- Expanded to pickleball in 2020
- All club events take place in the Elmbrook School District
- Over 250 club members live in the Elmbrook School District
- Club mission is to socially connect tennis and pickleball players of all skill levels in Brookfield and the surrounding communities

Findings of a Recent Study¹	More than any other sport, tennis added 9.7 years to life expectancy. There was a clear connection between social interaction and the physical demands of playing tennis that contributed to positive, life-enhancing factors
