### The Cross

The Latin cross (crux immissa) is the most familiar version of the cross symbols. Empty crosses are thought to emphasize the resurrected Christ.



The Cross of Peter or Petrine Cross comes from the tradition that Peter was crucified upside down upon his request, as he felt unworthy of being crucified in the same way as Christ.



A cross that depicts Jesus on the cross is called a crucifix - the emphasis is upon the sacrifice and passion of Christ.



Saint Andrew's cross.

Tradition claims Andrew was martyred on an x-shaped cross. This cross is usually recognized as being featured on a few national/state flags (Ex. Scotland)



The Celtic Cross is known for its ring and Gaelic patterns or Hiberno-Saxon art. The patterns are distinctive of Celtic/Irish Christianity and some legends claimed that this cross was first introduced by Saint Patrick.

Abundant are the debates on the ring and its origins, yet, while theories abound, certainty is elusive.



The Greek cross is usually noted to have been used in the 4th century, but is more recognized as being one of the crosses of the Eastern Orthodox Church.


The cross is the Christian cross combined with the Celtic symbol for sun. This was first done by St. Patrick.
