Why was there no room for Joseph's family in Bethlehem? After all, he went back to his hometown for the census. Perhaps Joseph's own family did not or could not make room for them and they had to look elsewhere for a place. Family can be complicated! We'll never know the real circumstances of Joseph's family relations, but the story can bring us into the reality for what we DO know—too many people experience rejection, even from family. 'Prepare the way of the Lord, make his paths straight.


