for breathing without restriction and be able to be laundered and machine dried without damage or change to shape. If you choose to wear a cloth face covering while riding or driving a horse in the show ring, you will NOT be penalized for doing so.

- All participants, including those NOT showing at the show, must provide emergency contact information and execute an updated Waiver and Release of Liability, Assumption of Risk and Indemnity Agreement required by USEF, as a condition of participation.
- Limit the people at the horse show in your barn aisles to comply with the 6 ft social distancing requirement.
- Only ONE HORSE is allowed in the wash rack at a time. Please ONLY USE the wash rack nearest to your stalls.
- Only one person allowed in the horse show office at a time. If someone is in the show office when you arrive, please wait outside the door until they have vacated the office before you enter.
- Spectators are allowed in the stands but must maintain social distancing at all times with a 6-foot distance between you and another person unless that person is within your immediate household.
- Unfortunately, we will not be offering any hospitality at the show this year. We will make up for it next year with lots of parties and events!
- We may not be taking any win photos of you and your horse standing and receiving a ribbon/trophy. Victory pass photos will be taken so we may maintain social distancing and limit handling of the ribbons and trophies.
- Every barn will receive instructions on what to do if you become ill. Please follow these steps to their entirety and notify show staff of your illness immediately!
- Wearing gloves while at the horse show for sanitary purposes is optional.
- Any individual on competition grounds who tests positive for COVID-19 within 14 days of the conclusion of the competition, is required to report such result to the Competition Organizer.
 - Competition Organizers will direct the reporting individual to contact the local public health authorities (and provide the contact information) for the purposes of having the local public health authorities perform contact tracing.
- Anyone refusing to comply with the above show guidelines will be given a warning. If the problem persists, they will be asked to leave the show grounds.

Thank you for your cooperation with CDC, WHO, USEF, and the above show guidelines. Let's make the show safe for everyone involved!

I AM FULLY AWARE AND ACKNOWLEDGE THAT HORSE SPORTS AND PARTICIPATION IN THIS COMPETITION INVOLVE SERIOUS RISK OF HARM INCLUDING, BUT NOT LIMITED TO, RISKS OF ACCIDENT, SERIOUS BODILY INJURY, INCLUDING DEATH, BROKEN BONES, HEAD INJURIES, TRAUMA, PAIN AND SUFFERING, AND PROPERTY DAMAGE. I ASSUME ALL RISKS OF HARM TO ME, MY HORSE(S) AND MY PROPERTY. I AGREE as a Horse Show Participant (or Parent/Guardian of Participant if a minor) to waive all claims which may otherwise arise from, including but not limited to infectious bacteria, viruses, fungi/mold, parasites
