NAMBR Tracking test, November 21, 2010

Our ninth tracking test was held November 21, 2010, with four dogs attempting the TD level, one the TDX level, and two dogs entered in the first Urban level offered under NAMBR (UTD).

While the TD and TDX tracks are plotted in fields with vegetation of varying heights and a possible road crossing, the UTD is plotted in an urban setting. Approximately 300 metres in length, one third of the track must be on non-vegetated surface, which is usually represented by pavement. The vegetation is frequently closely cut turf like your lawn. There are two articles left at the UTD level and the dog must find both. The track is aged for an hour. The urban track is quite different from the field track.

The urban tracks were plotted by judge Eileen Fisher at Lakeview Park in Oshawa. It was quite cold and windy, but the rain that was forecasted earlier in the week stayed away. The first dog was Jack Russell Terrier Holly, owned by Ricki Abrams and handled by Marie P. Babin. Holly's track took her through a flock of geese that had settled in for breakfast sometime after the track was laid in the morning. She seemed to take their presence in stride, and carried on through the first two legs. On the third leg she went quite wide, missing the first article, which caused her to get whistled off. Once put back on the correct track, she did a nice job, indicating the last article with a quick down.

Our second UTD entrant was a Shiloh Shepherd handled by Kailah Clarke. Titan started well, but had a disagreement with his handler as to which direction the track went, and was whistled off. Another strong finish though, once he was put back on the track.

We hope to see both Holly and Titan back for another attempt.

The TD and TDX tracks, judged by Marie P. Babin, were in grass and hay fields in the Bowmanville and Courtice areas. The wind had decreased a bit, being away from the lake, but it was still cold. The first three tracks were in a field of hay and clover, with the height about one foot.

First dog up was Madison, a Bedlington terrier handled by Gail Gordon. Madison must have wanted to get back into the warmth of the car, as she took off at the start quite quickly. She didn't stray much from the track until the last corner, which she had to work at a bit, but she got through it and found her article. Congratulations to Madison, who can add N-TD to her name!

The second TD entry was Robbie, an English Shepherd handled by Laura Johnson, who made the trek from just outside Rochester, New York, to join us. Robbie was a strong tracking dog who did not stray much from the track, despite the wind. He completed his track and found his article in a brief five minutes. Congratulations Laura and Robbie N-TD.

Our third entry was Doberman Pinscher Lucy, handled by Barry Robinson. Lucy did a bit of searching at the beginning, and again at the last two corners, but otherwise worked the track well and completed it in five minutes also. Congratulations to Barry and Lucy N-TD!

For the fourth TD track we moved to a field with 2' high hay and alfalfa, however Rottweiler Takara, handled by Kim Oatway didn't seem to mind. She did give Kim several moments of concern, as she had to watch a car go by, and then check out the people behind her. Despite being easily distracted she finished her track and found her glove. Congratulations to Kim and Takara, who will be adding N-TD to her list of accomplishments.

The TDX track was the second attempt for Marci Paterson and Moses, who may be a Rottweiler, or a Bullmastiff/Lab cross, but either way is quite handsome (I admit to being a sucker for mixed breeds!). Last year Moses decided to follow the cross track. This year he did not make the same mistake, and completely ignored them. Another strong tracker, Moses did a bit of searching when the track abruptly went from tall to very short grass, but otherwise found all three articles and completed his track in a very brief seventeen minutes. Congratulations Moses N-TDX and Marci.

Thank you to all who entered, we hope to see you back again for the next level, whether TDX or UTD.

A tracker is always prepared...

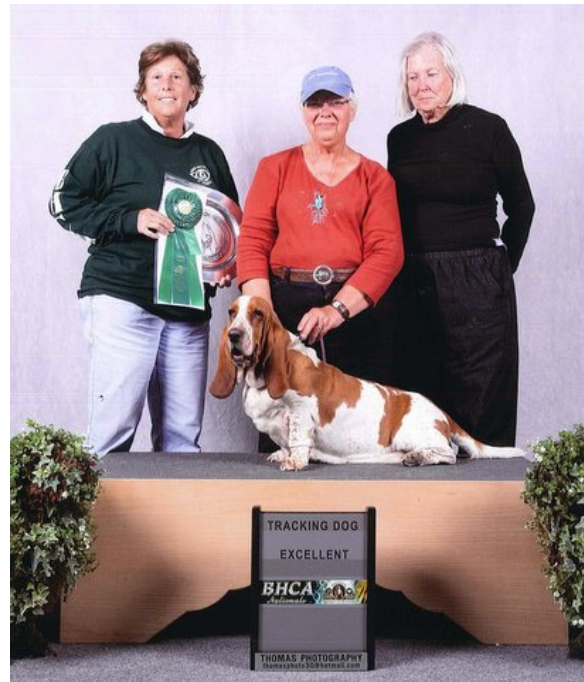

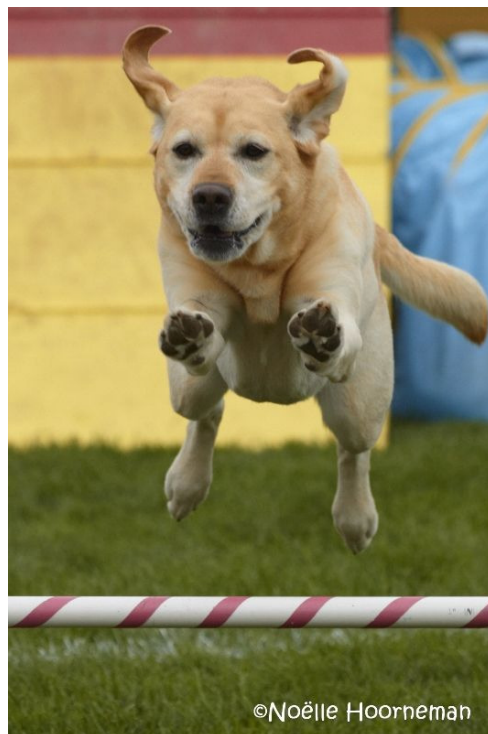

Pumpkin Brownies for Dogs

2 1/2 cups whole wheat flour

- 2 eggs
- 1/2 cup canned pumpkin
- 2 tablespoons peanut butter
- 1/2 teaspoon salt
- 1/2 teaspoon ground cinnamon

Directions

Preheat oven to 350 degrees F (175 degrees C).

Whisk together the flour, eggs, pumpkin, peanut butter, salt, and cinnamon in a bowl. Add water as needed to help make the dough workable, but the dough should be dry and stiff. Roll the dough into a 1/2-inch-thick roll. Cut into 1/2-inch pieces. Bake in preheated oven until hard, about 40 minutes.

Peanut Butter Molasses Cookies

Bake @ 350
4 c Whole Wheat flour
1 c Oatmeal
1 c Cornmeal
...3/4 c Peanut Butter
2 1/2 c Hot Water
3 TBSP Molasses

Mix all the ingredients together, knead well, add more flour if need to make a firm dough. Roll out about 1/8" thick, cut with cookie cutters. Bake approximately 30 to 40 mins until firm. Turn off oven and cool cookies in the oven over night.

Oatmeal Orbs

2 cups (500 mL) oats

1-1/2 cups (375 mL) whole wheat flour

2 tbsp (30 mL) flax seed (optional)

1 tsp (5 mL) baking powder

pinch salt

1 large egg

2 tbsp (30 mL) canola oil

2 tbsp (30 mL) honey

3/4 cup (175 mL) water

3/4 cup (175 mL) natural peanut butter (smooth or chunky)

DIRECTIONS

1. Preheat oven to 350°F.
2. In the bowl of a food processor, combine the oats, flour, flax seed, baking powder and salt; pulse until well blended and coarsely ground.
3. Add the egg, oil, honey, water and peanut butter and pulse until the dough comes together. If it's too stiff, transfer to a large bowl and stir it by hand. Turn out onto a lightly floured countertop and knead a few times to make sure everything is well incorporated.
4. Roll the dough into balls the size of a large marble, or roll it into ropes and cut into one-inch sticks (you can make either shape smaller or larger according to the size of your dog) and place them about half an inch apart on an ungreased baking sheet.
5. Bake for 20 minutes, until firm, golden on the bottom and cracked on top. Turn the oven off and leave the treats inside as the oven cools to allow them to harden further.

Store in an airtight container. If they aren't completely hard and dry, freeze any that you don't use within a week.
