SHIPWRECKED FAITH By Arthur Lavato

I remember standing in the sally port on March 2nd 2015, dressed out in release clothes waiting on the van that was to take me to the shuttle. Fear wanted to grip my heart because after 8 1/2 years and two page two's it was difficult to see myself free on the other side of that gate, in the natural. Yet as men and women of God, 2 Corinthians 5:7 tells us, "For we walk by faith, not by sight."

You see, God had taught me some things while I was in prison. If we would be honest we would admit that incarcerated men and women are no strangers to fear. So when fear tried to grip me on the day of my release I knew just what to do. You cling to your faith and attach your prayers and requests to the Word of God. You call those things that are not as if they were (*Romans 4:17*).

Although I was still in custody I thanked God for my freedom and as sure as I am sitting writing this, it came to pass. I'm certain that God never wanted me to spend the years that I did in prison. I truly believe that He would have had that I took a different route. I am also certain that He was not taken by surprise when I opted to run my own program. I would attribute the majority of my sorrow that I've known to the fact that I freely, and of my own will, violated my own conscience, and chose to rebel against even the Word of God.

The Scripture, Galatians 6:7, is very clear, "Do not be deceived, God is not mocked; for whatever a man sows, that he will also reap." So as a result of my own sin I landed myself in prison AGAIN in 2006. I wish that I could say that I repented immediately, but honestly it took me more than a minute to do so. Here once again, in 1 Timothy 1:19, the Scripture is clear, "Cling to your faith in Christ, and keep your conscience clear. For some people have deliberately violated their consciences; as a result, their faith has been shipwrecked." Obviously I would never have landed on the prison yard if I'd been living right on the boulevard.

I had violated my conscience and shipwrecked my faith. I had a desire to walk with God and walk in the Spirit yet my carnal nature continually ruled my decisions and choices. Why? BECAUSE I fed my flesh and neglected my spirit. Again, I was spiritually bankrupt, AND I had violated my conscience and shipwrecked my faith! I had forfeited the joy and the peace of God in my life for my own selfish desires. I hadn't merely left the door cracked open for the enemy to come in. NO! I left the garage door open and he came in like a flood!

It was 2010 when personal tragedy had struck my family in the life of one of my very own sons. I knew the moment that I got the news in the visitation room that God had long been calling me to repentance and I needed so desperately His hand in my life! In Acts 3:19 the Scripture says, "Repent therefore and be converted, that your sins may be blotted out, so that times of refreshing may come from the presence of the Lord, ..." Times of refreshing! That's what I needed! I needed God to forgive me of my sins. I needed God to restore my joy, and give me that peace that surpasses ALL understanding (Philippians 4:7).

My dilemma was simply; How do you find restoration to a SHIPWRECHED FAITH? The answers are found in the Word of God.

1) "If we confess our sins, He is faithful and just to forgive us our sins and to cleanse us from all unrighteousness." (1 John 1:9)

 "Repent therefore and be converted, that your sins may be blotted out, so that times of refreshing may come from the presence of the Lord." (Acts 3:19)

 "You will keep him in perfect peace, Whose mind is stayed on You, Because he trusts in You." (Isaiah 26:3) In other words, build a prayer life and learn to communicate with God.

4) "And do not be conformed to this world, but be transformed by the renewing of your mind, that you may prove what is that good and acceptable and perfect will of God." (Romans 12:2) Allow the Word of God to change you.

5) "I beseech you therefore, brethren, by the mercies of God, that you present your bodies a living sacrifice, holy, acceptable to God, which is your reasonable service." (Romans 12:1) Make a conscious effort to refrain from sin.

Stay in fellowship and get involved in your local church. *Proverbs* 27:17, "As iron sharpens iron, So a man sharpens the countenance of his friend" and Proverbs 11:14, "Where there is no counsel, the people fall; But in the multitude of counselors there is safety." clearly encourage fellowship. Some will tell you that it is not necessary that we go to church to live for God. Well, you don't need a parachute to jump out of an airplane either but it sure helps! :-) The author of Hebrews again encouraged us of this when he wrote, "... not forsaking the assembling of ourselves together, as is the manner of some, but exhorting one another, and so much the more as you see the Day approaching." (Hebrews 10:25) I have found that these are the keys scripturally and the answers to healing a SHIPWRECKED FAITH and how to simply remain in position so that we can fulfill our assignment. Once I decided to serve God right there on the prison yard my years of incarceration were an amazing time of growth, restoration, healing and spiritual training for me. God knows just where you're at. The Scripture says that God has pre appointed the times and the boundaries of our habitations (*Acts* **17:26**).

In this season you have even been set apart to make an impact RIGHT WHERE YOU ARE, and to grow to impact a people who await you WHERE YOU ARE GOING! God is not looking for perfect men and women (there are none), He's looking for willing vessels. Listen how Isaiah responded when he heard God calling out, "Also I heard the voice of the Lord, saying: "Whom shall I send, And who will go for Us?" Then I said, 'Here am I! Send me."" (Isaiah 6:8)

Take this time and let God work through you. Above all, stay in prayer, "... pray without ceasing," (1 Thessalonians 5:17) And stay in your Word. Why? Because, "All Scripture is given by inspiration of God, and is profitable for doctrine, for reproof, for correction, for instruction in righteousness, ..." (2 Timothy 3:16) These ARE some of the keys to restoration and remaining steadfast.

At the time that I wrote this I have 43 days and a wakeup and I'll have been free from that old prison for 4 years, PRAISE GOD! Today I am still serving God and on fire for Jesus! I have an amazing and beautiful wife. God has restored EVERY relationship that sin had damaged in my past. I have a job where I am valued, a church family that loves and respects me, and we are making an impact for the kingdom of God in our community. I am also very grateful to God that He has allowed me to have owned 3 beautiful Harley Davidson motorcycles since my release. Imagine that; Living for God with my knees in the breeze, accompanied by the woman of my dreams! Our God is a GREAT God, and surely there IS life after prison!

I'm going to leave you all with these last two Scriptures. "Now may the God of hope fill you with all joy and peace in believing, that you may abound in hope by the power of the Holy Spirit." (Romans 15:13) And here's one to keep in your clip, "Delight yourself also in the LORD, And He shall give you the desires of your heart." (Psalms 37:4)

To everyone at $\mathfrak{OC} \times \mathfrak{C}$, for the past 7 years, me and my Mom would write to each other twice a month, sharing the Word and life. I will always remember the day I got arrested, it was frightening and embarrassing. The police beat the you know what out of me, but it wasn't half as bad as having to face my Mom when she came down to visit me. When she came through the door, I saw that she had been crying.

I bowed my head in shame and awaited for her to tell me off or yell at me. As I looked-up with tears of my own, I saw that she was just looking, watching me with Love and Concern. I asked, "Aren't you angry with me?" She said, "Son, when you hurt, I only want to help you, you've done wrong, but nobody is perfect. That doesn't mean that I will stop loving you, what you did hurt me, but we'll work it out together."

What more could I ever want than to be loved so much that my life could still make a difference. She has always encouraged me not to give up and quit living because of my sins; and because I am in prison, but to learn from my own experience how God's ways will satisfy me, not to dwell on the past but that I need to understand it so I can begin to allow God to change me and become a new and different person.

In prison, no one smiles; there is no happiness or celebrations. Everything is grim and depressing, without hope. It is what some have described as "life in the abyss". But for me it is the perfect image of life without God. There have been times that I have been pressed on every side by trouble in here, and it has made me feel crushed and broken. I realized that I had to allow these trials in my life to change me and to make me better, not bitter.

I wish people would understand that there is nothing to be gained by mistreating others around you. We receive what we give, but often our own egos and insecurities cause us to think more about ourselves than others. We allow pride to interfere with what we know is good and right.

God became man, bowed Himself down to wash the feet of His disciples. He even went as far as to die a criminal's death on our behalf. If God could give so much of Himself for us, then why should it be so difficult for us to sacrifice a little of ourselves for others? My Mom always encouraged me not to give-up on God, regardless of my circumstances, to remember how many times He has gotten me through all my past hurts and trials in my life. This is no different. I can honestly say that the Lord's hand of discipline has been heavy on me, and His work in me is relentless. Now I have become a person with a fresh newness in all I do and think.

Thank you for letting me share a little of myself with you all. Now that my Mom has passed, I have no one to write to, for all my family have abandoned me. I don't understand how they can say that God abides in them, yet show no compassion towards me.

Accept the love of your spouse as God's gift, and strive to make your love a reflection of the perfect love that comes from God Himself. (8:6-7)

2 Corinthians 10:1-11:15

We, like Paul, are merely weak humans, but we don't need to use human plans and methods to win our battles.

God's mighty weapons are available to us as we fight against the devil's strongholds. The Christian must choose whose weapons to use ... God's or the world's. Paul assures us that God's mighty weapons ... prayer, faith, hope, love, God's Word, the Holy Spirit are all powerful and effective. See *Ephesians 6:13-18*. These weapons can breakdown the proud human arguments against God and the walls that satan builds to keep people from finding them from a relationship with Christ, we may be tempted to use our own methods. But nothing can break down these barriers like God's weapons. (10:3-6)

Keeping Christ first in our life can be very difficult when we have so many distractions threatening to side track our faith. Just as Eve lost her focus by listening to the serpent, we, too, can lose our focus by letting our life become overcrowded and confused. Is there anything that weakens your commitment to keep Christ first in your life? How can you minimize the distractions that threaten your devotion to Him? (11:3)

With God by his side, David compared himself to an olive tree, thriving in the house of God. Not only is an olive tree a thriving tree, it is one of the longest living trees. David was contrasting God's eternal protection of his faithful servants with the sudden destruction of the wicked. (52:5)

People may say there is no God in order to cover up their sin, to have an excuse to cover up their sin, to have an excuse to continue to sin, and/or to ignore the judge in order to avoid the judgment. Fools do not necessarily lack intelligence, many atheists and unbelievers are highly educated. Fools are people who reject God, the only One Who can save them. (53:1)

In Joshua 13-21, the land was divided and the boundaries were marked out for each tribe. Moses had already warned the people that when they reached the Promised Land they shouldn't cheat their neighbors by moving any of the markers to give themselves more land and their neighbors less. See *Deuteronomy* 19:14; 27:17. (22:28)

Responses for K.H. Part 2

WORDS OF ENCOURAGMENT - By J.S.

I'm writing with words of encouragement to the brother in response to the article "I'M ASKING" by K.H. I feel I'm writing this in obedience to the Holy Spirit so please pass this on.

Brother, after reading the article I just received in the State newsletter I was led to share with you what I too have just read in a guide book by Paul Tsika entitled Understanding Your New Life. I'm writing this to you from the spiritual world brother K.H. and it is the exact words I was reading just before I began reading your article in the newsletter.

Grace is the heart of God's love and the hand of God's power moving towards us in empowerment so that we can do what He desires us to do and become who He has designed us to be.

The word "walk" is perhaps the key word in the New Testament for the daily vocational life of a Christian. Most human beings have a distinctive walk that allows them to be easily recognized. Some bounce when they walk, others sway, and others lean in a certain manner. The same should be true of Christians; they should be easily recognizable as a Christian by a distinctive walk.

Herb Hodges observes, "Just as a walk is made up of a succession of steady steps, so is the 'Daily Life' of the Christian." However, a walk is a CONDITIONED ACTIVITY that is learned by an infant only by trial and error, with many a fall preceding the easy going gait of a mature human being. Walking is a learned and conditioned activity, and the sad truth is that many Christians have never taken the required walk seriously to learn its mechanics and its pitfalls. It is even sadder than that.

While mature parents help human infants to learn to walk, patiently assisting them, encouraging them to learn, and then lifting them up after their falls, it is USUALLY true that little such assistance is given to the New Borns of the Christian community. Most are simply abandoned to their own discriminate course after their birth into God's family. Nothing could be more tragic than this!

Every new Christian desperately needs the teaching, the assistance, the encouragement and the training that can be given only by maturing believers. If "child abuse" receives such reprisals among men as it deserves, what should be said about such 'spiritual' child abuse? Every church should give far, far more attention to its "spiritual nursery", to spiritual pediatrics.

When you examine a walk carefully, you will see that any walk is MERELY A SUCCESSION OF STEPS (brother K.H.), and that each step is a near fall. Each step is a borderline catastrophe. We don't realize this because walking has become such a conditional REFLEX to us that we never think about it. BUT such was not the case when we were first learning to walk. Our much practice in a regular learning routine enabled us to walk without falling. You see, if you fail to put the other foot down when you are taking any step, you will automatically fall. EVERY STEP IS A NEAR FALL! The same is true in the spiritual life. Every Christian is close to a fall with every step he/she takes. So the counsel of this is crucial in being a consistent, happy, powerful and productive Christian - "the only kind God wants His children to be!" AMEN?

We are told to walk in grace and the only way that we can do this is to "walk in the spirit". The prepositional phrase, "in the spirit", is in the instrumental case in the Greek language, and thus it means, "by means of the Spirit". Therefore, the Christian is to go on taking SUCCESSIVE steps all the time "BY MEANS OF THE SPIRIT", which is, counting on Him and relying on Him. Just as you depend on your feet, your legs, your muscles, your eyes and your brain - indeed, on your entire body when you walk physically, you are to rely on the HOLY SPIRIT: the wisdom, vision, motivation, coordination and power of the Spirit every moment of your spiritual life. Furthermore, the words "in the spirit" bear major emphasis in the Greek text. This means that you are to walk only in the Spirit, never in the flesh, or the self-line. You are not to depend on yourself, but on the Holy Spirit, for the enablement to live the Christian life.

We want you to be reminded that the grace of God is available, abounding and truly amazing and will, WILL, be sufficient for every step of your pilgrimage. We are confident that the words of that old song "Amazing Grace" by John Newton are true ... "Tis grace that brought us safe thus far and grace will lead us home." We now live and move and have our being in Christ Jesus our Lord, and it's all because of His great, glorious and good grace!
