UPCOMING PROGRAM

Eric Grayson is our Monday 24 January 2022 presenter. He is a historic film conservationist and he will talk about and show WWII Private Snafu films—"the ultimate guides to good behavior" and are popular with general audiences.

During WW2 these newsreels provided updates of the war's progress/training. An animated series of 27 short films made between 1943 and 1945 "Taught Soldiers How to Avoid Certain Death" among other things. Did you know that "in 1943, while the United States was engaged in <u>World War II</u>, the army brass was pulling out all of the stops to buoy the spirits and skills of their soldiers in the battlefield? They needed to find a way to raise the morale of the troops and to educate them about things like the perils of leaking military secrets, how to prevent malaria, and why they should always keep a gas mask at hand. The War Department commissioned the crème de la crème of Hollywood, including Dr. Seuss and Mel Blanc, to create the 'Private Snafu' film franchise." "Private Snafu was a favorite among the troops. According to the <u>Prescott Evening Courier</u> in 1944, this series consistently ranked first or second when the army surveyed soldiers on their favorite wartime films." As a preview to our speaker's program this month, it seemed logical to share with some links to three different web-based films typical of those shown to the British public and as propaganda films. Movies during WW2 did much to prepare and orient the local population, both civilian and military to the current situation. This included training films as well as weekly newsreels for presentation in the movie theaters. The Saturday matinees especially drew a younger crowd with shorts and sometimes a double fea-

ture. As an example, here is a film representing The Phony War (September 1939 and ending with "real" war in May 1940).
